Sooren's future was cast when he was only about eight years old, watching a UCLA basketball game with his father in Iran. "Maybe you can play for them someday," his dad told him. He made the Iranian National Team at 14, moved to the U.S. after high school and enrolled at GCC. Upon transferring to UCLA, he made the Bruin team as a walk-on. "Glendale College felt like home to me," he said, "so the transition was really easy."

When she first started at GCC, Liliana admits she wasn't a very good student. She took two semesters off, but seeing her educational opportunity slipping away, she came back with newfound motivation. "College may be hard," she said, "but there are a lot of resources you can access to help you succeed." She joined the Scholars Program, found her spark, and was awarded a prestigious Regents Scholarship when she transferred to UCLA.

After working in construction for ten years, Chris wanted to elevate his career and become a civil engineer. He started by taking a few classes at GCC, but then decided to become a full time student. "I applied for financial aid so I could work less and focus more on my studies," he said, "and I applied for and received scholarships every year." It wasn't easy, but the money helped Chris maintain a high GPA and transfer to CSULA.

After a false start at another college, Cameron landed in a student development class at GCC. "I learned how to be a better student," he said, "and since it was taught by counselors, I started going to the counseling office to talk about my options." He also got involved with student government and developed more opportunities than he imagined possible, choosing UCSB from a list of eight schools that accepted him for transfer.

Tatevik was admitted to CSULA and CSUN after high school, but chose to attend GCC instead. "I wanted to stay close to home and keep my expenses low," she said. "I transferred to UCLA and they gave me an excellent financial package, so my only student loans have been to pay for grad school." Tatevik is currently working in the Student Outreach Services office at GCC while she finishes her master's degree in post-secondary education at USC.

It wasn't the closest school to Asad's home, but some friends planned to go to GCC, so he decided to join them. "I wanted to prepare for a four-year university by attending community college, and chose GCC mainly for the social benefit," he said, "but it worked out great for me academically, too." His activities with student government and on-campus jobs helped him build a resumé that secured his admittance to USC.

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New Student Checklist for 2014

Don't miss out!
You must complete these steps by June 13 to receive priority registration for fall 2014.

January 2014

- Apply to Glendale Community College for the fall 2014 semester
 - Application available online **January 20** at www.glendale.edu.
 - Applying is easy and it's **FREE**.

February

- Complete an Online Orientation
 - Once you receive your student ID number, visit www.glendale.edu/Orientation.

March–April

- Take your Math and English/ESL Assessment Tests
 - Assessment tests are available at GCC beginning **March 17** in **SF112**.
 - Visit www.glendale.edu/Assessment for testing schedule and sample tests.
 - Be sure to review sample tests prior to taking assessment tests.
 - The Assessment staff will make an Academic Advising appointment for you.

April–May

- Meet with a GCC counselor at your Academic Advising session
 - A counselor will help you develop your required **Student Educational Plan (SEP)**.

June–July

- Register for fall 2014 classes at GCC
 - Deadline to apply, complete orientation, take assessment tests and complete your SEP is **June 13**.
 - You will be notified of your registration date through MyGCC, your online student portal, on **June 23**.
 - Priority registration begins on **June 30**.

Tips for Success—Things to do once you're a GCC student that can help you succeed

- ▶ Take a student development class
- ▶ Join a club
- ▶ Apply to Alpha Gamma Sigma (honors society)
- ▶ Visit your professors during their office hours
- ▶ Volunteer through the Center for Student Involvement
- ▶ Get into student government
- ▶ Visit your counselor every semester
- ▶ Use the Tutoring Center, Learning Center and Career Center

Paying for College

Glendale Community College is a very cost-effective option, but you can still get help paying for college while you're here.

Financial Aid

Q: Should I apply for financial aid?

A: YES!

You could be eligible to receive financial aid in the form of federal or state grants, fee waivers, loans, or part-time work study. But you'll never know unless you apply, and it's all handled through a single application:

► **Fill out the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid*) at fafsa.gov**

*Undocumented non-citizens should not complete a FAFSA, but should complete a California Dream Application at csac.ca.gov

- Complete the application **between January 1 and March 2, 2014** for the 2014-15 school year
- Fill out the application with your parents.
- Include GCC in your list of school choices. **Our Federal School code is 001203.**
- You should receive a Student Aid Report via e-mail within 1 – 2 weeks. Be sure to follow up on any additional steps outlined in the report.
- The California Student Aid commission will receive your FAFSA information automatically for state grants, but your high school must also send them your grades. **Check with your high school counseling office to be sure they do this before the March 2, 2014 deadline.**

► **Apply for admission to GCC on **January 20, 2014** for fall 2014 semester**

- Once you apply for admission and have submitted your FAFSA (or CA Dream application) and all other documents required by the Financial Aid Office, the GCC Financial Aid Office will notify you by e-mail of all the programs that are available to you.
- Always accept grants; this is money you don't have to repay and it can be used at your discretion.
- Never take out a loan for more money than you need; student loans must be repaid and interest charges accumulate while you're still in school.

Scholarships

Q: Should I apply for a scholarship at GCC?

A: YES!

The Glendale Community College Scholarship Office has over 500 scholarships available and you can apply for all of them by filling out one simple application through your student portal at MyGCC.

Q: Do I have to be an "A" student to get a scholarship?

A: NO!

Very few scholarships are awarded based on academic achievement; most are based on the student's financial need, major field of study, community service, campus leadership or other criteria established by the scholarship sponsors.

Q: Who can apply?

A: Currently enrolled students who have completed at least 12 units of credit at GCC with a grade point average of 2.5 or higher.
