NEW OR RETURNING STUDENTS

You are a new or returning student if you did not enroll in classes at GCC during summer or fall 2018 or winter 2019.

STEP

Submit an Application for Admission

Complete and submit an application for admission online at **www.glendale.edu** as soon as possible, but not later than February 14, 2019. You will receive:

- Your Student I.D. number via e-mail
- Information on accessing MyGCC
- A GCC student e-mail address

STEP 2

Complete Assessment

Go to the Sierra Vista Building, third floor and complete an Assessment Self-Referral Form. You will usually be able to take the English and math computerized assessments immediately. ESL placement requires an appointment.

STEP 3

Orientation/Counseling

Sign up in the Assessment Center (Sierra Vista, third floor) for a two-hour group orientation and counseling session to receive an abbreviated Student Education Plan.

 Bring any college transcripts, high school transcripts, Advanced Placement exam scores or CLEP scores.

STEP 4

Register for Classes

- See the registration instructions starting on page 7.
- Open registration is November 19, 2018-February 14, 2019 for the spring semester.

CONTINUING STUDENTS

If you submitted an application for the spring semester by October 5, 2018 or enrolled in classes at GCC during summer or fall 2018 or winter 2019, you register as a continuing student.

- automatically check your prerequisite file if you satisfactorily completed or are currently enrolled in the prerequisite at GCC.
- accept your credit card to pay your registration fees. <u>Have</u> your credit card ready.
- show open sections for a particular course. Have your class schedule available for reference.

ONLINE REGISTRATION CANNOT:

- enroll you in more than 19 units.
- allow you to repeat a course in which you got an A, B, C or P (except for certain classes that can be taken more than one time).
- enroll you in a course for a third time if you got a D, F, NP, NC or W the first two times.
- give you prerequisite credit for a course you took somewhere else unless your counselor has entered it in your prerequisite file. See your counselor first.

Click on MyGCC and login to your own MyGCC use your GCC ID# and your password, once logged in your Student Center will be displayed.

View your holds (right-hand side). If you have a hold, click on: **DETAILS** and follow the instructions to clear it. Holds will prevent you from enrolling. If there is no hold, continue to enrollment.

View your To Do list (right-hand side). All "to dos" must be completed prior to the start of the session of attendance.



To add a class:

Click on **ENROLL** from the Student Center: ADD CLASSES. Select the term then click on: CONTINUE

> You can search the schedule or enter the course number to add the class. When you are finished selecting classes, click on: NEXT

Check your shopping cart and make sure all the classes you added are in your shopping cart, click on PROCEED TO STEP 2 OF 3 and confirm the courses are correct. If there is a red error message, follow the instructions given.

If the courses are correct and there are no errors, click on FINISH ENROLLING.

To view your complete schedule, click on: MY CLASS SCHEDULE. Check the **STATUS**. The status will show if you are enrolled, on the wait list, or dropped from each course.

MAXIMUM CLASS LOAD: You may take a MAXIMUM OF 19 units during the Fall/Spring semester, 10 units for summer, and 8 units for winter.



To get on a wait list for a class:

If you want to wait list a class, you have two options.

- 1. Click on the box next to WAIT LIST when you select your class, so you will be placed on the wait list if the class is full.
- 2. If you receive an error message telling you the class is full, click on the box next to WAIT LIST. Once you have done this, make sure to click on FINISH ENROLLING.

Note: You will not be on a wait list until you **FINISH ENROLLING**

If you are on a wait list, you are not enrolled in the course. You need to attend the first day of the class and check on your status.

PAYMENT IS DUE AT THE TIME OF REGISTRATION. Check the amount owed by clicking on MY ACCOUNT then ACCOUNT INQUIRY.



To drop a class:

Click on: ENROLL: DROP CLASSES. Select the course you want to drop, then click on: DROP SELECTED CLASSES

Confirm your selection, then click on: FINISH DROPPING







REGISTRATION INFORMATION

INCORRECT FEES AND FEE WAIVERS

If you believe that an error was made in your fee calculation, you will need to go to the Student Fees Office located in the Sierra Vista Building. If you wish to waive the Student Services Fee due to financial hardship, go to the Student Business Services Office located in the Bookstore before the refund deadline. If your fees are waived you relinquish all privileges and your rights to use all services funded by the Student Services Fee. The health fee may be waived by students who depend exclusively upon prayer for healing in accordance with the teachings of a bona fide religious sect, denomination, or organization. (Waivers for the current semester/session will not be granted after the final deadline to withdraw from classes and be eligible for a refund as published in this class schedule.)

FINANCIAL AID STUDENTS

MyGCC will let you know if you have been awarded a BOG. If you are awarded a BOG, the enrollment and health fee are waived, but you must pay all other fees.

WAITING LISTS

Many classes have a wait list. If a registered student drops the course, the first wait list student will be automatically moved into the course.

It is the student's responsibility to verify enrollment status on the first day of class from the instructor. It is the student's responsibility to drop a class without a "W" to be eligible for a refund or not be held responsible for payment of fees.

PARKING PERMIT

- You may purchase your parking permit ONLINE for any semester or intersession through MyGCC. Parking permits will be available to purchase online from the first day of registration up to one week prior to the beginning of that semester or intersession. Permits that are purchased online will be mailed to you the next business day.
- You may purchase your parking permit IN PERSON from the Tuition Office located in the Sierra Vista Building beginning the first day of registration up to the last day of the semester or intersession.

Please confirm your registration. If you did not follow instructions, you will not be enrolled in a course(s), or you will receive a letter grade rather than a "W" notation. It is your responsibility to make sure you have completed all transactions correctly.







WAITLIST INFORMATION

If a class is full, but has a waitlist, you can add yourself to the waitlist and as seats open up, students on the waitlist will be automatically enrolled. *When you add yourself to the waitlist, you are given a position number. Students are enrolled in open seats based on their position number. The lower your number is on the waitlist, the greater your opportunity is to be enrolled in the class.

WAITLIST FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What is the advantage of enrolling to a waitlist?

The waitlist enables you to be auto-enrolled in closed classes as seats become available.

How many classes can I waitlist for?

You may add yourself to any number of waitlists, but you will not be allowed to enroll in and waitlist in more than the maximum number of units for the term. For example, for the spring term, the maximum number of units allowed is 19; therefore, your combined enrolled and waitlist units can't exceed 19.

Can I waitlist in more than one section of the same class?

Yes, you can waitlist for multiple sections of the same class. Once you have been enrolled in one section of a class, you will be removed from the waitlists for all other sections of that class. If you are already enrolled in one section of a class, you may waitlist for additional sections, but you will not be enrolled from the waitlist until you drop the section that you are enrolled in.

I was in position number 1 on a waitlist, why wasn't I enrolled when a seat opened?

The requirements to be moved off of a waitlist are the same as standard enrollment:

- You will not be enrolled from the waitlist if you are already enrolled in another section of the same class.
- You will not be enrolled in a class if it conflicts in meeting times with another class in which you are enrolled.
- You will not be enrolled in more units than permitted in the term.
- You will not be enrolled if you have not met the prerequisites for that class.
- You will not be enrolled if you have any registration holds, i.e. Financial, Library, PE etc.

Can I take myself off of a waitlist?

Yes, you may remove yourself from a waitlist by following the same process as to drop a class.

What is the first day I can get on a waitlist?

Waitlists are only available once the class has reached its enrollment capacity. For high-demand classes, this may be the first day of registration or for other classes as late as the last week of open registration.

Once I am on the waitlist, how do I get into the class?

If seats become available and you meet all of the requirements, you will be added automatically to the class based on your waitlist position number. If you are successfully enrolled from the waitlist, you will see the change in your "My Schedule" in your Student Center. You will be sent an email to your college issued email address notifying you that you have been moved into the enrolled status.

Can I waitlist for a class that conflicts in meeting times with a class that I'm already enrolled in?

Yes, you can waitlist for time conflicted classes, but you will not be moved off of the waitlist until the time conflict has been resolved.

Where can I find my waitlist position number?

In your class schedule, there is a checkbox to show waitlisted classes – if you check this box, you will see classes that you are waitlisted for, and your position number.

What if I decide that I no longer want to take a class that I have waitlisted?

It is your responsibility to remove yourself from the waitlist. If you have been enrolled from the waitlist and do not wish to take the class, it is your responsibility to drop the class before the last day to drop with refund, or you may still be accountable for the class.

What happens if I am added to a class from a waitlist after I have paid fees for other classes that I enrolled in?

Your account in your Student Center will reflect the additional enrollment fees. Log into your MyGCC Student Center and click on Account Inquiry. These fees must be paid immediately.

If I am already enrolled in NelNet payment plan, how might enrolling in an additional class via the waitlist impact my payment plan?

Any additional enrollment fees and charges not included in your initial budget and plan will need to be added. You need to let the Tuition Office know of any changes to your enrollment or fees for the added class will be due immediately.

If I have Financial Aid, how will adding a class to my schedule from the waitlist impact my aid?

The enrollment fees will be waived as long as you have been awarded the BOG grant. If you are automatically enrolled through the waitlist process, the enrollment will be complete prior to the last day to add a class and your Financial Aid awards will be adjusted accordingly. However, if you are given a "permission number", you must add the course online prior to the last day to add a class or your Financial Aid will not be adjusted. We suggest that you contact the Financial Aid office if your units increase or decrease any time during the term.

*WAITLIST IMPORTANT NOTICE: Classes and wait list (enrollment from the wait list) will officially close at 11:59 p.m. on the Sunday before the class is scheduled to begin. If you would like to add a closed class, you must attend the first day of the class to obtain a permission number from the instructor. IF you are given a permission number, you will then need to log back into your student portal-MyGCC and officially add the class using the permission number.









COURSE ENROLLMENT

OPEN ENROLLMENT

Unless specifically exempted by statute, every course, course section, or class shall be open for enrollment and participation by any person who has been admitted to the college and who meets the prerequisites for such courses.

REQUIREMENTS

When you look at the class listings, you will see that many courses have conditions you must meet before you can enroll. These conditions are called assessment tests, prerequisites, co-requisites, recommended preparation, or limitations on enrollment.

