The Proposed Budget of Glendale Community College District for fiscal year 2019-2020 is being presented for a public hearing as required by the California Code of Regulations, Section 58191.

The total budget for the District includes eight separate self-balanced funds established to record income received and expenditures made for distinctly defined purposes. Statute or Board of Governors' regulations prohibit the co-mingling of these fiscal records; however, transfers among the fund budgets may be made by the Board of Trustees in accordance with provisions of applicable regulations.

The Board of Trustees reviewed multi-year expenditure trends of the college by type and comparison with colleges within Los Angeles County at its February 22, 2019 Special Board Meeting. Budget parameters for developing the 2019-2020 budget were discussed at this meeting. The Tentative Budget for 2019-2020 was discussed by the Board of Trustees at its June 18, 2019 meeting. At the June 28, 2019 Special Board Meeting, the Board of Trustees considered and discussed budget projections in relation to the 2019-2020 Tentative Budget and provided general direction on expenditure and reserve levels.

The proposed final budget represents a financial plan for the operating year based on the State's adopted budget. Modifications to the budget are brought to the Board for consideration and approval throughout the year to recognize changes in revenue and to allocate or reallocate resources to achieve program objectives.

The agenda for the September 10, 2019 board meeting will include the final action on the budget. A budget overview of the proposed 2019-2020 budget is provided under First Reading Report No. 1 and a detailed analysis of revenue and expenses for each fund are available by contacting Dr. Anthony Culpepper, Executive Vice President, Administrative Services.

#### DESCRIPTION OF HISTORY / BACKGROUND

Due to the State budget cuts that occurred in 2009-10, the college has been supporting its categorical programs. This year, the college budgeted \$610,307 in its Unrestricted General Fund (01) to backfill the State budget cuts within the Disabled Students Program & Services program (DSP&S). This transfer is necessary to maintain services and permanent staff in the DSP&S program.

GENERAL ACCOUNTING STANDARDS BOARD (GASB) 45

#### DESCRIPTION OF HISTORY / BACKGROUND

In addition to retirement pension support through CalPERS, CalSTRS, and Social Security contributions, Glendale Community College provides "other post-employment benefits" (OPEB) as part of the total compensation for its employees. At GCC those OPEBs include Early Retirement Health Benefits and Supplemental Medical Coverage. Presently there are 244 retired employees receiving these benefits at an approximate annual cost to the District of \$377,752. Prior to 2015, the cost of these benefits for retirees was financed annually and no provisions were in place to set-a-side money for required future payments.

Starting in 2015, the college developed a formula to provide a designated amount of funds annually to place in a restricted fund to help cover future costs of post-employment benefits. Biennially the college conducts an actuarial valuation of potential retiree benefit costs. The most recent valuation was identified as \$25.1 million of unfunded liability after the District total contributions of \$8,659,027 since its inception.

GASB 45 Funding Policy set aside, a minimum of \$50,000, 50% of all mandated cost reimbursement, excluding Health center, and an additional \$200,000 if Unrestricted Ending Balance is greater than 6% every fiscal year. The funding formula calls for the District to place \$454,114 in a Restricted General Fund reserve for the 2018-19 fiscal year. This resolution will make that transfer.

#### RETIREMENT INCENTIVE OFFER TO ELIGIBLE FOOD SERVICES EMPLOYEES

### GLENDALE COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT LOS ANGELES COUNTY, CALIFORNIA

**WHEREAS** it is determined to be in the best fiscal interest of the Glendale Community College District and its employees to provide a retirement incentive offer to eligible employees who wish to voluntarily exercise their option to separate from District Service;

**WHEREAS** there is no cash option available to employees in lieu of this retirement incentive offer;

**WHEREAS** Public Agency Retirement Services (PARS) has made available to the District a Supplementary Retirement Plan, a retirement incentive program supplementing PERS, and qualifying under the relevant sections of Section 403(b) of the Internal Revenue Code;

**WHEREAS** the District, pursuant to applicable policy and/or a collective bargaining agreement, desires to adopt the Supplementary Retirement Plan and to fund the incentive through nonelective employer contributions to the PARS designated 403(b) provider.

#### **NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:**

- 1. The Governing Board of Trustees of the District hereby adopts the PARS Supplementary Retirement Plan, as part of the District retirement program, effective August 20, 2019; and
- 2. The Governing Board of Trustees of the District hereby appoints the <u>Dr. Anthony Culpepper</u>, <u>Executive Vice President</u>, or his/her successor or his/her designee as the District's Plan Administrator; and
- 3. The District's PARS Plan Administrator is hereby authorized to execute the contracts, custodial agreement facilitating the payment of contributions to the 403(b) arrangement, and other legal documents related to a trust or the plan on behalf of the District and to take whatever additional actions are necessary to maintain the District's participation in the plan and to maintain compliance of any relevant regulations issued.

