MSU (Schlueter/Shamieh) The SLO Committee requests that the administration go to the Guild negotiation table to ask that faculty participation in SLOACs be included in the contract.

The administration says they are currently negotiating this.

OTHER:

1. Program Review SLO Page: Could include the divisional “assessment plans” as well as “course to program linkage”. Rosemarie Shamieh will pilot-test the draft document with her division.

STAFF DEVELOPMENT TIMELINE FOR SLOAC PROFICIENCY 2011-2012

The activities will be designed to accomplish the following:

1. Divisional assessment plans (timelines) that outline assessment cycles for all courses and programs by 2012 and linkage between course and program outcomes.
2. Creation of “quality assurance” criteria for GCC SLOACs.

TBD:

- a. Assessment tools reflect best practices as described in professional literature of teaching and learning, i.e. CATS (Classroom Assessment Techniques)
 - b. Assessment tools and outcome statements are appropriately aligned and consider the expected level of Blooms taxonomy.
 - c. Assessment techniques are cyclically re-defined and/or refined based on structured dialogue.
 - d. List of “tips” from Ed (# of students, etc)
3. Measurement of faculty perception of SLOAC quality.
 4. Sharing and showcases of best practices.
