Other ways to meet the Foreign Language Requirements	You may satisfy this requirement by: • Receiving a grade of C- or higher in high school courses comparable to the third year level of any language other than the language of high school instruction. • For many students who attended high school outside of the United States, where English is not the language of instruction, then English may be your foreign language. For example, if you went to high school in China where the language of instruction was Mandarin and took the 3rd level of English, then English is considered your foreign language. • Passing a college course comparable to the second semester of a foreign language as taught at Berkeley. This course may be taken for a letter grade or P/NP. You must earn at least a C- or a P. • - Achieving a score of 590 or better on the SAT II Foreign Language Subject Exam. • Achieving a score of 3 or better on any AP Exam in a language other than English. • Obtaining a grade of C or better on the General Certificate "A" or "O" Level Foreign Language Exam.
The minimum eligibility requirements listed in this articulation agreement are necessary and the UC Berkeley Haas School of Business will not evaluate applications from students who are not able to fulfill these requirements. Failure to complete required courses is the primary reason for denial of applications. Please use the Haas Self-Reported Academic Record (SAR) when planning your classes in order to ensure completion of required coursework. The form is available on the internet at http://haas.berkeley.edu/Undergrad/. Admission to the business major continues to be competitive and completion of the courses discussed above is the first important step toward admission to the program. All Transfer applicants will be asked to submit a SAR, essay and resume in January. This information will be reviewed to confirm eligibility for the major. Only students who clearly show planned satisfaction of all the requirements will be considered for admission. The application materials of all eligible students are reviewed thoroughly and many factors are considered, including performance in key prerequisites (business, math, economics, statistics), grade trends, course load, consistency of academic performance, leadership skills, accomplishments as demonstrated by extra-curricular activities, as well as communication and analytical skills.