SUBJECT: ENROLLMENT UPDATE

#### DESCRIPTION OF HISTORY / BACKGROUND

California community colleges' apportionment revenues from the state are based on the enrollments of resident students. Enrollments are converted into Full-Time Equivalent Students (FTES) numbers for apportionment reporting. The attached report includes updated enrollment numbers and projections.

One FTES, whether credit or noncredit, is defined by state regulations as 525 hours of student contact. Most credit courses use a weekly accounting method: They meet the same number of hours every week, and apportionment is based on a calculation of hours per week times number of weeks divided by 525. Credit courses shorter than a full semester (such as 8-week courses, or Summer and Winter courses) use an analogous daily accounting method. Both weekly and daily courses use a census date to determine enrollments and FTES.

All noncredit courses and a small number of credit courses use positive attendance accounting, which is not based on enrollment and class sessions per week but rather on the actual hours that students attend class. Each student's attendance is tracked for every class session. The total number of attendance hours is divided by 525 to calculate FTES based on positive attendance. FTES based on positive attendance is more difficult to project than FTES based on weekly or daily accounting because students' actual attendance must be tracked every day, rather than using a defined census date.

#### PROHIBITION OF HARASSMENT

All forms of harassment are contrary to basic standards of conduct between individuals and are prohibited by state and federal law, as well as this policy, and will not be tolerated. The District is committed to providing an academic and work environment that respects the dignity of individuals and groups. The District shall be free of sexual harassment and all forms of sexual intimidation and exploitation including acts of sexual violence. It shall also be free of other unlawful harassment, including that which is based on any of the following statuses: race, religious creed, color, national origin, ancestry, physical disability, mental disability, medical condition, genetic information, marital status, sex, gender, gender identity, gender expression, age, or sexual orientation of any person, or because he or she is perceived to have one or more of the foregoing characteristics.

The District seeks to foster an environment in which all employees, students, unpaid interns and volunteers feel free to report incidents of harassment without fear of retaliation or reprisal. Therefore, the District also strictly prohibits retaliation against any individual for filing a complaint of harassment or for participating in a harassment investigation. Such conduct is illegal and constitutes a violation of this policy. All allegations of retaliation will be swiftly and thoroughly investigated. If the District determines that retaliation has occurred, it will take all reasonable steps within its power to stop such conduct. Individuals who engage in retaliatory conduct are subject to disciplinary action, up to and including termination or expulsion.

Any student, employee, unpaid intern or volunteer who believes that he or she has been harassed or retaliated against in violation of this policy should immediately report such incidents by following the procedures described in AR 3435 Discrimination and Harassment Investigations. Supervisors are mandated to report all incidents of harassment and retaliation that come to their attention.

This policy applies to all aspects of the academic environment, including but not limited to classroom conditions, grades, academic standing, employment opportunities, scholarships, recommendations, disciplinary actions, and participation in any community college activity. In addition, this policy applies to all terms and conditions of employment, including but not limited to hiring, placement, promotion, disciplinary action, layoff, recall, transfer, leave of absence, training opportunities and compensation.

To this end the Superintendent/President or designee shall ensure that the institution undertakes education and training activities to counter discrimination and to prevent,

minimize and/or eliminate any hostile environment that impairs access to equal education opportunity or impacts the terms and conditions of employment.

The Superintendent/President or designee shall establish administrative regulations that define harassment on campus. The Superintendent/President or designee shall further establish regulations for employees, students, unpaid interns, volunteers and other members of the campus community that provide for the investigation and resolution of complaints regarding harassment and discrimination, and procedures for students to resolve complaints of harassment and discrimination. All participants are protected from retaliatory acts by the District, its employees, students, and agents.

This policy and related written regulations (including the regulation for making complaints) shall be widely published and publicized to administrators, faculty, staff, students, unpaid interns and volunteers particularly when they are new to the institution, as required in Education Code 66281.5. They shall be available for students, employees, unpaid interns, and volunteers in all administrative offices, and shall be posted on the District's website.

Employees who violate the policy and regulations may be subject to disciplinary action up to and including termination. Students who violate this policy and related regulations may be subject to disciplinary measures up to and including expulsion. Unpaid interns who violate this policy and related procedures may be subject to disciplinary measures up to and including termination from the internship or other unpaid work experience program.

#### DESCRIPTION OF HISTORY / BACKGROUND

The proposed budget has been forwarded to the Board of Trustees under separate cover for study prior to this presentation and a public hearing was conducted at this meeting on August 20, 2019.

The total budget for the District includes eight separate self-balanced funds established to record income received and expenditures made for distinctly defined purposes. Statute or Board of Governors' regulations prohibit the comingling of these fiscal records; however, transfers among the fund budgets may be made by the Board of Trustees in accordance with provisions of applicable regulations.

