Administrative Regulations

COMMUNICABLE DISEASE

Glendale Community College shall cooperate with local, state and federal health officers in the implementation of those measures deemed necessary for the prevention and control of communicable diseases among students. The College shall, in addition comply with any immunization program required by the State Department of Health Services.

Office of Primary Responsibility: Student Health Services

The Health Center staff will comply with communicable disease control in accordance with:

1. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention for public health, selected immunizations, and communicable disease control;
2. The standards of the Los Angeles County Department of Health; and
3. The Glendale Health Department for control of communicable diseases, including but not limited to tuberculosis and meningitis.

The Student Health Center provides:

1. Health education and intervention for communicable disease prevention, including disease reporting to the Los Angeles County Office of Public Health;
2. Tuberculosis (TB) testing; Measles, Mumps, Rubella (MMR) vaccination; Tetanus, Diphtheria, and Pertussis vaccinations; and Influenza vaccinations; and
3. Community referrals for meningitis vaccination, Human Papilloma Virus (HPV) vaccination, varicella vaccination, pneumonia vaccination, and travel vaccines.
