Majoring in Human Biology

The science of Human Biology is the study of anatomy and physiology of the human body.

The Bachelor of Science program includes courses in mathematics, general and organic chemistry, physics, biology, anatomy and physiology. At the upper division level, the Bachelor of Science degree emphasizes more human biology-related areas, such as embryology, cell physiology, human anatomy and physiology (all organs), genetics, and research related to human biology.

The Bachelor of Science in Human Biology provides the student with the following:

- An understanding of biological, chemical, and physical sciences
- A basic knowledge in anatomical structure and physiological processes of human organ systems
- The ability to relate the basic science knowledge to graduate studies in health related professions
- A broad knowledge of the social environment and cultural heritage

Admission Requirements for the Bachelor of Science in Human Biology Degree Program

The requirements for freshman students:

- An official high school transcript, or a copy of a high school diploma or GED
- A high school GPA of at least 2.00 on 4.00 scale. The high school GPA requirement is waived if the applicant has at least 24 post-secondary credit units.
- TOEFL for international students with a passing score of 500 or better (paper-based test) or 173 or better (computer-based test)

The requirements for transfer students:

- An official high school transcript, or a copy of a high school diploma or GED
- Official transcripts of from all colleges and universities attended. Transcripts must be issued directly to the Office of Admissions.
- TOEFL for international students with a passing score of 500 or better (paper-based test) or 173 or better (computer-based test)

Financial Aid & Scholarships

It is relatively easy to apply and receive financial aid to help with the cost of school. There are many government programs that supply free funding to a wide variety of student-based needs.

Student Financial Assistance (SFA) Programs

- Cal Grants A and B awarded up to \$9,420 each for California Residence only
- Federal Pell Grants award up to \$3,300 for undergraduates who have not earned a Bachelor's Degree
- Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grants (FSEOGs): an award to students who qualify for a Pell Grant. Funds are limited.