The Board of Trustees reviewed multi-year expenditure trends of the college by type and comparison with colleges within Los Angeles County at its February 22, 2019 Special Board meeting. Budget parameters for developing the 2019-2020 budget were discussed at this meeting. The Tentative Budget for 2019-2020 was discussed by the Board of Trustees at its June 18, 2019 meeting. At the June 28, 2019 Special Board meeting, the Board of Trustees considered and discussed budget projections in relation to the 2019-2020 Tentative Budget and provided general direction on expenditure and reserve levels.

The Final Budget represents a financial plan for the operating year based on the State's Budget. After the Final Budget is adopted by the College's Board of Trustees, modifications will be brought to the Board of Trustees for consideration and approval throughout the year to recognize changes in revenue and to allocate or reallocate resources to achieve program objectives.

An overview of the 2019-2020 Final Budget is attached. Any questions, comments or concerns pertaining to the 2019-2020 Final Budget should be directed to Dr. Anthony Culpepper, Executive Vice President, Administrative Services.

#### STUDY SESSIONS

- 1. Fiscal Health and Sustainability
  - Five Year Budget Projections

Dr. Anthony Culpepper outlined the Student-Centered Funding Formula impact simulation as it relates to GCCD presently and into the 2019-2020 fiscal year.

Dr. Culpepper highlighted GCC's fiscal outlook from a 2018-2019 forecast through a 2023-2024 projection to include apportionment allocations, Hold Harmless projections, and district-wide distribution of funding sources under the Student-Centered Focus Funding Formula (SCFF Model). In presenting the Five-Year Projections, Dr. Culpepper addressed revenue projections (base revenues and anticipated COLA), base augmentation, and regular growth, various raise scenarios, expenditures projections, and the compliance surplus/deficit projections.

Collecting Tuition and Fees Receivable

During an outline regarding collecting tuition and fees receivable, Dr. Culpepper explained the current Administrative Regulations (AR 5032) and Board Policy (BP 5035) related to payment procedures and withholding student records due to failure to resolve financial obligations with the College. He also provided details to the Board on unpaid student account receivables, student receivables write-offs, and consideration in utilizing a collection agency to help collect the receivables.

Also presented was information on cash flow issues and potential use of Tax and Revenue Anticipation Notes (TRAN) issuance should there be a need if cash flow was insufficient to cover expenses.

#### Fiscal Health and Sustainability - continued

#### Contracting Out Food Services

Dr. Culpepper provided information to the Board on food services at Glendale Community College District over the past 10 years. The Board discussed issues in relation to food services and considerations going forward.

#### 2. Student-Centered Funding Formula and Impact on GCC

Dr. Michael Ritterbrown and Dr. Paul Schlossman presented current trends in base allocation, supplemental allocation, and student success allocation as it relates to the Student-Centered Funding Formula. Discussion regarding student access, outreach services, admissions and records access, the GCCPromise and financial aid were outlined. Student success support measures were presented. The Board inquired about reaching out to area (and beyond local) high schools, online course development and continuing to promote dual/concurrent enrollment.

#### 3. Collaboration with Glendale Unified School District

Dr. Viar emphasized how GCCD will continue its collaboration with the Glendale Unified School District by building relations with new Superintendent Vivian Ekchian and increasing communications with high school campus principals and counselors.

#### **RECESS**

At 12:03 p.m., Dr. Peroomian announced a recess. The Board of Trustees reconvened at 12:17 p.m.

#### 4. Board Evaluation

Dr. Viar provided insight regarding the Board focus areas and felt the Board and Superintendent/President collaborated well and were working towards a common goal for the betterment of the college district, students and community as a whole. Board members suggested striving to broaden outreach efforts within the community for greater support for the college.

#### 5. Board and Superintendent/President Focus Areas for 2019-2020

#### **Board of Trustees**

The Board reviewed the 2018-2019 Board Focus Areas and Outcome Measures. Board members discussed some changes and additions to the focus areas.

#### Superintendent/President

The Board discussed the Superintendent/President's potential focus areas for 2019-20. It was agreed the major areas of student success outcomes, the new state funding formula, leadership development, faculty/management/staff diversity, increased relations with Glendale Unified School District, and area high school principal/counselor connections, and oversight of GCCD facilities development were appropriate.

It was agreed the suggestions made for the Board and Superintendent/President focus areas would be presented at the August 20<sup>th</sup> board meeting for action.

## 6. Board Policies Chapter 6: Business and Fiscal Affairs

The Board considered Chapter 6 Board Policies and recommendations of the Superintendent/President and agreed with the suggestions made based on the board criteria for review of policies. #### DESCRIPTION OF HISTORY / BACKGROUND\*

Glendale Community College is projected to face an increased enrollment of students and supporting faculty in the next decade in the science areas. Assessment of existing space for the sciences showed a need to replace insufficiently sized and outdated space in the San Gabriel, Arroyo Seco, and Camino Real Buildings and to provide additional space to address student demand for classes that has led to long wait lists.

For the past 1 ½ years, representatives of HMC Architects and Gafcon Construction Managers have been working with GCC science faculty and staff and GCC administrators in the planning and programming of a new Science Center based on a projected budget of \$110 million from Measure GC facilities bond proceeds.

