Course Description

Course Schedule and Location

The class will meet every Tuesday and Thursday from February 21, 2016 until June, 2016 (WSC and State Finals) from 1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. Instruction and practice will occur at Oakmont C.C. WSC matches will occur at various golf courses on Mondays during the season.

Course Requirement and Attendance Policy

This is a participation course and since it meets twice a week and participates in a match once a week, attendance is critically important. Qualifying for Monday matches will occur on the Tuesday and Thursday prior to the match. If for some reason you cannot make a practice, it is mandatory that you contact me by email or cell phone.