DEFINITIONS

Assessment Test:

These exams measure your current skills. Your composite scores determine your placement in English, mathematics, English as a Second Language, and in other areas.

Prerequisite:

This means you already must have completed the course or courses listed as prerequisite(s) with a grade of A, B, C, or Credit before you enroll in the class you're considering.

Corequisite:

This means the class listed as a corequisite already must have been completed, or you can take it at the same time as the class you're considering.

Recommended Preparation:

This is a condition that you are advised, but not required, to meet before enrolling in the class you're considering.

Other Limitations on Enrollment:

Certain courses may require tryouts, auditions, or may be limited by health and safety considerations, facility limitations, faculty workload, availability of qualified instructors, funding limitations or legal requirements imposed by statutes, regulations or contracts. All limitations conform with the provisions of the Title V, Section 58106, California Community College Board of Governors.

PREREQUISITE CHALLENGE PROCESS

You may challenge your assessment placement, course prerequisite, corequisite or limitation on enrollment for any of the following reasons:

- 1. You have the knowledge or skills to complete the course.
- 2. The prerequisite course has not been reasonably available and will cause you a delay in the completion of your academic goals according to your Student Educational Plan
- 3. The course has not been established in accordance with the district's process for establishing prerequisites and coreauisites.
- 4. The prerequisite is unlawfully discriminatory or is being applied in an unlawfully discriminatory manner.

Follow these instructions:

- 1. Complete the Glendale Community College Prerequisite Challenge Petition.
- 2. Submit the petition to the appropriate division chair.
- 3. You may need to submit evidence of the necessary skills to pass the course.
- 4. You will be notified within 15 days of the decision.
- 5. If the petition is denied, you may appeal the decision to the Executive Vice President of Instruction.

Prerequisite Challenge Petition forms may be obtained from the Academic Counseling Office.

TRANSCRIPTS AND TRANSFER OF UNITS

Transcripts should be sent directly from the high school or college to Glendale Community College. All transcripts become the property of Glendale Community College and will not be returned.

Glendale Community College reserves the right to evaluate work completed in other colleges or universities. The external credit units and cumulative grade points will be posted on the student's Glendale College transcript. Transfers with acceptable grades will be granted advanced standing in-so-far as the work completely corresponds with that of Glendale Community College.

Upon the written request of a student, a transcript of the student's record at Glendale Community College will be forwarded to a college or university, individual, firm, etc. providing that such student has no outstanding financial obligation to the college. Records may be withheld for monies owed the college, library fines, unreturned P.E. supplies and/or equipment, health holds, or for disciplinary problems. 

ALGEBRA OPTIONS

The Division of Mathematics offers three ways for you to take Beginning and Intermediate Algebra. Of the following three options choose whichever option best meets your needs. For Beginning or Intermediate Algebra, each of the options cover the same content, use the same textbook, meet the same prerequisites and satisfy the same transfer or graduation requirements. They differ in their format and the number of semesters needed to complete Beginning or Intermediate Algebra.

Option 1: Traditional One Semester Lecture Courses:

Math 141—Beginning Algebra

Math 141 is the traditional one-semester lecture Beginning Algebra course. Math 141 is a review course for students that have been successful with beginning algebra in the past but need a thorough refresher. The course material is covered at a fast pace. Upon completion of Math 141 a student has earned 4 units.

Math 101—Intermediate Algebra

Math 101 is the traditional one-semester lecture Intermediate Algebra course. The course material is covered at a fast pace. Math 101 is recommended for very strong Math 141 students, or for students that have successfully taken intermediate algebra before but need a refresher. Upon completion of Math 101 a student has earned 5 units.

Option 2: Two Semester Lecture Courses:

Math 145 & 146—Beginning Algebra

With Math 145 and Math 146 the Beginning Algebra course is stretched out over two semesters. The course material is covered at a somewhat slower pace than in Math 141. It takes both Math 145 and Math 146 to complete Beginning Algebra. This option is recommended for students learning beginning algebra for the first time.

Each of Math 145 and Math 146 is a one-semester lecture course. Students earn 2 units for each class.

Together Math 145 and Math 146 make up the total 4 units of Beginning Algebra.

Math 119 & 120—Intermediate Algebra

With Math 119 and Math 120 the Intermediate Algebra course is stretched out over two semesters. The course material is covered at a somewhat slower pace than in Math 101. It takes both Math 119 and Math 120 to complete Intermediate Algebra. This option is recommended for students coming from Math 146.

Math 119 is a one-semester lecture course. Upon completion of Math 119 a student has earned 3 units. After successfully completing Math 119, a student takes Math 120, a one-semester lecture course. Upon completion of Math 120 the student has earned 2 units.

Together Math 119 and Math 120 make up the total 5 units of Intermediate Algebra.

Option 3: Self-Paced Courses:

Math 245 & 246—Beginning Algebra

Math 245 and Math 246 are open-entry self-paced versions of Beginning Algebra. These are not lecture courses; students work in the lab using video lectures, tutorial software, the textbook and tutors for instruction. The courses are divided into modules, each worth 1 unit. Upon successful completion of each module the student earns 1 unit; upon completing the 2 units in Math 245 the student then enrolls in Math 246 to complete the remaining 2 units. The student can finish in less than a semester or can take several semesters to complete the 4 units of Beginning Algebra.

After completing 2 units in Math 245 a student may finish the last 2 units in Math 146.

Math 219 & 220—Intermediate Algebra

Math 219 and Math 220 are open-entry self-paced versions of Intermediate Algebra. These are not lecture courses; students work in the lab using video lectures, tutorial software, the textbook and tutors for instruction. The courses are divided into modules, each worth 1 unit. Upon successful completion of each module the student earns 1 unit; upon completing the 3 units in Math 219 the student then enrolls in Math 220 to complete the remaining 2 units. The student can finish in less than a semester or can take several semesters to complete the 5 units of Intermediate Algebra.

After completing 3 units in Math 219 a student may finish the last 2 units in Math 120.

For further details on any of the above options please contact your counselor. Regardless of the option you choose, you can only earn a maximum of 4 units for Beginning Algebra and a maximum of 5 units for Intermediate Algebra.

DISTANCE EDUCATION

Glendale Community College offers a variety of Distance Education courses to meet your needs including Online courses and Hybrid courses. Distance Education utilizes Canvas as a Learning Management System (LMS). Internet and other technologies are used in learning exercises every week to ensure regular and effective contact between instructor and student. Distance Education courses are equivalent to a classroombased course. Courses are taught by the same qualified instructors and follow the same curriculum and standards as the classroom-based course. Distance Education courses provide flexibility in scheduling and are especially helpful for self-directed learners. It is recommended that students be comfortable with computers, particularly the Internet, before taking an online or hybrid course. Make sure to read the Ticket Note of the class before you choose to enroll.

Distance Education offers three types of classes: **Online Courses**

An Online course is offered 100% online. Students cannot be required to meet face-to-face for office hours, orientations, homework, exams, distribution of resource materials, or any other course component. An online course shall utilize features of the Learning Management System (LMS), Canvas, such as Course Documents, Discussion Boards, Virtual Classrooms, Groups, Assignments, External Links, Digital Drop Boxes and Grade Books, Asynchronous and/or Synchronous** learning, etc. All course instructions, materials, assignments, and discussions are posted and completed online. Online courses require for both the student and instructor the same amount of coursework and hours outside of the classroom as traditional courses. Online courses are noted as such in the schedule of classes.

Hybrid Courses

A Hybrid course is offered 1%-99% online with online content and/or activities. Teaching is a combination of faceto-face meetings and online activities. A Hybrid course can utilize features of the Learning Management System (LMS), Canvas, such as Course Documents, Discussion Boards, Virtual Classrooms, Groups, Assignments, External Links, Digital Drop Boxes and Grade Books, Asynchronous and/or Synchronous** learning, etc. The course can be offered during regularly scheduled class times or with online components that replace some of the regularly scheduled class meetings. The instructor will give face-to-face orientation and in-class exams as stated in his or her syllabus. Hybrid courses are noted as such in the schedule of classes.

**Synchronous refers to a learning environment in which everyone takes part at the same time. Asynchronous refers to a learning environment in which everyone does not take part at the same time.

Proctored Online Courses (POC): Assignments examinations in a Proctored Online Course will be submitted in an asynchronous manner, but you will be required to take tests at a proctoring facility. Your instructor will provide proctoring accommodations at GCC. Off-site proctoring services could be available at the discretion of the instructor.

A Welcome Letter:

- Helps students unfamiliar with the distance education environment understand course expectations,
- Tells students how and where to login,
- Lets students know where to go for technical help and support,
- Establishes rapport and promotes regular and effective contact with students early on,
- Assigns a Check-In Assignment. Faculty will design a course Check-In Assignment (see description below). The Check-In Assignment will be administered during Week 1.

Check-In Assignment

The course Check-In Assignment is a mandatory requirement for all distance education classes. If a student does not complete the course Check-In Assignment by the end of the first week (see class Ticket Note for specific dates), he/ she may be dropped from the class. Directions on completing the course Check-In Assignment will be in the Welcome Letter sent via GCC email by the instructor 2-5 days before the semester begins (see above). Students are responsible to retrieve and read the Welcome Letter sent to their GCC email 2-5 days before the semester begins.

Student Authenticity: Effective Regular Authentic Contact

Establishing and maintaining regular effective contact is an important aspect of delivering an online and hybrid course. It is not only a Title 5 requirement, but is also a practice that encourages and facilitates student-centered instruction and increases student-learning outcomes. Therefore, Distance Education courses are NOT offered in a self-paced format.

Distance Education includes regular effective contact between instructor and students. Effective regular and authentic contact in the distance education classroom takes place in four ways every week there is online instruction: 1. Instructor-Student 2. Student-Student 3. Student-Content 4. Student-Interface.

Any portion of a course provided through distance education must be consistent with guidelines issued by the Chancellor's Office, pursuant to section 409 of the Procedures and Standing Orders of the Board of Governors.

Attendance & Participation Policy

All distance education courses currently follow the GCC Attendance and Drop Policy.







