## What's A CNC Machinist?

A CNC machinist works with computer numeric controlled (CNC) heavy machinery from setup to operation to produce parts and tools from metal, plastic or other materials. CNC equipment is machinery that cuts, grinds, or drills into the material.



Operating CNC machines requires:

- Attention to detail
- Comfort with repetitive processes
- Ability to follow clear, objective instruction
- Excellent computer skills

## Why This Job?

1. There is a shortage of qualified CNC machinists in the manufacturing industry.
2. The strengths and skills required to be a successful CNC machinist are well-suited to the unique abilities of adults with autism.



## Who Is This Program For?
