PARKING

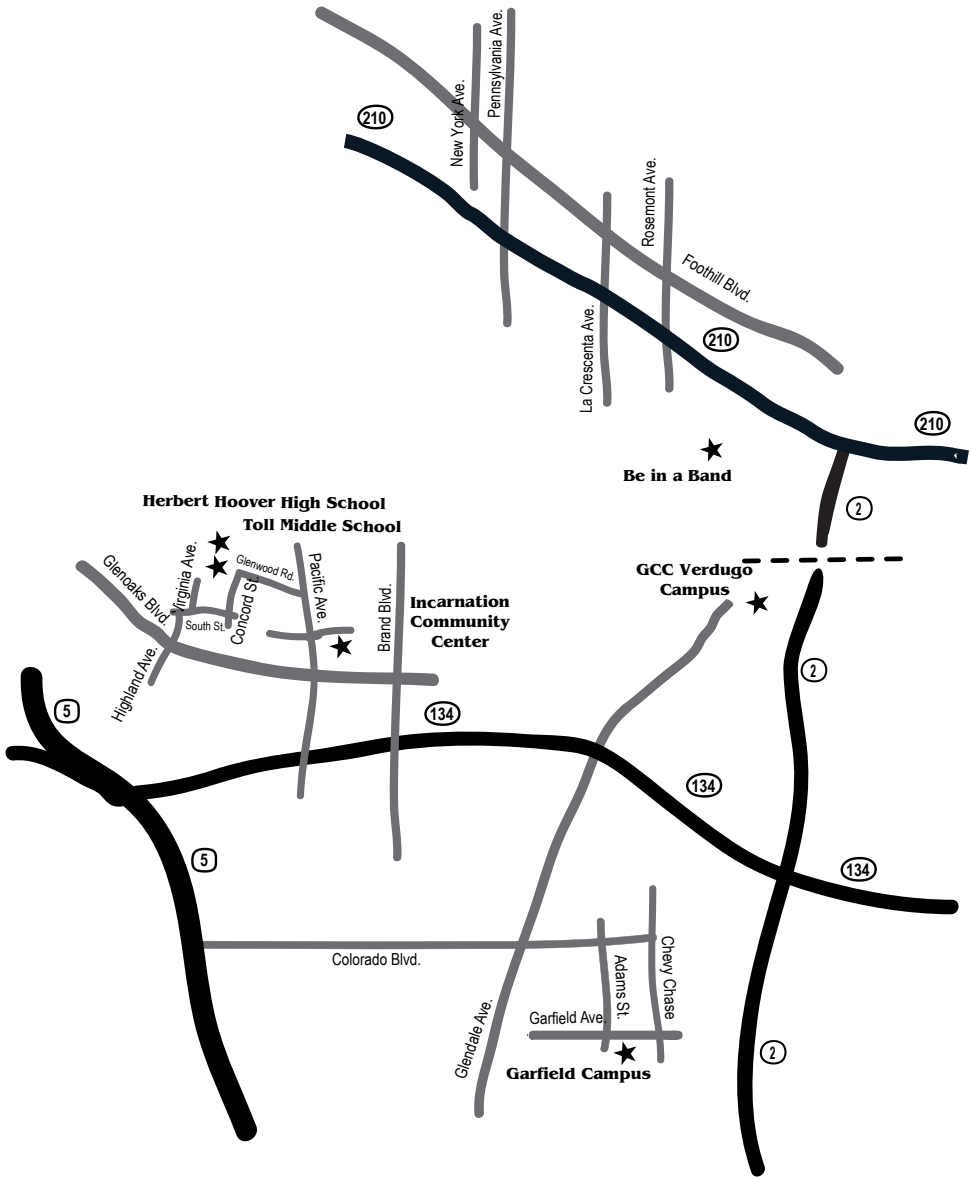
