2015-16: A YEAR IN REVIEW

With only one returning player from the previous year, it was not surprising that the 2015-16 Vaquero Men's Basketball team was picked to finish last in the tough Western State South Conference. The Vaqueros, after a slow start to the season, began a revival of sorts as it opened up play in its own Vaquero Classic Tournament in mid-December. Playing one of the toughest schedules in the school's recent history, the team played several highly ranked opponents before the start of conference play, including games against San Bernardino Valley and Saddleback Colleges...both of whom were ranked #1 in the State throughout the year.

The Vaqueros continued improvement throughout the year saw them defeat several highly ranked league opponents at the start of conference play, including eventual champions, Bakersfield College, holding them to their lowest point total of the season. The Vaqueros were able to put together winning streaks of four and three games during conference play...with impressive wins against highly ranked opponents, Antelope Valley, Santa Monica, and West Los Angeles.

With its resurgence having culminated into an 8-6 finish in the tough Western State South division, along with having one of the best 'strength of schedule' and 'RPI' rankings in the State, the Vaqueros were granted a bid into the CCCAA Championship Playoffs. The team's strong finish in conference earned them a #17 seed in the opening round of the playoffs and a road game against Mira Costa College. The season came to an end in a loss to Mira Costa in the first round, but the resurgence of the program is on track to continue.

The Vaqueros look to put together another successful team in 2016-17 and work toward improving upon the success of the past season. The coaching staff is very excited about the future of Vaquero Basketball. If you want to compete, if you want to be challenged, to be the best you can be each, and every day, you want to be a Vaquero.