DISTANCE EDUCATION

GCC's Policy Guidelines:

- Students are expected to attend all class meetings. There
 are no authorized absences from class and irregular
 attendance may result in exclusion from classes.
- It is the student's responsibility to register properly for classes. A student who fails to enroll officially in a class will not be given credit for that class.
- Students also have the responsibility of officially withdrawing from college or dropping from class when they stop attending, and of observing established deadlines. Otherwise, "F" grades may be assigned.
- It is the responsibility of each student to know the attendance and absence policy of each class in which he or she is enrolled. It is the responsibility of each instructor to inform his or her class of the attendance and absence policies at the beginning of each semester.
- Students shall be dropped from class for failure to attend the first class meeting during the first week of instruction if they have not made prior arrangements with the instructor.
- Students also may be dropped for continuous or cumulative absences for the number of hours a sixteenweek class is scheduled to meet in a two-week period.

What this means for distance education

Students in distance education courses are required to 'attend' class and participate just as if they were in a face-to-face course. This means that instructors' set guidelines for how much each lecture, reading assignment, discussion or project qualifies as a meeting during the course of a week/ learning unit/course module. Students who do not participate in class, that is, who consistently do not complete assignments, quizzes, respond to forums or turn in other work, should be notified that they may be dropped from the class for non-participation. It is important that online and hybrid instructors be very clear in their Syllabus and Welcome Letter about what constitutes participation and late work.

Drop Policy

Federal Policy Guidelines

The Federal government has not issued formal guidelines regarding what constitutes the "Last Day of Attendance" in the online classroom. However, because of the potential for financial aid fraud in online programs, the US Department of Education has recently determined that there should be "regular and substantive interaction between students and faculty" in online courses (Salomon and Murray).

What this means for distance education

It is not enough to evaluate a student's attendance based solely on the number and frequency of logins or through course statistics on the LMS. Instructors may drop students based on their lack of participation in class. 'Attendance' (through logins) is not the same as participation. Participation means actively completing course activities in the LMS such as assignments, assessments, posting on discussion forums, etc. Participation policies must be clarified in the course Syllabus.

GCC's Drop and Policy Guidelines

Policy Guidelines

Once enrolled in courses, students are not considered dropped or withdrawn unless:

- They have dropped the course online via MyGCC; or
- They have dropped the course with an Add/Drop form in person at the Admissions & Records office.

A grade of "W" will not be made on the permanent academic record of a student who drops or is dropped from the course or from college:

- During the first two weeks of a semester-length course;
- During the first week of a course which is at least five weeks in length and less than a semester in length; or
- During the first 20% of a course which is less than five weeks in length.

Refund/Repayment Process

- To receive a refund for tuition and/or enrollment fees and other student fees, classes must be dropped or canceled within the first two weeks of instruction for the particular class.
- Requests for refunds must be initiated by the student and will be processed according to the following schedule:
- Summer Students who withdraw (or drop units) during the first week of the summer intersession are entitled to a 100% refund provided that they submit a refund application during week two when refunds are processed.
- Fall and Spring Students who withdraw (or drop units) during the first two weeks of the semester are entitled to a 100% refund provided that they submit a refund application during weeks three and four when refunds are processed.
- Refund request forms are available in Student Business Services. Students must present an I. D. Card and a receipt showing payment of fees. A \$10 refund processing fee will be assessed for all requests.

What this means for distance education

The face-to-face policy of 'attending' the first class, particularly for students who are new to distance education may present a problem. There are often students who, either because they are unaware of the policies or overwhelmed by the technology, may login to the course but might not complete any of the assignments by the end of Week 1.

It is therefore important for online and hybrid instructors to provide a coherent and well-defined course drop policy and to articulate this in the Welcome Letter (see above) emailed to GCC student email accounts 2-5 days prior to Week 1 as well as in the course Syllabus.

ASSESSMENT

Placement tests are administered by the Assessment/Testing Center, located in the Sierra Vista Building, Room 365. Students are encouraged to take their placement tests early in order to avoid class registration delays. Testing schedules and sample tests are available in the Assessment Center and online at www.glendale.edu/assessment. English, math, chemistry and challenge tests may be taken anytime that "English, Math & Chemistry" are listed on the testing schedule. ESL, NC/ESL, make-up exams, and ATB are by appointment only in person. Students must bring a photo I.D. in order to take any test (Driver's License, passport, high school I.D., etc.). Please note: cell phones, iPods, food, beverages, children, friends or relatives are not allowed in the testing room. Any questions should be directed to the Assessment Center at (818) 240-1000, ext. 5329.

COMPUTERIZED PLACEMENT TESTS

The following tests are offered on a "walk-in" basis, any day and time that English, Math & Chemistry is listed on the testing schedule. The testing schedule and sample/study packets can be accessed on the Internet: www.glendale.edu/assessment

ENGLISH PLACEMENT TEST

Required for initial placement into English classes.

- 1. Determine if you are eligible to enroll in Freshman English 101.
- Determine your placement into most English/reading classes, and also many language, social science, history, speech, business, and humanities courses. (please check current catalog for exact class prerequisites).
- This test is not timed.

MATHEMATICS PLACEMENT TESTS

Required for initial placement into any math course. Students are encouraged to look at the math sample tests in the Assessment Center to determine the appropriate test to take for their skill level. Calculators are not allowed on any of the math tests.

ARITHMETIC

This test measures basic mathematical skills. Designed for students who have NOT completed at least 1 year of high school algebra (or equivalent) with a grade of "C" or better.

1. Determines placement into Math 145, 144, 155, 255. This test is not timed.

ELEMENTARY ALGEBRA

- 1. This test is for students who have completed one year of high school algebra (or equivalent) with a grade of "C" or better.
- 2. Determines placement into Math 101, 131, 119, 141, 145, 146, 219, 245. 45 minutes are allowed for this exam.

INTERMEDIATE ALGEBRA

- 1. This test is for students who have completed 2 years of high school algebra, with grades of "C" or better.
- 2. Determines placement into Math 100, 101, 111, 112, 119 or 219, 135, 136, 138.
- 3. Placement into Math 110, for students who have completed 1 year of plane geometry (or high school equivalent). 45 minutes are allowed for this exam.

PRE-CALCULUS

- This test is for students who have completed 4 years of high school math, including "Principles of Math" or its equivalent, with grades of "C" or better.
- 2. Determines placement into Math 103. 60 minutes are allowed for this exam.

PAPER-PENCIL EXAMS

CHEMISTRY PLACEMENT TEST

- 1. This test is for students who want to enroll in Chemistry 101.
- 2. Students must have been placed in Math 101 or higher before they can take the chemistry tests.
- Students who have successfully completed Chemistry 110, do not need to take the chemistry test to enroll into Chemistry 101.
- Students may use a basic calculator (no scientific or memory calculator) for this test.
- 45 minutes are allowed for this exam.

THE FOLLOWING TESTS ARE BY APPOINTMENT ONLY: ESL (ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE)

- This test is for students whose primary language is not English, and who may not have achieved proficiency in the use of the English language.
- This test will measure English skills and is used for placement into any ESL course.
- Test includes: reading comprehension/grammar, listening/speaking skills and a writing sample.
- Students need to come to the Assessment Center to make their appointment, and obtain an "Appointment Sheet" for this exam. This test is not offered on a "walk-in" basis.
- All three sections of this test are timed. Please allow at least 2½ hours for this test.

ATB/CELSA

- 1. Need to contact Financial Aid to obtain ATB Referral Form.
- 2. Make an appointment at Assessment Center, SF112.
- 3. Bring Photo I.D. and ATB Referral Form on the day of the test.

For students born outside of the United States

If you have been living in CA and your immigration documentation is dated more than two years, you only need:

 Your original immigration documentation, CA ID or CA DL (copies) and your birth certificate or Income Tax Return if you were claimed as a dependent.

If you have been living in CA and your documentation is dated at least one year and one day prior to the semester start and your status is Permanent Resident, Temporary Resident, Resident/Amnesty, Political Asylum or *Refugee, you must bring:

- You and your parent's original immigration documentation and copies.
- One of your parents CA ID or CA Driver's License (Copies)
- Your birth certificate or Income Tax Return if you were claimed as a dependent.
- 2 more items from the list below under your parents' name, if you are under Refugee status *only one item is required:
 - Ownership of residential property.
 - Registering to vote and voting in California.
 - Licensing from California for professional practice.
 - Active membership in service or social clubs.
 - Payment of California state income tax as a resident.
 - Possessing California motor vehicle registration (pink slip).
 - Maintaining a permanent military address of home of record in California while in armed forces.
 - California bank account statement (checking or savings)
 - Computer generated utility bills that show name, place, date and address.
 - Paycheck stubs from place of employment with name and address of business and name of employee

Student Visa (F-1), other status or Unknown status: Must go to Admissions and Records Office at GCC.

REQUIREMENTS AND REGULATIONS

FEES

Fees are established by the California State Legislature and the Glendale Community College District Board of Trustees. All fees are subject to change.

ENROLLMENT FEE: All students, resident and non-resident, must pay the basic enrollment fee of \$46 per unit for each semester or session.

NONRESIDENT TUITION: The tuition is \$215 per semester unit for students who are residents of other states, who are foreign nationals or who have taken legal residence in California for less than one year.

CAPITAL OUTLAY FEE: The capital outlay fee is \$16 per semester unit for students who are residents of other states, who are foreign nationals, or who have taken legal residence in California for less than a year.

HEALTH SERVICES FEE: A Health Services fee of \$18 per semester and \$14 for the summer or winter sessions is required of all students. Services include blood pressure screening, vision screening and hearing tests, tetanus, measles, mumps, and rubella immunizations, and assistance with health insurance questions. A registered nurse is available, and students may schedule appointments with physicians, nurse practitioners, and mental health counselors.

STUDENT SERVICES FEE: The Student Services fee is assessed each semester and during summer/winter sessions. This fee grants membership in the Associated Students of Glendale Community College (ASGCC) and eligibility to participate in ASGCC sponsored activities and services. Additionally, the fee provides funding for various student services, instructional departments, and student support programs.

