Participants are required to take 4 units of coursework and actively participate in the orientations, lectures & field activities.

Kevin Mack is an Instructor of History at GCC. Kevin says "studying abroad changed my life". As a college student he spent a semester studying in Rome, immersing himself in Italian food, culture, and history. He returned home with a transformed outlook on the world and on himself, along with a new major (History). Besides Italy, his travels took him to Croatia, the Czech Republic, Egypt, France, Spain, and Tunisia. In each location, he took the greatest pleasure connecting that place with historical developments he had studied. We'll be doing much of the same in the HIST 101 course in Spain. History 101 covers foundational developments in the construction of Western European identity and culture: Hellenism and the Roman Empire, the Medieval Church and Renaissance, and the Reformation and rise of nation-states. In Spain, we will analyze these events with a special Iberian focus, immersing ourselves in these histories where they happened. 3 units transfer credit UC, CSU, USC
