COURSE OUTLINE

Photography 145 Contemporary Photography and Practices

I. Catalog Statement

Photography 145 is a survey of techniques and practices of contemporary photographers and their relationship to past practices and movements within Photography. Current trends in photographic image making will be presented. Students will examine the crossover of fine art, documentary, commercial and editorial practices as well as the impact of digital methods in photography.
