WebAssign for Intermediate Algebra Spring 2019

Online practice exercises are available to help you master your algebra.

These interactive homework exercises are provided to help you better master the content of your algebra class. These will not count toward your class grade. Your instructor is unable to access information regarding your activity on these exercises.

To Utilize the Online Software you must have a WebAssign access code.

If you purchased a new textbook at the GCC bookstore you received a code with it. If you do not have a WebAssign access code they are available for purchase online, see the Quick Start Guide for details. You may **try the software free for 14 days** after the start of the class by selecting that option when asked for an access code during the sign-up procedure. When you enter Web-Assign you will be told how much longer you have available for the trial period.

Follow the instructions below for using WebAssign.

- 1. Go to "www.webassign.net"
- 2. Select "I have a class key" on the right hand side of the screen.
- 3. Enter: glendale 7936 1215 and select "Submit"
- 4. Select "Yes, this is my class" even if the instructor listed is not your instructor.
- 5. Select "Continue" to create a WebAssign account or select already have one.
- 6. Create a username and password and write it down so you don't forget it later.
- 7. Input your last name, first name and email address and select "Create My Account".
- 8. This will get you into the WebAssign website.
- 9. You will need to enter your access code here or select proceed with free trail and select "Continue".
- 10. Once you are registered and in WebAssign, select Getting Started on the left hand tab.

Once you are in WebAssign you can see the homework under Current Assignments.

To use the online e-book:

- click on the name of the textbook in "About This Class"
- select "Contents" on the top left
- select the chapter you are working on and the pages will appear on the left just as they are in your book
- you can click on the video button next to the examples if you want to watch a video

To watch tutorials/videos:

- click on the name of the textbook in "About This Class"
- select "Media" on the top left
- select the chapter you are working on
- tutorials appear first and below them are the videos (you may have to scroll down to see them)
 - o under tutorial, you can watch, try or practice
 - the videos are listed by topic and some are repeated

The Personal Study Plan is another great place to study:

- Scroll down until you see the PSP on the bottom left of your screen
- Click on whichever chapter you would like to study or review
- Click on the Chapter Quiz and try all the problems
- After submitting, go into the overview to see which concepts you fully understand and which ones need further review.
