Accreditation: Overview

- Accrediting Commission for Community & Junior Colleges (ACCJC)
 - Accredits public and private associate degree-granting institutions in California, Hawaii, and the Pacific Islands
- Seven-year accreditation cycle (formerly six years)

Accreditation: Overview

- ACCJC in the news
 - January 4, 2016: Education Secretary upheld January 2014 decision by the Department of Education to find ACCJC noncompliant with criteria for recognition - lack of support from educations, and number of academics on teams and panels - 12 months to demonstrate compliance on these issues
 - December 2015: NACIQI (National Advisory Committee on Institutional Quality and Integrity) gave ACCJC six months to change policies regarding awarding of four-year degrees
 - November 2015: Board of Governors directed Chancellor to develop a new accrediting model for California community colleges - Chancellor Harris plans to present a proposal before he retires in April
- Changes to the accreditation system will probably not affect GCC's visit in October 2016

Accreditation: Timeline

- February 2016: Board review of initial draft Self Evaluation Report
- March 2016: Begin preparations for October visit
- April 2016: Self Evaluation Report to governance and Senate
- May 2016: First Board reading
- June 2016: Second Board reading / approval
- July 2016: Self Evaluation Report printed
- August 2016: Self Evaluation Report sent to Commission and team
- September 2016: Finalize preparations for October visit
- October 2016: External Evaluation Team Visit

- The Self Evaluation Report must be sent to the ACCJC by August 15, 2016
- The external visiting team members will receive copies in advance of the visit
- The visit will occur in early October, 2016

- Highlights of Standard I: Mission, Academic Quality & Institutional Effectiveness, and Integrity
 - The mission statement is periodically reviewed and revised, with Board approval
 - The college uses data to measure how well it meets its mission
 - The college disaggregates learning outcomes and achievement data for subpopulations of students
 - The college reviews policies, procedures, and publications to assure integrity in how it represents itself

- Highlights of Standard I: Mission, Academic Quality & Institutional Effectiveness, and Integrity
 - Evaluation of Sections in Standard I: 27 out of 27 standards considered met

- Highlights of Standard II.A: Instructional Programs
 - Courses and programs are continuously evaluated and improved
 - Learning outcomes are assessed for courses, programs, and services
 - Delivery modes and support services reflect the diverse, changing needs of students
 - Degree programs include a general education component

- Highlights of Standard II.A: Instructional Programs
 - Evaluation of Sections in Standard II.A: 16 out of 16 standards considered met

- Highlights of Standard II.B: Library and Learning Support Services
 - Library and learning resources are sufficient to support educational programs
 - Library and learning support services are evaluated to assure they meet student needs
 - Evaluation of Sections in Standard II.B: 4 out of 4 standards considered met

- Highlights of Standard II.C: Student Support Services
 - Services support student learning, regardless of location or means of delivery
 - · Student learning support outcomes are identified and assessed
 - Evaluation of Sections in Standard II.C: 8 out of 8 standards considered met

- Highlights of Standard III.A: Human Resources
 - Personnel are qualified, evaluated systematically, and supported through appropriate programs and services
 - The college assesses employment equity and diversity

- Highlights of Standard III.A: Human Resources
- Evaluation of Sections in Standard III.A: 12 out of 15 standards considered met; 3 considered partially met
 - Partially Met: III.A.1 AR 7123 (Applications, Recruitment and Selection of Employees) should provide more specific procedures to define the hiring process, committee composition, and role of committee members
 - Partially Met: III.A.5 Employee evaluations
 - Partially Met: III.A.13 No written code of ethics for classified employees, and no consequences for violating codes of ethics

- Highlights of Standard III.B: Physical Resources
 - The college assures safe and sufficient physical resources
 - Evaluation of Sections in Standard III.B: 4 out of 4 standards considered met

- Highlights of Standard III.C: Technology Resources
 - Technology services and resources are adequate, updated, and maintained
 - The college provides sufficient instruction and support for use of technology
- Evaluation of Sections in Standard III.C: 5 out of 5 standards considered met

- Highlights of Standard III.D: Financial Resources
 - Financial resources are sufficient
 - Oversight of finances is effective
 - Evaluation of Sections in Standard III.D: 16 out of 16 standards considered met

- Highlights of Standard IV: Leadership and Governance
 - The college has policies for administrator, faculty, staff, and student participation in decision-making
 - · Decision-making processes and results are widely communicated
 - The CEO has primary responsibility for the quality of the institution, and provides leadership in planning, organizing, budgeting, selecting and developing personnel, and assessing institutional effectiveness
 - The governing board has authority over policies to assure quality, integrity, effectiveness, and financial stability

- Highlights of Standard IV: Leadership and Governance
 - Evaluation of Sections in Standard IV: 26 out of 26 standards considered met

 Out of the 121 sections of the accreditation standards, GCC's self evaluation considers 118 of the standards to be met

• Work continues to address the 3 identified gaps prior to the final draft in May

- Further Work
 - A Quality Focus Essay (QFE) is a new requirement we must include in the Self Evaluation
 Report
 - Additional data on outcomes and narrative on the college's compliance with Commission and US Department of Education policies must also be added
 - Formatting and editing the Self Evaluation Report
 - Testing evidence documents to assure validity and accessibility
 - · Designing the publication