The plans call for a new five stories Science Center to be located at the Northwest corner of the Verdugo Campus. It would be approximately 97,000 gross square feet (GSF) and consist of:

- 31 science classrooms/labs for earth science, biology, chemistry, and physics,
- · dedicated laboratory support spaces,
- 3,000 SF science student resource center with flexible space for studying, collaboration, and tutoring,
- 100 seat stepped lecture hall,
- 30 faculty offices and 2 department offices,
- student collaboration spaces in a variety of forms and sizes throughout all five levels, and
- open lounge spaces for student activity and social interaction and collaborative learning inside and outside the building.

Given the technical requirements of labs, science buildings typically have a lower efficiency percentage than other facilities. With a total of 60,145 assignable square footage (ASF) and 93,600 GSF, the schematic design is at 64% efficiency. This is on target for science buildings and is a significant accomplishment in design considering the site challenges the project faces, including a 36 feet grade difference across the length of the site.

During the planning and programming process, the Board of Trustees has received information reports and provided comments at its meetings on May 15, 2018, August 2, 2018, and May 21, 2019.

HMC Architects and the design team have completed the schematic design phase that is reflected in the 177-page design package available for review in the Superintendent/President's Office or on-line at <a href="http://www-01.glendale.edu/BOT/2019">http://www-01.glendale.edu/BOT/2019</a> GCCD Science Building Schematic Design.pdf. The schematic design includes the programming matrix; site conditions; massing; floor plans; sustainability; elevations and sections; exterior and interior materials; landscaping; lab planning; structural, electrical, and mechanical components, and code compliance analysis.

The schematic design outlines a schedule that includes:

- design development (August December 2019),
- cost estimate update (December 2019),
- construction documents (January 2020 June 2020),
- cost estimate update (June 2020),
- Department of State Architects review and approval (June 2020 -December 2020),
- construction bid awarded (January 2021), and
- construction (January 2021 January 2023).

#### DESCRIPTION OF HISTORY / BACKGROUND

In August 1993, the City of Glendale and Glendale Community College District entered into a Joint Powers Agreement creating the Glendale Parking Facilities Joint Powers Authority ("JPA") pursuant to Government Code Section 6500 *et seq.* The purpose of the JPA was to provide for the financing of part or all of the costs of the purchase, construction, expansion, improvement and rehabilitation of parking facilities and the operation of those facilities for the use and benefit of the City and District. Upon establishment of the JPA, \$6,160,000 of revenue bonds were issued at an interest of 5.875%.

The revenue from the bonds was used for the construction of the college parking lot, elevator installation, and upgrade and installation of parking meters.

On April 1, 2014 all bonds issued under the JPA and the interest thereon were paid off in full. Under the terms of the JPA, the agreement ended upon payment in full of all bonds issued under the JPA. However, since the termination date of the JPA, the City and District have continued to operate under the terms of the JPA. This has included sharing of the revenue and expenses from parking at the facilities included under the JPA.

Over the last several months meetings between the City and GCC have occurred in order to draft an official replacement agreement. Approval of the replacement agreement by the City Council and Glendale Community College District Board of Trustees will result in the termination of the JPA and the JPA reserve balance of approximately \$3,708,088 will be distributed evenly between the City and District as provided in the JPA agreements.

Highlights of the proposed agreement include:

- The City and District will continue to own separately their respective parking facilities.
- Parking facilities included within the agreement include City-owned Lots 30, 31, 32, 33, 34, and Civic Auditorium structure (total of 1,381 spaces) and all College-owned lots and structure on the Verdugo Campus (total of 1,791 spaces).
- The City and District will continue to share the use of these parking facilities and the adjusted revenue from the parking operations.
- The adjusted revenue is determined following deduction of approved maintenance and operating expenses for the respective parking facilities.
- Parking rates for these identified facilities and properties will be set jointly.
- The term of the agreement is for five years and will extend automatically for up to three additional five-year periods unless written notice is provided within 18 months before the end of the current term.
- During the term of the agreement, the District has the right to purchase any of the City parking facilities included in the agreement if a decision is made by the City to sell designated property included in the agreement.