STUDENT PHOTO I.D. FEE: All new students are required to purchase a photo I.D. card during their first semester of attendance at Glendale College. The fee for the photo I.D. is \$10. The card is used at the library, the bookstore, offices in College Services and instructional labs at the college. Students are required to take their photo during the semester in which it was purchased. The photo I.D. card fee is non refundable.

REFUNDS

Refunds are automatic for those students who dropped by the due date. Requests for parking fee refunds must be initiated by students when they return their parking permit to the Student Fees Office. (There is a \$10 refund processing fee.)

Students who have dropped their 16-week classes, first and second 8-week classes and first and second 6-week classes by the deadlines listed below, may file for their parking fee refunds during the time period of March 4-8, 2019.

- 16-week classes must have been dropped by March 2, 2019
- First 8-week classes must have been dropped by February 23, 2019
- Second 8-week classes must have been dropped by April 27, 2019
- First 6-week classes must have been dropped by March 9, 2019
- Second 6-week classes must have been dropped by April 27, 2019

Students who had enrolled for second 6-week and second 8-week classes after the first refund filing period, but have dropped their classes by the deadlines listed below may file for their parking fee refunds during the time period of April 29-May 3, 2019.

- Second 6-week classes must have been dropped by April 27, 2019
- Second 8-week classes must have been dropped by April 27, 2019 Refund Schedule:

ENROLLMENT FEE: Students dropping units are eligible for an Enrollment Fee Refund ONLY if the course is dropped during the refund period.

NON-RESIDENT TUITION: Students dropping units are eligible for a Tuition Refund ONLY if the drop takes place during the refund period. CAPITAL OUTLAY FEE: Students dropping units are eligible for a Capital Outlay Fee Refund ONLY if the drop takes place during the refund period.

HEALTH FEE: Students withdrawing from all of their courses are eligible for a refund ONLY if the units are dropped during the refund period.

STUDENT SERVICES FEE: Students withdrawing from all of their courses are eligible for a refund only if the units are dropped during the refund period.

OTHER FEES: None of the other fees will be refunded unless the college has cancelled the student's class.

PROGRAM CHANGES

Students may change their registration on MyGCC. If a class is closed, the student must get a permission number from the instructor. The student can register using MyGCC. This can be completed during the first week of the course. Do not interrupt classes in session.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

High school graduates may be admitted to Glendale Community College. Other individuals 18 years of age or older giving evidence that they will profit from instruction offered at the college may be admitted.







REQUIREMENTS AND REGULATIONS

RESIDENCE REQUIREMENTS

U.S. citizens who are residents of California for LESS than one year by February 18, 2018 will be required to pay a tuition fee of \$215 per unit and a capital outlay fee of \$16 per unit. In order to be classified as a resident for tuition purposes, a student must provide evidence of one year's physical presence in California prior to the residence determination date; evidence of one year's intent to make California a home for other than a temporary purpose; and, for any student seeking reclassification from nonresident to resident status, evidence of independence from parents who are not residents of California.

For non-citizens of the United States, a permanent resident card or other documentary evidence of lawful admission for permanent residence to the United States dated at least one year before the residence determination date for the semester is required also. Falsification of residence will be considered grounds for dismissal from college.

International students are subject to international student tuition charges which are established on an annual basis. The current charge is \$215 per unit and a capital outlay fee of \$16 per unit.

All immigration documentation and proof of California residency must be submitted to the Admissions and Records Office **PRIOR** to the start of the semester of attendance.

WAITING LISTS

Many classes have a wait list. If a registered student drops the course, the first wait list student will be automatically moved into the course. It is the student's responsibility to verify enrollment status on the first day of class from the instructor. It is the student's responsibility to drop a class without a "W" to be eligible for a refund or not be held responsible for payment of fees.

ATTENDANCE, DROP AND WITHDRAWAL POLICY

You are expected to attend all class meetings. It is your responsibility to know the attendance and absence policies of your instructors. An instructor will drop you from a course for absences and/or irregular attendance.

It is your responsibility to officially withdraw from the college or to drop a class within established deadlines. Failure to officially drop a class may result in a failing grade. March 2, 2019 is the last date to drop a 16-week course without notation and to file for a refund. May 18, 2019 is the final date to drop a 16-week course with a notation of "W." If you are enrolled in a course after May 18, 2019, you will receive an academic grade. Check page 3 of this schedule for drop dates for short term classes or in your student portal MyGCC.

Students receiving financial aid should contact their financial aid advisor before dropping classes to determine if they will owe a financial aid repayment.

PASS/NO PASS PETITION

You may select a course as P/NP from the courses designated as P/NP in the current college catalog. You must submit a completed petition to Admissions and Records by March 18, 2019 for 16-week classes, February 16, 2019 for first 8-week classes, March 12, 2019 for first 6-week classes, April 30, 2019 for second 6-week and second 8-week classes.

REPETITION OF COURSES

Courses completed with grades of "C" or better, unless specifically stated, cannot be repeated unless you file a petition. If the petition is approved, only the first grade is considered in computing your cumulative grade point average.

A course can be repeated twice when the grade received was substandard (D, F or P/NP). After completing the course with a D grade or better, you should petition to have the Course Repetition Policy applied to your academic record. Only the last grade will be used to compute the cumulative grade point average, but the original grade on the academic record will not be changed or deleted.

VETERANS

Per California Senate Bill 272, veterans will be given priority registration. In order to collect benefits veterans must file an Intent-to-Register Agreement with the Veterans Resource Center in AA-2. Veterans must have the following documents to proceed: Letter of Eligibility from the Veterans Administration, DD214, official college transcripts from all college work taken outside of Glendale Community College, GCC assessment test results in English and math, and selected college program offered at GCC. Veterans must then establish a Student Educational Plan (SEP) with the Veterans Counselor prior to registration. It is the Veteran's responsibility to notify the college Veterans Office of any changes of program prior to registration. Veterans taking a course which lasts less than a semester will be paid only for the actual enrollment period.

REQUIREMENTS AND REGULATIONS

FAMILY EDUCATIONAL RIGHTS AND PRIVACY ACT OF 1974

Glendale Community College annually informs students of the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 as amended, of the provisions of Sections 76200-76240 of the Education Code of the State of California and of the provisions of Sections 54600-54630 of Title 5 of the California Administrative Code. These references, with which the institution intends to comply fully, were designated to protect the privacy of education records, provide the process by which students may challenge the accuracy of those records, and provide guidelines for the correction of inaccurate or misleading data through informal and formal hearings. Students also have the right to file complaints with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act Office (FERPA) concerning alleged failures by the institution to comply with the act.

An institutional guide explains in detail the procedures to be used by the institution for compliance with the provisions of the act. Copies of the guide are available in the campus library and the Office of Admissions and Records. Questions concerning the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act may be referred to the Office of Admissions and Records.

Release of Student Directory Information Policy

Certain categories of student information are considered "open" or directory information. The college policy on the sharing of directory information to outside agencies and individuals (including parents and spouses of enrolled students) is limited to: name, e-mail address; major field of study; dates of attendance; degrees, honors and awards received; and the most recent previous institution attended. A student may request that directory information not be released by signing a request form at the Office of Admissions and Records. The request form must be received by the last day of the second week of instruction for a fall or spring semester or by the last day of the first week of instruction for a winter or summer session. In that case, this information will not be disclosed except with the consent of the student or as otherwise allowed by the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (FERPA).

GCCD DRUG-FREE CAMPUS POLICY

It is the policy of Glendale Community College to maintain a drug-free campus environment. The unlawful use, manufacture, distribution, possession, presence and sale of alcohol, narcotics, or any illicit drugs is prohibited. A student's presence on college-owned property, or attendance at a collegesponsored or -supervised function, while under the influence or in possession of alcohol, narcotics, or other legally controlled drugs is prohibited except as expressly permitted by law. All students are required to comply with this policy. Information about the health risks associated with alcohol and drug abuse, as well as educational programs and assistance, is available at the Health Center on the first floor of the San Rafael Building.

POLICY ON ACADEMIC HONESTY

College study is the process of acquainting students with values and procedures central to scholarship. All students are expected to do their own work. All forms of cheating and plagiarism are absolutely forbidden. This is the official policy of Glendale Community College.

The following behaviors serve as an operational description of student violations of academic honesty:

- 1. The student takes or copies answers from another student or source or uses unauthorized materials during a test.
- 2. The student turns in an assignment (labs, art projects, homework, prewritten or purchased papers, or work downloaded from the Internet) which is not his/her own.
- 3. The student uses words or ideas which are not his/her own without acknowledgment of the source (plagiarism).
- 4. The student knowingly deceives an instructor with the intent to improve his/her standing in class.
- 5. The student submits the same paper or project previously submitted in another class without the permission of the current instructor.
- 6. The student depends upon tools or assistance prohibited by the instructor in writing papers, preparing reports, solving problems, or carrying out other assignments.
- 7. The student acquires, without permission, tests or other academic materials belonging to a member of the GCC faculty or staff.

When a student engages in academic dishonesty, faculty have the options of requiring the student to see a college counselor, assigning a lower grade, including F or 0, on the assignment in question; assigning a lower or failing (F) final grade in the course (or denying promotion from a non-credit course).

Violations of this Policy will be reported to the Executive Vice President of Instruction and will become part of the Glendale College Cheating Incident file, unless the instructor finds compelling reasons not to report a violation. The Executive Vice President of Instruction may then impose sanctions authorized by Administrative Regulation 5500. The sanctions include, but are not limited to, issuing a reprimand, suspending the student for up to ten days of instruction, and/or requesting a hearing by the Campus Judicial Board to see if the student should be suspended, or permanently expelled from the college.

The student has the right of due process for all the above sanctions.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Glendale Community College shall confer the degree of Associate of Arts or Associate of Science upon a student who has satisfactorily completed all of the requirements for graduation. A student may receive only one (AS or AS-T) and one (AA or AA-T) degree for a total of two Associate degrees. However, if a student seeks to earn additional degrees for employment purposes, or four-year university admission requirement, he or she may do so. See catalog or requirements.

The Associate degree is granted to persons who file a Petition for Graduation in the Office of Admissions and Records, who are not on academic probation, and who has completed 12 units in residency of the required college curriculum of 60 degree applicable semester units at Glendale Community College. The completion of the required 60 semester units must include all of the following:

MAJOR

 The requirement for the Associate in Arts degree may be met by completing a Major with a minimum of 18 semester units. Courses meeting the specific Major requirements are found in the Glendale Community College Catalog.

