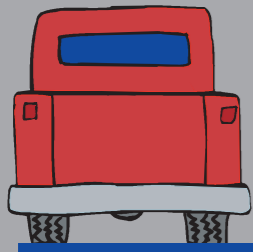

RASHARD RICHARDS WIDE RECEIVERS

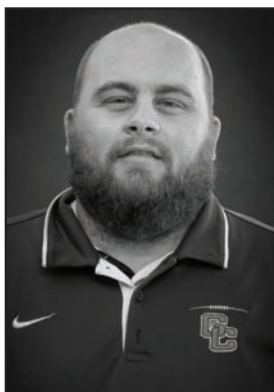

LEO GLAZE QUARTERBACKS

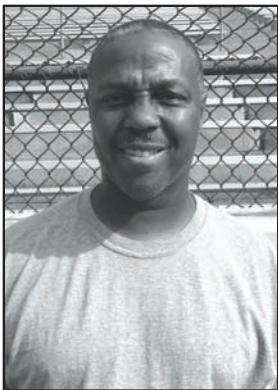

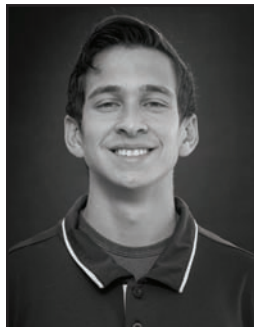
played football at Bishop Amat and was the Los Altos League Lineman of the Year and also an all-league linebacker.