#### **RECITALS**

- A. Whereas, on or about August 8, 1993, CITY and GCC entered into a Joint Powers Agreement creating the Glendale Parking Facilities Joint Powers Authority ("JPA") pursuant to Government Code Section 6500 *et seq.*, to provide for the operation and financing of part or all of the costs of the purchase, construction, expansion, improvement and rehabilitation of parking facilities for the use and benefit of CITY and GCC; and
- B. Whereas, on April 1, 2014, all bonds issued under the JPA and the interest thereon were paid off in full, and the JPA provided for its termination upon payment in full of all bonds issued under the JPA; and
- C. Whereas, since the termination date of the JPA, both PARTIES have continued to operate under the terms of the JPA; and
- D. Whereas, the reserve balance of the JPA contains approximately \$3,708,088, as of June 30, 2018, of which the PARTIES desire to distribute evenly; as provided for in JPA Attachment A, Item 12, dated December 17, 1992 and Section 7.02 of the JPA Agreement, dated April 8, 1993.
- E. Whereas, CITY and GCC desire to continue to jointly operate and manage CITY Parking Facilities and GCC Parking Facilities, to allow the shared use of said parking facilities and to share revenue from the parking operations by the adoption of a new parking agreement, which shall supersede all prior representations, negotiations, agreements or understandings whether written or oral; and
- F. Whereas, CITY desires to continue to own CITY's Parking Facilities and GCC desires to continue to own GCC's Parking Facilities, while jointly setting parking rates for all Parking Facilities.

#### **AGREEMENT**

#### NOW THEREFORE, THE PARTIES AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

#### 1. INCORPORATION OF RECITALS

The Recitals constitute the factual basis upon which CITY and GCC have entered into this Agreement. CITY and GCC acknowledge the Recitals' accuracy and, therefore, incorporate them into this Agreement.

#### 2. **DEFINITIONS**

Unless the context otherwise requires, the words and terms defined in this Section shall, for the purposes hereof, have the meanings herein specified.

- a. "Adjusted Parking Revenue" means all Parking Revenue, less Approved Maintenance and Operating Expenses and Obligations.
- b. "Agreement" means this Glendale Parking Facilities Agreement, including any Amendments thereto.
- c. "Approved Maintenance and Operating Expenses and Obligations" means those expenses and obligations that are approved by the PARTIES through the process set forth in Section 7.02 of this Agreement.
- d. "CITY Parking Facilities" shall mean those certain parking facilities owned by CITY, more particularly described on Exhibit A to this Agreement, which is incorporated herein by this reference.
- e. "CITY Adjusted Parking Revenue" means all Parking Revenue generated from CITY's Parking Facilities, identified in Exhibit A, less Approved Maintenance and Operating Expenses and Obligations.
- f. "Daily Passes" shall mean the daily rate parking passes issued by GCC at GCC Parking Facilities.
- g. "Fiscal Year" shall mean the fiscal year beginning on July 1 and ending on June 30.
- h. "GCC Parking Facilities" mean those certain parking facilities owned by GCC, more particularly described on Exhibit B to this Agreement, incorporated herein by reference.
- i. "GCC Adjusted Parking Revenue" means all Parking Revenue generated from the GCC Parking Facilities, including Daily Passes and Semester Student Parking Permits, identified in Exhibit B, less Approved Maintenance and Operating Expenses and Obligations.
- j. "Hours of Operation" shall mean the hours of operation of each Parking Facility, as established in Section 7.02 of this Agreement and as posted in each Parking Facility.

- k. "Parking Facilities" means CITY and GCC Parking Facilities, collectively.
- I. "Parking Revenue" means all gross parking operations revenue received from operation of GCC Parking Facilities, including Daily Passes and Semester Student Parking Permits, and all gross meter revenue from CITY's Parking Facilities. Revenue obtained from citations and fines from enforcement of the Parking Facilities shall not be subject to the Parking Revenue.
- m. "Permittees" shall mean those persons purchasing a permit from either PARTY, to park in the Parking Facilities.
- n. "Semester Parking Permit" means the semester parking permits issued by GCC, for use at Parking Facilities.

#### 3. SETTLEMENT OF POST JPA TERMINATION REVENUE

An accounting of the JPA Parking Revenue and expenditures for the period of April 30, 2014 to June 30, 2018 will be prepared pursuant to the method of calculation for revenue and expenditures as set forth in Section 6.03 of the JPA Agreement dated April 8, 1993, Items 19, 20, and 21 of Attachment A to the JPA Agreement dated April 8, 1993, and Sections 3 through 8 of the Second Amendment to the JPA Agreement dated August 1, 2003, as calculated through April 30, 2014. The total funds balance as of June 30, 2018, approximately \$3,709,088.00, as set forth and attached hereto as Exhibit C, will be split between the PARTIES on a 50-50 basis. Upon execution of this Agreement, the Parties will perform an audit for the period of April 30, 2014 through June 30, 2018. Should the audit require an adjustment of the total funds balance of June 30, 2018, said adjustment will be made on the next quarterly settlement as outlined in Section 6.

For JPA Parking Revenue and expenditures for the period of July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019, an accounting will be prepared pursuant to the method of calculation for revenue and expenditures as set forth in Section 6.03 of the JPA Agreement dated April 8, 1993, Items 19, 20, and 21 of Attachment A to the JPA Agreement dated April 8, 1993, and Sections 3 through 8 of the Second Amendment to the JPA Agreement dated August 1, 2003 and distributed accordingly. Upon execution of this Agreement, the Parties will perform an audit for the period of July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019. Should the audit require an adjustment of the total funds balance of June 30, 2019, said adjustment will be made on the next quarterly settlement as outlined in Section 6.