The requirement for the Associate in Science degree may be met by completing an approved major/certificate program of 18 semester units or more. The approved majors/certificate programs are found in the Glendale Community College Catalog.

When a course required for a Major is also an approved general education course, the course may be double-counted. However, units are only counted once to satisfy the 60-unit requirement for the Associate Degree.

AMERICAN INSTITUTIONS /STATE & LOCAL GOV'T

- Three semester units in American Institutions and State & Local Government are required. Courses which satisfy this requirement include Political Science 101**, 106

U.S. HISTORY

HEALTH

5. Three semester units of community and personal hygiene are required. Health 104, 106; Psychology 111(CD)* or equivalent will satisfy this requirement.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

 Two semester units of physical education activity classes and/or dance activity classes must be completed unless exempted by established policy. Consult the catalog for a list of the exemptions.

FIRST AID

7. One semester unit in first aid and CPR is required. Health 101, 102; Emergency Medical Technology 140.

CULTURAL DIVERSITY

8. Three semester units in Cultural Diversity are required. Courses that satisfy this requirement have been marked by (CD) and appear throughout the graduation requirements. The requirement may be satisfied by completing any one of the graduation requirements with a course marked (CD) or by completing Child Development 156, Speech 115.

INTERSEGMENTAL GENERAL EDUCATION TRANSFER CURRICULUM

Valid through summer 2019

Completion of all of the requirements in the Intersegmental General Education Curriculum (IGETC) will permit a student to transfer from a community college to a campus in either the California State University or University of California system without the need, after transfer, to take additional lowerdivision, general education courses to satisfy campus general education requirements.

ALL COURSES MUST BE COMPLETED WITH A GRADE OF "C" OR BETTER ("C-" IS NOT ACCEPTABLE). FULL OR PARTIAL CERTIFICATION CAN BE GRANTED. PARTIAL CERTIFICATION IS A POLICY THAT ALLOWS A STUDENT TO COMPLETE ONE OR TWO IGETC COURSES AFTER TRANSFER.

WHAT IS A CA College Promise Grant -CCPG?

The CCPG* is formerly known as the BOG Fee Waiver. The CCPG is a grant provided by the State of California for students who have been California residents for more than one year. Eligible students will have their units paid for if eligible for the CCPG. Students who are required to pay non-resident tuition do not qualify. NOTE: Students who do not meet GCC Standards of

Scholarship may lose eligibility to use their CCPG.

PLAN AHEAD!

Do not wait until you want to register to apply. Students may be dropped for non-payment of fees. If you have already filed your 2018-2019 FAFSA or 2018-2019 CA Dream Act Application (for AB540 students) you may not need to complete this form. Check your financial aid records on MyGCC to determine if you have already been awarded a CCPG and do not need to submit this form.

WHAT HAPPENS IF I RECEIVE A CCPG?

If you are eligible for a CCPG A, B, or C your enrollment fees are waived, regardless of how many classes you enroll in. All other fees charged (i.e. health, student services, parking, technology, and ID card fees) remain your responsibility to pay. If you have already paid your enrollment fees and qualify for a CCPG, you will receive a refund of the enrollment fees. Refund checks are automatically calculated and mailed by the

The attached application is for the Summer 2018, Fall 2018, Winter 2019 and Spring 2019 semesters. You only need to apply once per year.

METHOD C: If you don't qualify for Method A or B, you may qualify for a CCPG under Method C by completing the 2018-2019 FAFSA or 2018-2019 CA Dream Act Application (for

AB540 students) and listing GCC (001203) as one of the colleges you want to receive your information.

The official name for CCPG is California College Promise Grant.

FINANCIAL AID

Glendale Community College participates in federal and state student aid programs. When evaluating a student's eligibility, the entire annual cost of education is considered, including fees, books, transportation and a basic amount of living expenses.

HOW TO APPLY

To apply, submit the FAFSA form by mail or on the internet at www.fafsa.ed.gov. Other forms and documents may be required during the review process. Provide all information as quickly as possible to expedite your application.

Fall 2018 - Winter 2019 - Spring 2019 - Summer 2019

File the 2018-2019 FAFSA beginning October 1, 2018. File before March 2 to be considered for the the Cal Grant Program. The college's priority deadline is April 1, 2018.

CALIFORNIA COLLEGE PROMISE GRANT PROGRAM (formerly known as the Board of Governors Fee Waiver)

Effective 2018-2019 award year, the BOG Fee Waiver will be called the California College Promise Grant (CCPG). This waiver is available to California residents to cover enrollment fees only. Students must demonstrate financial need by completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or the California College Promise Grant Application.

Effective in Fall 2016, students who are eligible for a California College Promise Grant may lose their eligibility if they fail to sustain a Cumulative GPA (CGPA) of 2.0 or higher and complete more than 50 percent of their coursework. If a student's CGPA falls below 2.0 for two consecutive primary terms (fall or spring), the student is placed on academic probation. If the cumulative number of units completed is not more than 50 percent in two consecutive primary terms, the student is placed on progress probation.

Academic: Maintain a CPGA of 2.0 or higher

Progress: Complete more than 50% of coursework successfully

Any combination of two consecutive primary terms of academic and/or progress probabtion may result in the loss of California College Promise Grant.

Pell Grant, SEOG Grant, Work-Study, Loans—

GCC participates in federal grant, loan and work-study programs that are available to students enrolled in a college degree, certificate or transfer program. These are all "needbased" programs and eligibility is based on the FAFSA. In addition, students must meet Satisfactory Academic Progress standards and other federal eligibility criteria. Most students must be enrolled at least half-time (6 units), some Pell Grant recipients may qualify for a grant if enrolled less than half time.

CAL GRANT PROGRAM FOR FALL 2018-SPRING 2019

Eligibility is based on the student's 2018-2019 FAFSA and other criteria. Application deadlines are March 2, 2018 and September 2, 2018. The college will submit GPA information for all students who have completed 24 units or more at GCC, of which at least 16 are degree applicable. Students who do not meet these criteria must complete a GPA Verification form and send it to the California Student Aid Commission. There are three types of Cal Grants:

Entitlement Grant: Awarded to all 2017 and 2018 high school graduates who meet the criteria and filed the FAFSA and GPA Verification Form by March 2.

Competitive Grant: Limited number of awards to other students who meet the criteria and apply by March 2 or September 2.

CAL GRANT A—Provides a grant in the amount of tuition and fees at UC & CSU and up to \$9084 at private colleges to students who plan to transfer and who have a GPA of at least 3.0 and meet need and income criteria. Because eligible students already have community college fees waived through the BOG program, grants are not activated until the student transfers to a 4-year college.

CALGRANTB—Provides a stipend of \$1672 per year to students who have a GPA of at least 2.0 and meet specific income, need and other criteria. Students who transfer will also receive funds for tuition and fees at UC and CSU and up to \$9700 at a private college.

CAL GRANT C—Provides awards of up to \$1094 to students in vocational programs. Eligible students will receive a supplemental application form that must be completed and submitted to be considered for an award.







THE STUDENT SUCCESS COMPLETION GRANT (SSCG)—The SSCG grant award provides students with additional financial aid to help offset the total cost of community college attendance, and encourages full time attendance and successful on-time completion.

To be eligible for payment in the fall or winter/spring semester, you must meet all of the criteria detailed below in each semester you expect payment:

- 1. You must receive a full-time Cal Grant B or C payment. Students Choosing to take a Leave of Absence for their Cal Grant will not be eligible to receive payment for the SSCG.
- To receive \$649 in the fall or winter/spring semester, you must be enrolled in 12-14.99 units per semester
- 3. To receive \$2,000 in the fall or winter/spring semester, you must be enrolled in 15+ units per semester
- 4. If you are on Financial Aid Contract, only units from the courses listed on your contract will count toward your eligibility
- You must meet Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) Standards
- Have unmet needs

Summer SSCG are awarded on a funds-available basis. Student who have received the maximum SSCG amount for fall and winter/spring (\$4,000) are not eligible for summer SSCG. Students enrolling for the summer term will be considered for a summer SSCG payment based on their unit total for the year (completed fall and winter/spring units plus enrolled summer units). Students whose summer enrollment brings their annual unit total to 24-29 will receive a summer payment amount that brings their SSCG annual award amount to \$1,298. Students whose summer enrollment brings their annual unit total to 30+ units will receive a summer payment amount that brings their SSCG annual award amount to \$4,000.

DROPPING OR WITHDRAWING FROM CLASSES

Students who receive student should be aware of the effect of withdrawing from classes. Financial aid is not recalculated for enrollment changes that occur after the drop/add deadlines. Students who reduce their enrollment status (withdraw from some but not all units) prior to the registration deadline may have their financial aid eligibility reduced and may be required to repay funds. Students who drop all units and completely withdraw from the college prior to completing 60% of the semester will also be required to repay a portion of the funds they received. Students who receive all fail (F/NP) grades or a combination of all fail (F/NP) and withdrawal (W) grades for the term are considered to have unofficially withdrawn and the withdrawal date used in the return calculation of a student's federal financial aid will be the midpoint of the semester. We encourage you to consult with the Financial Aid Office prior to dropping classes.

SATISFACTORY ACADEMIC PROGRESS REQUIREMENTS

Students applying for financial aid are required to meet federally required academic progress standards. Students who do not meet the following standards will be disqualified from financial aid eligibility:

- 1. Grade Point Average (GPA)-Students must maintain a 2.0 GPA.
- 2. Maximum Units-Students who do not complete a degree or transfer program within 72 attempted units or a certificate within 30 attempted units are not considered to be making satisfactory academic progress and are disqualified from financial aid.
- $3. Satisfactory \, Progress-Students \, must \, successfully \, complete \, at \,$ least 67% of units in which they enroll. Courses in which a grade of F, W, or NP is earned are not considered to be successfully completed.

Appeal Process:

Students may appeal a financial aid disqualification if the failure to meet the standard was due to mitigating circumstances. Mitigating circumstances may include illness, a change of major or other circumstances beyond the student's control and must be documented. Students are notified in writing of the outcome of their appeal.

