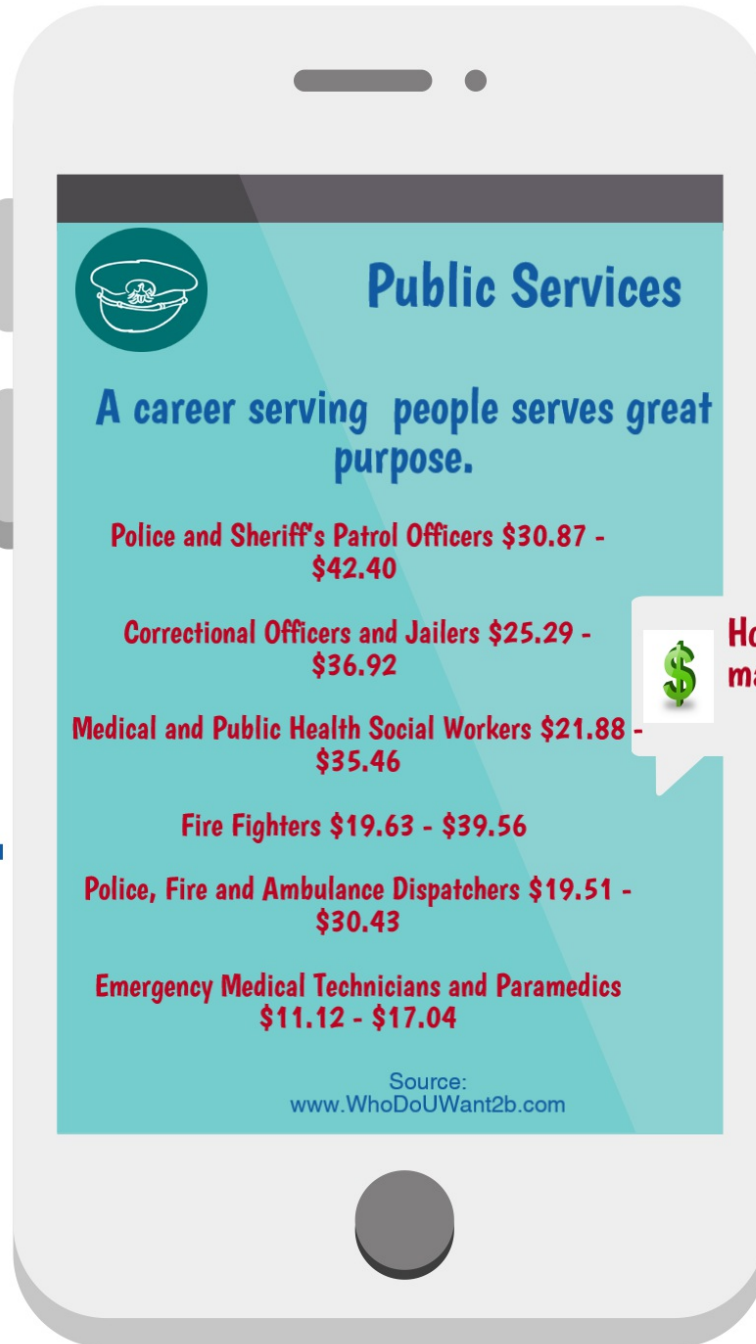
Public Services