For JPA Parking Revenue and expenditures for the period of July 1, 2019 through the Effective Date of this Agreement, an accounting will be prepared pursuant to the method of calculation for revenue and expenditures as set forth in Section 6 of this Agreement.

#### 4. TERM

This Agreement shall begin on the Effective Date and will be for 5 years (the "Initial Term"), unless this Agreement ends sooner according to the terms of this Agreement. The Initial Term will extend automatically for no more than three (3) additional 5 year periods. If any PARTY chooses not to extend the Agreement, it must provide written notice to the other PARTY within 18 months before the end of the current term.

#### 5. COVENANTS & RESPONSIBILITIES OF PARTIES

- 5.01 <u>Covenants by CITY.</u> CITY covenants with GCC, that as to the CITY Parking Facilities, it shall:
  - (a) establish and collect parking meter revenues at such times and in such manner as may be applicable to other parking meters managed by the CITY;
  - (b) properly post metered parking areas to indicate the times during which metering will be enforced;
  - (c) enforce metered parking and time zones as needed through citations and assessment and collection of fines;
  - (d) segregate parking meter revenues collected from the CITY Parking Facilities from its other general parking meter revenues;
  - (f) permit the use of the Civic Auditorium Parking Structure on a non-exclusive basis, for use by Permittees, during any period when no events are in progress at the Civic Auditorium Facilities; it being understood that:
    - (1) it shall be the obligation of Permittees to determine those periods during which Permittees shall be authorized to use the Civic Auditorium Parking Structure, and GCC and the CITY specifically agree that Permittees violating the terms of this provision shall be subject to citation and fine for the benefit of the CITY; and
    - during the Hours of Operation, Lot 31 and the Civic Auditorium Parking Structure shall be reserved for Permittees, except when used for Civic Auditorium events; unless otherwise mutually agreed to by the CITY and GCC;
    - (3) CITY shall notify GCC in advance of events scheduled for the Civic Auditorium during the Hours of Operation, and shall use its best efforts to determine and identify which parking areas will be affected

- by the events; it being understood and agreed that CITY shall provide full access to the remaining parking areas for use by Permittees;
- (4) when the Civic Auditorium has an event scheduled and noticed as provided in paragraph (3) above, CITY may collect and retain all fees and revenues therefrom, including, but not limited to, parking citations, for that event; and
- (g) operate and maintain at its expense its CITY Parking Facilities in a manner consistent with the operation and maintenance of its other owned parking facilities, and to perform all maintenance, improvements, repairs and striping, as well as the repair and replacement of all meters presently located on the CITY Parking Facilities.
- 5.02 <u>Covenants by GCC</u>. GCC covenants with CITY, that as to the GCC Parking Facilities, it shall:
  - (a) levy and collect Semester Student Parking Permit Fees [and Daily Pass Fees] in the manner set forth in the Agreement;
  - (b) properly post in the GCC Parking Facilities the Hours of Operation during which parking for Permittees will be enforced;
  - (c) enforce Semester Student Parking Permits [and Daily Passes] and time zones as needed through citations and assessment and collection of fines;
  - (d) segregate Semester Student Parking Permit Fees [and Daily Pass Fees] from its other general parking revenues;
  - (f) to operate and maintain at its expense the GCC Parking Facilities in a manner consistent with the operation and maintenance of other parking facilities owned by the GCC, and to perform all maintenance, improvements, repairs and striping, as well as the repair and replacement of all meters presently located on the GCC Parking Facilities;
  - (g) establish and collect parking meter revenues at such times and in such manner as is consistent with industry standards in Los Angeles County. GCC may subcontract this service to the CITY or any other person or entity. Should GCC continue to have CITY collect and maintain parking meters on GCC Parking Facilities, CITY shall be reimbursed by GCC for all associated costs at a rate to be determined and agreed upon by the PARTIES.

#### 6. PARKING REVENUE

- 6.01 <u>Payment</u>. Adjusted Parking Revenue payments due under this Agreement are due on a quarterly basis. Payments are due within sixty (60) calendar days of the end of each quarter.
- 6.02 Revenue Sharing. CITY and GCC shall share Parking Revenue as follows:
  - (a) CITY shall be entitled to 50% of GCC's Adjusted Parking Revenue. Payments made by GCC to CITY pursuant to this Agreement must be accompanied by an accounting showing the following for the applicable Fiscal Year: (1) total Parking Revenue generated at GCC Parking Facilities; (2) quarterly payments made to CITY pursuant to this Agreement; and (3) Approved Maintenance and Operating Expenses and Obligations generated for the applicable Fiscal Year. Such accountings shall include detail reasonably sufficient to allow CITY to confirm GCC's calculation and composition of the CITY's share of GCC Adjusted Parking Revenue.
  - (b) GCC shall be entitled to 50% of CITY Adjusted Parking Revenue. Payments made by CITY to GCC pursuant to this Agreement must be accompanied by an accounting showing the following for the applicable Fiscal Year: (1) total Parking Revenue generated at CITY Parking Facilities; (2) quarterly payments made to GCC pursuant to this Agreement; and (3) Approved Maintenance and Operating Expenses and Obligations generated for the applicable Fiscal Year. Such accountings shall include detail reasonably sufficient to allow GCC to confirm CITY's calculation and composition of GCC's share of CITY Adjusted Parking Revenue.
- 6.03 <u>Late Payments</u>. If either PARTY fails to pay its share of the Adjusted Parking Revenue for the applicable quarter by the 60th calendar day after the end each quarter, said PARTY will be responsible for interest on the unpaid amount owed.

