Preparation for the Meeting:

- 1. During the meeting we'll work in four groups, one for each Guided Pathways "pillar."
- 2. Each person on the RSVP list has been assigned to pillar. I will send an email to each pillar group individually to identify members.
- 3. Reading asked of all attendees (you might have already read most or all of this):
 - AACC's overview of the Guided Pathways model (2 pages) for a review of the GP model and the four pillars, which are referred to as "essential practices" 1-4 in AACC's overview document
 - 2. Pages 1-2 of <u>CCRC's "what we know" report</u> for an overview of GP model contrasted with status quo "cafeteria model"
 - 3. Pages 4-6 of CCRC's "tips and tools" report for a low-resolution outline of a suggested GP implementation timeline
 - 4. For another short formulation of the four pillars, see pages 1-2 of CCRC's "early insights" report
- 4. Reading asked of members of each pillar group (you might have already read most or all of this):
 - 1. Members of group on Pillar 1 (clarify paths to student end goals)
 - 1. Pages 11-18 of CCRC's "early insights" report
 - 2. Optionally, pages 31-38 of CBD's "building guided pathways toolkit"
 - 2. Members of group on Pillar 2 (help students choose and enter a pathway)
 - 1. Pages 22-30 of CCRC's "early insights" report
 - 2. Optionally, pages 31-38 of CBD's "building guided pathways toolkit"
 - 3. Members of group on Pillar 3 (help students stay on path)
 - 1. Pages 39-52 of CCRC's "early insights" report
 - 2. Optionally, pages 31-38 of CBD's "building guided pathways toolkit"
 - 4. Members of group on Pillar 4 (ensure that students are learning)
 - 1. Pages 36-38 of CCRC's "early insights" report
- 5. If someone wants to be in another pillar than the one I picked for them, they should read the assigned pillar's reading plus the other one they want and we'll try to shuffle groups at the meeting if possible.

Meeting Agenda:

- 1. 10-15 minute for setting the stage
- 2. Break into the pre-assigned groups, one for each pillar
- 3. Discussion instructions:
 - 1. For the next hour, imagine your group is the GCC task force assigned with moving the College forward in GP implementation.

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- 2. Assign a member of the group to take notes on the google doc provided. Each group will have their own google doc.
- 3. What are the major deliverables your task force will need to produce? Shoot for about 3 big picture deliverables.
- 4. For each deliverable, what are the major inquiry questions your task force will need to answer in order to come up with a product that works well? Include a brief sentence about *how* your task force might seek to answer these questions.
- 5. For each deliverable, identify what you'd need to know from the other task forces in order to make progress in your work. (i.e., Where are the inter-group bottlenecks?)
- 6. Draft a rough 2-year timeline, fleshing out a more detailed version of Years 1 & 2 of the CCRC 5-year timeline on pages 4-6 of CCRC's "tips and tools" report.
- 7. Who (position/person/constituent/etc) needs to have a seat on your task force? Think about a balance between increasing representation and maintaining agility. Also, keep in mind that each task force can/will utilize discussions with many people serving in a "resource" capacity.
- 4. We will ask each group share out for 10 minutes each before adjourning at 12:00 for lunch.

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