REQUIREMENTS FOR GLENDALE COMMUNITY COLLEGE HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA

Effective July 1, 2006, the minimum requirements for a Glendale Community College adult high school diploma are as follows:

A minimum of 20 credits must be completed at Glendale Community College. The credits may be earned in the Continuing Education program and/or the credit program.

HIGH SCHOOL EQUIVALENCY TESTING

The High School Equivalency tests can give you the opportunity to earn a high school equivalency certificate and may reduce considerably the number of elective courses required for a high school diploma. The tests are in the areas of Writing Skills, Social Studies, Science, Literature, and Mathematics. The tests are given monthly at the Garfield Campus, 1122 E. Garfield, Glendale. For test dates and registration information please call (818) 240-1000 ext. 5056. For information regarding optional preparation courses offered at the Garfield Campus call (818) 240-1000 ext. 5686.

FURTHER SOURCES OF HIGH SCHOOL CREDITS

(1) High school credits, applicable toward a diploma of high school graduation, may be earned by completing courses offered in the Glendale College Continuing Education program. However, students who desire such credit should consult with a continuing education counselor to be sure that such credits will satisfy graduation requirements and must make this fact known to the instructor at the time of enrollment.

Students may proceed in high school diploma courses at a pace commensurate with ability. Students will be expected to attend class regularly and for the hours scheduled for the course.

- (2) Credits toward a diploma of high school graduation may be earned in other accredited secondary schools and transferred to the Glendale College Continuing Education Division. No credit will be granted for correspondence or extension courses where the examinations have not been monitored or proctored by acceptable school officials, teachers or librarians.
- (3) Credits may be granted for work achievement having educational value provided the individual has been employed for a year or longer by the same employer in an activity which would be considered equivalent to, or parallel to, some high school subject. Original letters from the employer are submitted verifying the dates and length of employment, detailing the nature of the work performed and rating the quality of the work completed. Not more than 10 semester hours of unduplicated work achievement credit may be counted toward high school graduation.
- (4) Credits may be granted for regular training courses completed at a military base during a term of military service, based on the recommendations of the American Council on Education, and for approved courses completed with the United States Armed Forces Institute.
- (5) Credits earned at Glendale Community College or at any other accredited college may be converted into high school credits, by petition, at the rate of three college units for 10 high school credits.
- (6) Elective credits may be granted according to the results of the General Education Development (GED) tests taken by those who qualify (see High School Equivalency Testing at left).
- (7) Neither college nor high school courses that have a content the same as, or are of a lower level than, courses already taken and passed in the same subject area may be taken for high school credit. If there is any question regarding the acceptability of a course, the student is to confer with a counselor or the Administrator of Continuing Education. High school credits may not be earned through repetition of a subject for which credit has been granted previously.

ACADEMIC COUNSELING (MP 221)

Academic counselors provide services to noncredit continuing education students. The counselors work with High School Diploma and High School Equivalency students (transcript evaluation and advisement), State Department of Rehabilitation students, ESL students and claimants of California Training Benefits (CTB) from the Employment Development Department (EDD), Workforce Investment Opportunity Act (WIOA), and student noncredit to credit counseling. BOOKSTORE (MP 126)

The Bookstore sells textbooks, pencils, notebooks, etc. The bookstore is located on the 1st floor Mariposa Building, Room 126. Hours vary, call ext. 5802.

CAREER AND COUNSELING CENTER (MP 221)

The Career and Counseling Center is located in MP221 (2nd floor). The Career and Counseling Center provides assistance in the following areas: transferring to the main campus; choosing credit/noncredit classes to improve skills; applying for financial aid; career assessment; developing resumes and cover letters; filling out job applications; fax, copier, and telephone available. CITIZENSHIP OFFICE (TR 200G)

The Citizenship Office is available to help students fill out, free of charge, the N-400 form, the Application for U.S. Naturalization. Students can also have their pictures taken, at a reduced cost, to complete their application. INFORMATION/WELCOME CENTER (MP 125)

The Information/Welcome Center gives general information to continuing and new students. Welcome Center staff are available to help students with the application, photo ID cards, Beeline passes and is located on the 1st floor of the Mariposa Building, Room 125. Ext. 5678

LIBRARY (TR 201)

The collection supports what students are learning. There are books specifically for the ESL population; there are support materials for those studying for a High School Equivalency Exam, and other resources to help with reading, writing, grammar, and math. The librarians can help access other information electronically through the virtual library. Hours vary, call ext. 5007.

MENTAL HEALTH COUNSELING (MP 221)

CALWORKS PARENTS PROGRAM (SF 115 AND TR 300)

The GCC CalWORKs Program is the on-campus resource for parents receiving CalWORKs cash aid. Our students are low-income parents who are receiving welfare benefits from the state of California. We provide encouragement, advice, and honest feedback for a population of students who are rebuilding their lives on a foundation of education, while modeling perseverance and hard work to their children. We help students communicate with the state workers (DPSS and GAIN) who oversee their benefits. We process the documents that allow CalWORKs students to access crucial supportive services from the state, including child care during class hours and reimbursement for schoolrelated costs such as text books, supplies, transportation, and fees. We also provide funding for Work Study jobs and on-campus child care.

PARKING

PASSENGER DROP-OFF ZONES

DROP-OFF ZONE ON VERDUGO ROAD

The passenger drop off zone is located on Verdugo Road in front of the college. This zone is for the IMMEDIATE LOADING and/or UNLOADING OF PASSENGERS ONLY. Parking and/or waiting in your vehicle for the passenger(s) to arrive is prohibited. Be sure persons are waiting on the sidewalk area before pulling up to the drop-off zone. Do not drop off at any driveway entrance to the college. Do not load or unload passengers in any red zones. Violations may result in a citation by the Glendale Police Department or Glendale Community College District Police Department. You may also receive these citations in the mail.

DISABLED DROP-OFF ZONE

There is a designated disabled drop-off zone located in Lot F on the campus, off of Towne and Verdugo Road. Follow painted arrows when entering or exiting the drop-off zone. There is a second disabled drop-off zone in Lot C, Level One. THESE ZONES ARE FOR THE IMMEDIATE LOADING AND/OR UNLOADING OF DISABLED PASSENGERS ONLY.

PARKING PERMITS

Parking on the GCC campus requires a permit 365 days a year. You are required to display a parking permit while parked on campus. If you are unable to purchase a semester permit, daily permits are available from the Pay and Display machines at the entrance to the GCC parking structure or you may pay the meters and park in the city parking lots. Parking is not free and there are no grace periods. Parking permits are ALWAYS REQUIRED. If you do not display a parking permit, you are subject to citation.

DAILY PARKING PERMITS

- If a Pay and Display machine in the area you have parked is inoperable, it is the responsibility of the purchaser to find an alternate Pay and Display machine which is operational in order to purchase the required parking permit.
- Permits are not transferable from person to person, and are valid only for the day printed on the daily permit.
- Guests who are attending special events at the college are required to purchase and display a valid daily parking permit, or guests may choose to park in Lot F or the city lots and pay the meters.
- Students are encouraged to purchase a daily permit during the first week of the semester or intersession to allow time to purchase a semester parking permit. Daily permits are valid for the day posted on the daily permit.

Daily parking permits are available for \$3.00 at the entrance to the GCC parking structure from the Pay and Display machines (there are five machines on the outside of the structure). The Pay and Display machines accept quarters and credit/debit cards. Daily permits must be displayed face-up, on the driver's side of the vehicle's dashboard and be clearly visible. The daily permits are valid for the entire day/evening in Lot 30, Lot B and the upper four floors of the GCC parking structure (Levels 3-6) during the week, Monday-Friday. On weekends, the daily permits are valid in Lots B or C. Daily permits are not valid in the city parking lots. Vehicles not displaying a permit properly are subject to citation. Parking will be enforced seven days per week including holidays.

SEMESTER PARKING PERMITS

Student semester parking permits are honored in Lot B and the upper four floors of the parking structure (Levels 3-6) as well as the city parking Lots 30, 31, 32, 33, 34, and the Civic Auditorium Parking Structure. A student will not have to pay the parking meters in the city parking lots if he/she purchases and displays a valid student (semester) parking permit; however, the student is only allowed to park in the city parking lots for the specified time that is designated for each lot. Signs in the lots specify the hourly limit. Check posted signs for restrictions. STUDENT PERMITS ARE NOT VALID FOR STREET PARKING. Many streets in the area surrounding the school are "Resident Permit Parking Only". Do not park in restricted areas, you will be subject to citation, and your vehicle may be towed. Permits are not valid at street meters unless indicated by posted sign. The permit is valid from 6:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m. daily.

Purchasing a semester parking permit does not guarantee a parking spot and previous semester permits are not valid in any lot. Permits are not transferable from person to person; however they may be used in other vehicles which the student uses.

STAFF AND FACULTY PARKING PERMITS

Faculty and staff must park in their assigned lots; however, they may also park in Lot C for overflow. Staff and faculty must display a valid parking permit at all times while parked on the Verdugo Campus of GCC or at the Garfield Campus. Permits are not transferable from person to person; however they may be used in other vehicles which the staff or faculty member uses.

MOTORCYCLES

Motorcycles, mopeds, and motorized scooters must be parked in designated motorcycle parking spaces only. These designated spaces are located next to the track at Sartoris Field, in Lot F, or at the north end of City Lot 32. Motorcycles, mopeds, and motorized scooters must display a motorcycle sticker permit while parked on GCC campus. Owners should contact College Police Department to obtain a sticker permit.

DISABLED PLACARDS OR DISABLED PERSON'S LICENSE PLATES

Disabled placards and/or disabled person's license plates issued by the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) allow the vehicle to be parked in any parking space on GCC properties to which the driver has access. However, parking may be restricted and prohibited for special circumstances such as board meetings, public safety access and emergencies, special events, training, and executive level assigned parking. Additionally, parking in red zones, blocking driveways, blocking roadway access, and blocking evacuation routes is prohibited. Designated disabled spaces are located throughout the campus in student and staff lots. A valid GCC parking permit, as well as a valid Disabled Placard or Disabled Person's License Plate, is required to park on the GCC campus. Vehicles with Disabled Placards or Disabled Person's License Plates may park free of charge in any metered parking spaces as long as the Disabled Placard and/or Disabled Person's License Plates are displayed. Metered parking spaces are located in Lot F on the campus, off of Towne and Verdugo Road as well as in the city parking lots.







