


◆DAY 1 ~ ARRIVE WINCHESTER, VA◆

Get ready for a spectacular journey! We will meet at Los Angeles International Airport for our nonstop flight arriving at Virginia's Dulles Airport this afternoon. Our deluxe coach will be waiting to transport us to historic **Winchester**, **Virginia** and our hotel, the *George Washington Wyndham*. With marble floors, soaring ceilings, and the original front desk, this deco stunner completed in 1924 offers old-world charm along with all the modern conveniences. Enjoy an included **Welcome Dinner** with entertainment at the hotel. (Dinner)

DAY 2 ~ SHENANDOAH NAT'L PARK

After an included breakfast we'll be joined by "Patsy Cline" who will provide a tour of her hometown. We'll see her childhood home, Radio Station WINC (where she began her career at age 14) and pay a visit to her grave site. Later we arrive in **Shenandoah National Park** with a memorable journey along the crest of the Blue Ridge Mountains via **Skyline Drive**. Spectacular views abound as we pass by rock cliffs, majestic vistas, tunnels of trees, wildflowers, ferns and possibly banks of mountain laurel and wildlife. Enjoy some "Vintage Southern Hospitality"



during an included lunch at the historic *Mimslyn Inn* in Luray, Virginia. This afternoon we'll enjoy a docent-guided tour of the **Luray Caverns** – the largest caverns on the east coast. You'll be astounded by the **Great Stalacpipe Organ**, the only instrument of its kind in the world playing concert quality music from stone formations. We'll also tour the **Car & Carriage Museum** to see Rudolph Valentino's 1925 Rolls Royce and other automobile gems. This evening we arrive in **Staunton**, **Virginia** to check into the *Stonewall Jackson Hotel*, a historic hotel built in 1924. (Breakfast, Lunch)



•DAY 3 ~ LEXINGTON, HOT SPRINGS•

Following an included breakfast we'll tour the Woodrow Wilson Birthplace and Museum. Among the period antiques and items from Wilson's political career exhibited is his presidential limousine. Following an included lunch at the historic Robert E. Lee Hotel in Lexington we'll be met by a local guide as we tour the Virginia Military Institute (VMI). A visit to the VMI Museum to see Stonewall Jackson memorabilia (he taught here for 10 years) includes his bulletpierced raincoat, and his war horse, Little Sorrel, mounted and outfitted. A visit to the Lee Chapel and Museum located on the grounds of Washington & Lee University where Robert E. Lee was President. Many of his personal and

family artifacts are on display as his office which is preserved much as he left it in 1870. Visit the **George C. Marshall Museum and Library** containing photomurals and artifacts that depict the life and times of General of the Army, George C. Marshall. See the **Stonewall Jackson House** – the only home the famous Confederate General ever owned. This evening we check in to *The Homestead Resort* in Hot Springs, Virginia for a two-night stay with an included dinner in the Main Dining Room. (Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner)

DAY 4 ~ THE GREENBRIER

After an included breakfast we'll travel to the famed Greenbrier Resort in West Virginia's Allegheny Mountains for a docent-guided tour of the secret Eisenhower-era underground bunker, designed to house members of Congress and their staffs during (and after) a nuclear attack. See the cafeteria, dormitories, the decontamination chambers, a clinic with an operating room, areas designated as chambers for the House and Senate, and the power plant, which was the source of emergency generators, water storage and air filtering systems. After an included lunch at The Greenbrier and time to browse the shops, we return to the Homestead with an included afternoon tea and dinner. (Breakfast, Lunch, Afternoon Tea, Dinner)

◆DAY 5 ~ BLUE RIDGE PARKWAY ◆

Following an included breakfast we'll visit Natural Bridge, one of the Seven Wonders of the natural world and once owned by Thomas Jefferson! As we continue along portions of the Blue Ridge Parkway we'll absorb the stunning scenery. After an included lunch overlooking a mountain lake, we'll tour Poplar Forest, Jefferson's personal retreat near Lynchburg. After visiting the National D-Day Memorial in Bedford, Virginia, we'll check in to the Terry Craddock Hotel in historic Lynchburg. (Breakfast, Lunch)

DAY 6 ~ APPOMATTOX, MONTICELLO

An included breakfast before we depart for Appomattox. At Appomattox Court House National Historical Park we'll walk the old county lanes where Lee surrendered his men to Grant on April 9, 1865. Enjoy time at leisure at the Visitor Center, the McLean home (surrender site) and other buildings within the village. Visit the Museum of the Confederacy containing a rich collection of artifacts and documents of the Confederate government, military, civilians, and enslaved and free African Americans. This afternoon we'll arrive in Charlottesville and enjoy an included lunch at historic Michie Tavern where costumed wait staff serve a hearty Colonial period fare in this 200-year old converted log house. Later, a docent-guided tour of Monticello, the mountaintop home of Thomas Jefferson. The house is a remarkable

integration of classical architecture and modern innovation designed by Jefferson and built on the mountain top where he had played as a boy. This evening we arrive in **Richmond**, the capital city of Virginia and once the Confederate capital during the Civil War, and check-in to the historic *Hilton Garden Inn Richmond Downtown* – located in the former Miller and Rhoads Department Store building. (Breakfast, Lunch)

DAY 7 ~ RICHMOND

Following an included breakfast we'll visit Tuckahoe Plantation to learn about Virginia's colonial plantation life. In the tiny schoolhouse nearby, Thomas Jefferson attended classes when his parents were at Tuckahoe. Tuckahoe Gardens is a horticultural treasure and this time of year should have a vibrant show of bulb flowers, flowering trees, wildflowers and many native plants. Later we visit the Lewis Ginter Botanical Garden, boasting extensive floral displays on over 24 acres, an elegant Victorian garden and mansion, exotic Asian garden, a water garden with many native species, and a three-acre lake. This afternoon we visit St. John's Church which became famous as a living memorial to American liberty when 120 Virginia colonial leaders, including George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, Richard Henry Lee, Thomas Nelson, Ir., and Patrick Henry, met there in the spring of 1775. This is where Patrick Henry gave his fiery "Give me Liberty or Give me Death" speech. Later, a docent-guided tour of the Virginia State Capitol, Thomas Jefferson's neo-classical marvel which features a hidden dome, pre-historic fossils in the floor marble and the world-famous statue of George Washington. This evening enjoy a Farewell Dinner at a local favorite. (Breakfast, Dinner)

DAY 8 ~ FREDERICKSBURG, FAREWELL

Following an included breakfast we'll travel north to Fredericksburg where a local guide will provide a tour of the city. A docent-led tour of the Rising Sun Tavern, the private residence of Charles Washington (George's youngest brother) which became a tavern in 1792. A tour of Kenmore, the elegant plantation home of George Washington's only sister and her patriot husband Colonel Fielding Lewis, who employed a skilled plaster worker who created three of the most gloriously decorated rooms of the Colonial period. A tour of the Mary Washington House. George Washington bought this house for his mother in 1772 and she lived here for the last 17 years of her life. The garden remains much as it was when she lovingly attended it. An included box lunch en route to Dulles Airport and our non-stop return flight arriving into Los Angeles this evening. Memories and images of your time in the Shenandoah Valley indelibly set in our minds. (Breakfast, Lunch)