Interest for late payments will accrue at the rate of one-half of one percent (.005%) per month or fraction thereof on the amount owed from the date on which the payment first became late until paid. .

#### 7. ADMINISTRATION

- 7.01. The Agreement will be administered by two (2) representatives from each PARTY, which shall include the City of Glendale City Manager or his/her designee(s) and GCC Executive Vice President and his/her designee(s), for a total of four (4) persons.
- 7.02. The representatives designated in Paragraph 7.01 shall be responsible for the following:

- (1) Establishing the amounts to be charged for Daily Passes, Semester Student Parking Permit Fees and parking meter fees for the CITY Parking Facilities.
- (2) Establishing Hours of Operation and parking policies and rates.
- (3) Approving joint maintenance and operating expenses.

Any action taken pursuant to this section will proceed only with a majority vote of the four (4) representatives designated in Section 7.01.

## 8. PROPERTY AND PROPERTY OWNERSHIP

- 8.01. The PARTIES agree that notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this Agreement, CITY retains ownership of the CITY's Parking Facilities and GCC retains ownership of the GCC's Parking Facilities.
- 8.02. The PARTIES agree that notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this Agreement, each PARTY retains the right, in its sole discretion, to convey, sell, dispose of, improve, alter or alienate its Parking Facilities, or any portion thereof, and any rights in and to that PARTY's real and personal property where its Parking Facilities are located, upon 18 months written notice to the other PARTY.
- 8.03. Either PARTY may, at any time upon 24 hour written notice to the other PARTY, and only on a temporary basis, remove up to ten percent (10%) of its Parking Facilities from the scope of the shared use.
- 8.04. Upon a PARTY's notice of intent to remove specified Parking Facilities from the scope of the Agreement, the PARTY may thereafter exclusively use, manage, and retain revenues for such Parking Facilities or designated portion thereof and shall cease to operate the designated Parking Facilities or portions thereof pursuant to this Agreement. Unless otherwise agreed to by the PARTIES, the PARTIES shall continue to jointly manage any remaining Parking Facilities. The Adjusted Parking Revenue payable to the PARTY that has removed its Parking Asset(s) from the scope of the shared use shall be reduced commensurate with the reduction in the number of spaces that have been taken out of the scope of the shared use.
- 8.05. <u>Emergency Use of Property</u>. CITY reserves the right to enter, use, occupy, and operate the PARKING FACILITIES at any time for any one or more of the following reasons:
  - (1) For an emergency or catastrophe;
  - (2) To protect or preserve:
    - a) Life or property; or
    - b) The public's health, safety, welfare, or peace; or
  - (3) As public necessity may reasonably require.

- 8.06. Condemnation. If a public agency— other than CITY— condemns, or by eminent domain takes, any of the Parking Facilities, in whole or in part, for a public purpose that substantially impairs the use of any of the Parking Facilities, then unless otherwise agreed to by the PARTIES, the PARTIES shall continue to jointly manage any remaining Parking Facilities under the terms of this Agreement. The Adjusted Parking Revenue shall be reduced commensurate with the reduction in the number of spaces that have been taken out of the scope of the shared use. Each PARTY has the exclusive right to receive the entire condemnation award for the land; and the buildings, structures, improvements, equipment, machinery, and fixtures that it solely built or placed on each's respective Parking Facility. This Agreement does not give any rights to third parties for compensation or damages from CITY or GCC under federal eminent domain law, California eminent domain law, or both.
- 8.07 <u>Damage or Destruction to Parking Facilities</u> If any of the Parking Facilities property become damaged or destroyed— whether partially, totally, temporarily, or otherwise— during this Agreement's initial term or, as applicable, renewal term(s), so as to seriously interfere with the intended use of parking, either PARTY must provide immediate written notice to the other PARTY. Unless otherwise agreed to by the PARTIES, the PARTIES shall continue to jointly manage any remaining Parking Facilities pursuant to the terms of this Agreement. The Adjusted Parking Revenue shall be reduced commensurate with the reduction in the number of spaces that have been taken out of the scope of the shared use.