PARKING

UN-SECURABLE VEHICLES

Un-securable vehicles such as Jeeps, convertibles, etc. must display sticker permits. Owners should contact the College Police Department in SM 153 or call (818) 551-5205 or extension 5205 from a campus phone for more information.

ADDITIONAL PARKING REGULATIONS

Students parking in the GCC parking structure must park only in spaces that are painted white. Green painted parking spaces are reserved for college employees. Vehicles must be parked entirely within the painted parking space markings. Head-in parking only, no backing in.

OVERNIGHT PARKING

Overnight parking is not permitted from 12 a.m. to 6 a.m., without prior approval from the College Police Department.

ELECTRIC VEHICLE PARKING

Rules for using the charging station(s):

- 1. MUST DISPLAY VALID GCC PARKING PERMIT.
- 2. VEHICLE MUST BE PLUGGED IN AND CHARGING.
- 3. 4 HOURS MAXIMUM USAGE TIME PER DAY.
- 4. AFTER VEHICLE IS CHARGED IT MUST BE PARKED ELSEWHERE.
- 5. ALL GCC PARKING RULES APPLY.

BICYCLE PARKING

For bicycle rack locations, you may view the map at http://www.glendale.edu/Modules/ShowDocument.aspx?documentid=8607. Bicycles are required to be parked/secured to bicycle racks. Bicycles may ONLY be secured to bicycle racks and may not be parked and/or locked and/or secured to or against any light post, railing, ramp, path, pathway, etc. or any location that would obstruct the pedestrian or vehicle pathway of others.

On-campus parking lots are patrolled by the College Police Department. Parking related concerns or questions can be submitted in person, in writing, or by emailing parking@glendale.edu. All District rules, regulations, and California Vehicle Codes (CVC) are strictly enforced. Violators may be cited and/or towed at the vehicle

CIVIC AUDITORIUM

The Civic Auditorium parking garage is open to students when not used for auditorium events. The parking garage and/or Lot 31 may be closed to students during these events. Check the weekly bulletin for advanced notice or contact the College Police Department in SM 153 or call (818) 551-5205 or extension 5205.

LOT F

Lot F at GCC is located on the campus, off of Towne and Verdugo Road. It is a metered lot for guests and visitors ONLY. NO parking permits are authorized in Lot F including student, faculty, or staff permits. Guests and visitors must pay the meters to park in this lot. There are disabled parking spaces and a disabled drop off zone available in this lot. Designated motorcycle spaces are available as well.

PARKING CITATIONS

PARKING CITATION PAYMENTS

Payments are due within 21 days of the date the parking citation was issued. Citations may be paid by sending a check or money order in the envelope provided, by phone at (888) 300-9915, or online at http://www.paymycite.com.

PARKING CITATION APPEAL PROCESS

You have 21 days from the citation date to pay the citation or file a Request for Administrative Review. Failure to do so will result in the fine doubling and a hold will be placed on your vehicle's registration until the fine is paid. You may request an Administrative Review up to 14 days after the mailing of a delinquency notice; however, you will still be responsible for any late fees accrued due to failing to pay within 21 days of the citation. Citations may be paid by sending a check or money order in the envelope provided, by phone at (888) 300-9915, or online at http://www.paymycite.com. If you need more information, you may contact the College Police Department by calling (818) 551-5205 or extension 5205 from a campus phone. Administrative Review forms are also available in the College Police lobby (Sierra Madre, 153), in the forms section of the GCC parking website or through http://www.paymycite.com.

ADMINISTRATIVE HEARING REQUEST

If you are dissatisfied with the results of the Administrative Review, you may request an Administrative Hearing by contacting the College Police Department in person or by calling (818) 551-5205 or extension 5205 from a campus phone. This request must be made within 21 days of the date listed on the Administrative Review form. If you are dissatisfied with the results of the Administrative Hearing, you may file a claim in small claims court.

EMERGENCY CALL BOXES

Emergency Call Boxes (ECBs) are located in, or adjacent to, several campus parking lots. They are connected to the Police Department Communications Center by hard wired phone lines, and each one emits an identifier code that alerts the Police Dispatcher of the location of the box being activated. It is important for campus community members to learn the locations of ECBs, especially those located along frequently traveled campus routes (maps are available at the police station, which denote the locations of ECBs). To use the system:

- 1. Follow the instructions on the box.
- 2. When the button is pushed and the ECB is activated, it immediately alerts the Police Dispatcher that someone has activated the ECB. Wait for the

Dispatcher to contact you. You may then speak into the box as if you are using a speaker phone.

3. If for any reason you are unable to talk into the ECB, you can summon assistance by just pushing the button and waiting next to the ECB. College Police personnel are dispatched to the ECB each time it is activated.

By receipt of that text message, you will have opted in to the Nixle system and you will receive future emergency text alerts regarding campus emergencies. STANDARDS OF STUDENT CONDUCT

The Standards of Student Conduct provide a prompt and equitable means to address alleged student violations of the college's behavioral regulations. Students who violate college policies and behavioral regulations shall be subject to the disciplinary procedures outlined in the Standards of Student Conduct, GCC Administrative Regulation 5500. These procedures are not intended to substitute for criminal or civil proceedings that may be initiated by other agencies.

Prohibited conduct that may subject a student to disciplinary sanctions includes, but is not limited to the following:

- 1. Disruption of the orderly operation of the college, including but not limited to the delivery of GCC instructional, administrative, or student services; campus activities sponsored or sanctioned by GCC; other authorized non GCC activities when the act occurs on GCC premises.
- 2. Violation of published GCC rules, Board policies, and administrative regulations.
- 3. Knowingly furnishing false information to any GCC employee or campus office for the purpose of completing GCC documents, applications, or forms processed by the college.
- 4. Forgery, alteration, or other unauthorized use of GCC documents, applications, records, identification, or forms processed by the college.
- 5. Unauthorized possession or duplication of keys to any GCC premises, entry into or use of any GCC premises, or use of GCC supplies and equipment.
- 6. Cheating, plagiarism, or other violations of GCC policies and administrative regulations governing academic honesty.
- 7. Violation of GCC board policies and regulations governing the use of computer, electronic, digital and communications technology.
- 8. Gaming, gambling, or participating in other activities for the purposes of wagering or betting funds.
- 9. Soliciting or assisting another to perform any act that would violate the Standards of Student Conduct and subject a student to disciplinary sanctions.
- 10. Violation of judicial and statutory standards of obscenity; engaging in lewd or indecent behavior on campus or at a campus function.
- 11. Violation of federal, state, or local law on GCC premises, or at GCC sponsored or supervised activities.
- 12. Failure to comply with directions of GCC employees who are acting within the scope of their job responsibilities.
- 13. Use, possession, or distribution of narcotics, other legally controlled

substances, or alcoholic beverages except as expressly permitted by law and GCC regulations.

- 14. Presence on campus or at a college-sponsored function while under the influence of narcotics, other legally controlled substances, or alcoholic beverages except as expressly permitted by law and GCC regulations.
- 15. Abusive behavior directed toward, or hazing of, a member of the campus community or a campus visitor.
- 16. Illegal or unauthorized possession or use of firearms, explosives, other weapons, or dangerous chemicals.
- 17. Sexual harassment of a member of the campus community or a campus visitor including, but not limited to unwelcome sexual advances; requests for sexual favors; other verbal, non-verbal, or physical conduct of a sexual nature in violation of GCC board policies and administrative regulations on sexual harassment, and applicable State and Federal laws.
- 18. Verbal abuse, threats, intimidation, harassment, coercion or other conduct that threatens or endangers the health and safety of a member of the campus community or a college visitor.
- 19. Assault, battery, or any other physically abusive behavior that threatens or endangers the health and safety of a member of the campus community or campus visitor.
- $\mathbf{20}.\ \dot{\mathbf{T}}$ heft or attempted theft of GCC property, or property of a member of the campus community or campus visitor.
- 21. Actual or attempted vandalism or destruction of GCC property, or property of a member of the campus community or campus visitor.
- 22. The use of any electronic listening or recording device in any classroom without the prior consent of the instructor, except as necessary to provide reasonable accommodations for students with disabilities.
- 23. Selling, preparing, or distributing recorded course materials for any purpose unless authorized by the instructor in writing.

Authorized disciplinary sanctions for violations of student behavioral regulations include, but are not limited to written reprimand, loss of privileges, restitution, temporary removal from class, suspension, and permanent expulsion. The college administers these sanctions through the Standards of Student Conduct and provides involved students with their due process rights guaranteed by State and Federal constitutional protections. Copies of the Standards of Student Conduct are available in the Student Affairs Office located in the J.W. Smith Student Center, or on the GCC website at www.glendale.edu.

HARASSMENT POLICY

Board Policy 3430 PROHIBITION OF HARASSMENT

All forms of harassment are contrary to basic standards of conduct between individuals and are prohibited by state and federal law, as well as this policy, and will not be tolerated. The District is committed to providing an academic and work environment that respects the dignity of individuals and groups. The District shall be free of sexual harassment and all forms of sexual intimidation and exploitation including acts of sexual violence. It shall also be free of other unlawful harassment, including that which is based on any of the following statuses: race, religious creed, color, national origin, ancestry, physical disability, mental disability, medical condition, genetic information, marital status, sex, gender, gender identity, gender expression, age, or sexual orientation of any person, or because he or she is perceived to have one or more of the foregoing characteristics.

The District seeks to foster an environment in which all employees and students feel free to report incidents of harassment without fear of retaliation or reprisal. Therefore, the District also strictly prohibits retaliation against any individual for filing a complaint of harassment or for participating in a harassment investigation. Such conduct is illegal and constitutes a violation of this policy. All allegations of retaliation will be swiftly and thoroughly investigated. If the District determines that retaliation has occurred, it will take all reasonable steps within its power to stop such conduct. Individuals who engage in retaliatory conduct are subject to disciplinary action, up to and including termination or expulsion.

