Join GCC Chef Andrew Feldman, Geography Prof. Darren Leaver, and Geology Prof. Ziad Sedki on this 25-day exploration of the geography, food, culture and geology of Bali, Indonesia. Courses include International Cooking (3 units), Physical Geology (3 units) and Field Studies (1 unit). The program kicks off with a week of on-campus lectures and activities before departing for Bali, the Island of the Gods. Once in Bali the program will continue with lectures, discussions, and hands-on activities including Balinese cooking classes, hiking an active volcano, rice field treks, snorkeling over coral reefs, observing traditional dance performances, and visiting key historical/cultural sites including the Elephant Cave, Bat Cave and Monkey Forest. Students must enroll in at least 2 courses.

Program Locations: Ubud (13 nights), Pelaga (1 ni), Pemuteran (3 ni), Candidasa (6 ni).

Program Includes: 23 nights accommodation based on triple and double occupancy in villas and tourist-class hotels with air conditioning and swimming pools. Daily breakfast and 12 additional meals. Transfers and transportation as part of the program itinerary. Entry to cultural sites and temples including Elephant Cave, Monkey Forest, and Bat Cave. Activities including downhill bike ride, Balinese cooking classes, chocolate-making class, volcano and waterfall treks, Treetops zipline course, snorkeling at Menjangan Island and Amed, Kecak & Fire dance performance.

Not Included: Airfare of approximately \$1,100, GCC tuition & fees, textbooks, beverages, meals & activities not part of the itinerary, tips to local staff (approx. \$30), spending money (approx. \$600).



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
