Administrative Regulation

Off-Campus Student Organizations

When a student is involved in an off-campus offense, Glendale Community College Police Department (GCCPD) officers may assist with the investigation in cooperation with local, state, or federal law enforcement. GCCPD officers routinely work and communicate with campus officers on any serious incidents occurring on campus or in the immediate neighborhood and business areas surrounding college premises. Although the Glendale Police Department (GPD) has primary jurisdiction in all areas off campus, college police can and do respond to student-related incidents that occur in close proximity to college campuses. GCCPD officers have direct radio communications with the city police, fire department, and ambulance services to facilitate rapid response in any emergency.

Police officers from the GCCPD are duly sworn peace officers in the State of California, authorized by section 830.32(a) of the California Penal Code and section 72330 of the California Education Code to conduct enforcement. They possess the same authority and adhere to the same state-mandated standards as municipal and county police officers and deputies. Under California law, college officers' jurisdiction extends to any place in the State of California for the purposes of performing their duties. District peace officers concentrate their efforts on the District's campuses and the public areas that are adjacent to the campus properties.