Any student or employee who believes that he or she has been harassed or retaliated against in violation of this policy should immediately report such incidents by following the procedures described in AR 3435 Discrimination and Harassment Investigations. Supervisors are mandated to report all incidents of harassment and retaliation that come to their attention.

This policy applies to all aspects of the academic environment, including but not limited to classroom conditions, grades, academic standing, employment opportunities, scholarships, recommendations, disciplinary actions, and participation in any community college activity. In addition, this policy applies to all terms and conditions of employment, including but not limited to hiring, placement, promotion, disciplinary action, layoff, recall, transfer, leave of absence, training opportunities and compensation.

To this end the Superintendent/President or designee shall ensure that the institution undertakes education and training activities to counter discrimination and to prevent, minimize and/or eliminate any hostile environment that impairs access to equal education opportunity or impacts the terms and conditions of employment.

The Superintendent/President or designee shall establish administrative regulations that define harassment on campus. The Superintendent/President or designee shall further establish regulations for employees, students, and other members of the campus community that provide for the investigation and resolution of complaints regarding harassment and discrimination, and procedures for students to resolve complaints of harassment and discrimination. All participants are protected from retaliatory acts by the District, its employees, students, and agents.

This policy and related written regulations (including the regulation for making complaints) shall be widely published and publicized to administrators, faculty, staff, and students, particularly when they are new to the institution, as required in Education Code 66281.5.

Employees who violate the policy and regulations may be subject to disciplinary action up to and including termination. Students who violate this policy and related regulations may be subject to disciplinary measures up to and including expulsion. Unpaid interns who violate this policy and related procedures may be subject to disciplinary measures up to and including termination from the internship or other unpaid work experience program.

ACADEMIC FREEDOM POLICY

Board Policy 4030 ACADEMIC FREEDOM

The Board of Trustees of Glendale Community College affirms that institutions of higher education are conducted for the common good and not to further the interest of either the individual faculty member or the institution as a whole. The common good depends upon the free search for truth and its exposition.

Academic freedom is essential to these purposes and applies to all disciplines. Freedom in research is fundamental to the advancement of truth. Academic freedom in all disciplines is fundamental for the protection of the rights of the faculty and the student. It carries with it duties correlative with rights, regardless of employment status.

The academic community "is a questioner, a worrier, a critic, and idealist, seeking a better way toward human aspiration and fulfillment." Academic freedom is essential for the maintenance of excellence in education, and moreover, exists so that society may have benefits of objective and independent criticism, and honest answers to scientific, social and artistic questions that might otherwise be withheld for fear of offending an influential social group or transient social attitude. Accordingly, there shall be no adverse consequences to employment status (hiring, promotion, and retention) as a result of expressions protected by academic freedom.

Academic Freedom

Faculty members are entitled to full freedom in research and in the publication of the results, subject to the adequate performance of their other academic duties; but research for pecuniary return should be based upon an understanding with the authorities of the institution.

Faculty are entitled to freedom in discussing their subject, but they should be careful not to introduce into their teaching controversial matter which has no

relation to their subject. College faculty are members of a learned profession, and officers of an educational institution. When they communicate as individuals, they should be free from institutional censorship or discipline, but their special position in the community imposes special obligations. As scholars and educational officers, they should remember that the public may judge their profession and their institution by their utterances. Hence they should at all times be accurate, should exercise appropriate restraint, should show respect for the Glendale Community College District, opinions of others, and should make every effort to indicate that they are not speaking for the institution.

Faculty are entitled to due process, where applicable under the provision of the Guild contract, and where applicable under the Grievance Procedure as conducted under the provisions of Board Policy 4050.

Academic Responsibility

Membership in the academic community imposes on students, faculty members, and administrators an obligation to respect the dignity of others, to acknowledge their right to express differing opinions, and to foster and defend intellectual honesty, in instruction and counseling, and expression on and off campus. In addition, faculty are responsible for but not limited to policies and procedures defined in board policy, administrative regulations, and the employment contract between the district and the Guild.

Students are entitled to an atmosphere conducive to learning and to evenhanded treatment in all aspects of the faculty-students relationship.

STUDENT GRIEVANCE POLICY

Student Grievance Procedures

Glendale Community College is committed to providing a prompt and equitable means of resolving student complaints against actions taken by the college and its employees. Students may elect to pursue a grievance if they believe a college decision or action has adversely affected their status, rights, or privileges as students.

What can a student grieve?

Students may file grievances against actions by GCC employees in areas including, but not limited to the following: the exercise of rights of free expression; violation of published GCC rules, Board policies, and administrative regulations; and final grade assignments and other academic decisions.

Non-Grade Complaints

A student may address a complaint about an action taken by a college employee that does not involve course grades through the grievance process. Informal meetings and discussions between persons directly involved in a nongrade grievance are essential and encouraged at all stages of the dispute. If the grievance cannot be resolved directly with the involved employee, the student may request a meeting with the appropriate administrator/manager or division chairperson who shall attempt to resolve the issue informally.

If no informal resolution is reached with the administrator/manager or division chairperson that is satisfactory to the student, the student may submit a written complaint and request for a conference with the appropriate senior GCC administrator as follows:

- Instructional Services employees: Vice President, Instructional Services or designee
- Student Services employees: Vice President, Student Services or designee
- Administrative Services employees: Vice President, Administrative Services or designee
- College administrators: Superintendent/President or designee

The senior administrator shall attempt to settle the grievance through mediation, negotiated agreement, or another mutually acceptable resolution. Final outcomes or resolutions will be communicated to the involved parties after the conclusion of the grievance process.

Grade Appeals

The grade appeals procedure provides a means of resolving a student's dispute of an academic decision or final grade for a course. Students are entitled to an informal review and explanation of their grades by instructors who are obligated to provide such a review. However, students may only appeal a

grade if they are prepared to carry the burden of proving one or more of the following conditions as specified by law:

- A mistake in the assignment of the grade or in the process of its recording
- Fraud
- Bad faith
- Incompetence

A student must file a grade appeal with the instructor within the next regular semester (as specified in the applicable class schedule) following the award of the original grade. The student is expected to make a reasonable effort to resolve the matter on an informal basis with the instructor. If the grade appeal cannot be settled informally then the student may request a meeting with the appropriate division chairperson who will attempt to resolve the grievance.

If the division chairperson cannot resolve the grade appeal then the student may request a conference with the appropriate dean. The dean will attempt to resolve the grade appeal through compromise, negotiated settlement, or a recommendation that is satisfactory to the student and instructor. If the dean is unable to resolve the complaint and the student wishes to continue the grade appeal process, the student may submit a written request for a formal grade appeal hearing to the Campus Judicial Board.

The Campus Judicial Board will conduct a closed hearing and based on the examination of supporting documents and testimony may take the following actions: 1) accept the formal grade appeal and recommend an administrative grade change; 2) reject the formal grade appeal; and 3) make related recommendations as appropriate. The Campus Judicial Board will issue a written decision that determines if the student established a rationale for a grade change according to applicable laws and includes recommendations for the relief, if any, that should be afforded to the student. These findings are then submitted to the Superintendent/President for a final review.

After reviewing the report of findings and recommended actions from the Campus Judicial Board, the Superintendent/President will issue a written decision to the involved parties. The Superintendent/President's decision shall be final and binding in all formal grade appeal hearings.

Where can a student get a copy of the GCC student grievance procedures?

Copies of Board Policy 5530 regarding student grievance and procedures can be obtained from a division chairperson, the Dean of Student Affairs, the Dean of Instructional Services, the Dean of Student Services, and the Dean of Admissions and Records. FACULTY SPOTLIGHT

PAUL VERA

Professor of Credit ESL

It was 1988 when Paul Vera returned from Russia where he had been teaching English as a Second Language (ESL) and managing a Business English school in Moscow. Soon after, he started teaching ESL in private schools in the Los Angeles area. It was 2001 when he started teaching full time at Glendale Community College (GCC). And, in 2017, he got the surprise of his life as the winner of the Distinguished Faculty Award, GCC's most prestigious honor, which was announced at graduation.


"The Committee contacted me, so I thought I might be a finalist," he said. "Then I see my parents, my wife, and my son at graduation. They had all kept it a secret. It was a pretty cool moment."

Vera's honor came as he was wrapping up his 16th year at GCC, where he developed the college's first hybrid online Credit ESL writing course and worked on a six-year collaboration with local high schools to improve ESL matriculation to college—all while completing a second Master's degree in Communication Studies at CSULA and a certificate in Basic Mediation Training.

"I remember how quiet I was when I first started at GCC, and how I followed the rules," he said. "Over time, GCC has offered me opportunity after opportunity to try something new, mess it up, do it again, maybe, get it half right, figure it out, grow, learn, and succeed. The supportive environment and collaborative spirit here has been amazing."

Before GCC, Vera taught middle school—a period that resulted in "an extremely challenging teaching experience but also one that was probably the most instructive and that shaped the teacher I am," he said. "In three months I learned classroom management, which is the No. 1 thing I focus on. It's not the subject matter or even student needs. You have to be able to command and lead a group of people and motivate them to do something. If you don't establish that in the first week, or on the first day, you lose the students for the whole semester."

On the contrary, Vera has earned a reputation for winning over his students, and also for helping guide them in the pursuit of their dreams. "I'm currently teaching two classes of one subject: Level Four Grammar and Writing. I really enjoy this class, which is focused on essay writing and upper-intermediate grammar. Level Four is a required class for some programs—we see a lot of ESL students going on to business programs, culinary arts, nursing—but many also have goals of possibly transferring to a university."



Having taught at many levels in his 17 years at GCC, Vera has seen many of his former students move up, and move on, which is a source of great pride. "The biology labs are across from my office, and I recently saw a former student from Kazakhstan. She's a mother and a very focused student who likes to be challenged. She was in my Level Four class a year ago, and now she's taking biology and anatomy classes—and that's not easy stuff. The work is difficult, but she's a great success story because she took it upon herself to study and learn English as a foundation, which prepared her for other courses. You just love to see that."
