

# Legislative Scene

- First year of two-year session, ending in 2014.
- Passage of Proposition 30 reduced pressure on budget.
- Democrats obtain a two-thirds majority in each house, first time a party has had a super majority since 1933.



### The Freshmen

- Almost half the Assemblymembers are new to Sacramento.
- One of the largest freshman classes in history.
- New term limits means that these members can serve up to 12 years in one house.
- Six of the new members have ties to community colleges.



# Bill Factory

- 2,100 bills were introduced.
- 120 affected community colleges.
- 22 were passed on to the Governor.





# Taking Positions: Educating vs. Campaigning

### **Educating**

- Provide fair presentation of the facts
- Objective, noninflammatory language
- Does not urge voters to vote for or against
- Preparing objective analysis of impact
- Consider context of info

### Campaigning

- Using college resources
- Disseminate ballot initiative advocacy materials prepared by others
- Publishing ratings of candidates
- Use public role for private advocacy
- Mailings close to elections