#### 9. DEFAULT AND REMEDIES

The PARTIES shall follow the process and procedures below for non-performance or unsatisfactory performance of this Agreement:

- 9.1 If a PARTY determines that the other PARTY has not performed, or has unsatisfactorily performed, a condition, obligation, or provision of this Agreement, the aggrieved PARTY shall give the other PARTY written notice that:
  - (1) describes the violation of the Agreement or the problem with the other PARTY's performance;
  - (2) to the extent reasonably possible, states one or more reasonable corrective measures, or a particular reasonable manner of correction; and
  - (3) specifies a reasonable time period within which the other PARTY must correct the violation or problem. At its discretion, the aggrieved PARTY may extend the time in which the other PARTY must correct the violation or problem.
- 9.2 The other PARTY shall correct the violation or problem within a reasonable time period specified in the notice (or within any extension of time granted), and in a reasonable manner agreed upon by the PARTIES.

- 9.3 After the aggrieved PARTY has given the other PARTY reasonable written notice, and after a reasonable time (or any extension of time) to correct the violation or problem has passed without satisfactory correction or resolution in the aggrieved PARTY's determination, the aggrieved PARTY may take any one or more of the following actions:
  - (1) immediately suspend this Agreement until such time as the other PARTY has corrected the violation or problem;
  - (2) terminate this Agreement pursuant to Section 14.02; or
  - pursue any available, lawful right, remedy, or action following the dispute resolution procedures set forth in Section 11.

## 10. FORCE MAJEURE

If an event or condition constituting a "force majeure"— including an act of God, labor dispute, civil unrest, epidemic, natural disaster — prevents or delays a PARTY from performing or fulfilling an obligation under this Agreement, the PARTY is not in Default, under Paragraph 9 of this Agreement. A delay beyond a PARTY's control automatically extends the time, in an amount equal to the period of the delay, for the PARTY to perform the obligation under this Agreement. The PARTIES must prepare and sign an appropriate document acknowledging any extension of time under this Paragraph.

## 11. DISPUTE RESOLUTION

In the event of a dispute between the PARTIES pertaining to the rights and obligations created by this Agreement, CITY and GCC promise and agree that, as a condition precedent to their respective right to commence a legal action against the other relating to this Agreement:

- 11.01 Either PARTY shall be obligated to commence mediation by providing to Judicial Arbitration and Mediation Services, Inc. ("JAMS") and the other PARTY a written request for mediation, setting forth the subject of the dispute and the relief requested.
- 11.02 The PARTIES will cooperate with JAMS and with one another in selecting a mediator from the JAMS panel of neutrals and in scheduling the mediation proceedings. The PARTIES agree that they will participate in the mediation in good faith and that they will share equally in its costs.
- 11.03 All offers, promises, conduct and statements, whether oral or written, made in the course of the mediation by any of the PARTIES, their agents, employees, experts and attorneys, and by the mediator or any JAMS employees, are confidential, privileged and inadmissible for any purpose, including impeachment, in any arbitration or other proceeding involving the PARTIES, provided that evidence that is otherwise admissible or discoverable shall not be rendered inadmissible or non-discoverable as a result of its use in the mediation.

- 11.04 Either PARTY may initiate an action in a court of competent jurisdiction with respect to the matters submitted to mediation by filing an action at any time following the initial mediation session unless the other PARTY has failed or refused to cooperate with regard to the mediation obligations described above. In that case, the PARTY seeking to engage in mediation may commence an action forty-five (45) calendar days following the initial request for mediation.
- 11.05 At no time prior to the dates described in Section 11.04, *supra*, shall either side initiate an action related to this Agreement except to pursue a provisional remedy that is authorized by law or by JAMS Rules or by agreement of the PARTIES. However, this limitation is inapplicable to a PARTY if the other PARTY refuses to comply with the requirements of Section 11.04 *supra*.
- 11.06 All applicable statutes of limitation and defenses based upon the passage of time shall be tolled for a period of forty-five (45) calendar days after the request for mediation. The PARTIES will take such action, if any, required to effectuate such tolling.

## 12. INSURANCE

CITY and GCC certify that each is self-insured for general liability, automobile liability, and workers' compensation liability. Each entity warrants that the limits of its self-insurance coverage meet or exceed the requirements and obligations as set forth, and to the extent permitted, by State law.

### 13. INDEMNITY

CITY agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless GCC, its officers, agents, and employees from and against any and all liability, claims, suits, proceedings, judgments, liens, losses, damages, injuries, costs, or expenses which arise from or are caused by the CITY's performance of this Agreement, except for those injuries, losses, or damages arising from or caused by the sole negligence of, or a dangerous condition created by, GCC, its officers, agents, and employees.

GCC agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless CITY, its officers, agents, and employees from and against any and all liability, claims, suits, proceedings, judgments, liens, losses, damages, injuries, costs, or expenses which arise from or are caused by the GCC's performance of this Agreement, except for those injuries, losses, or damages arising from or caused by the sole negligence of, or a dangerous condition created by, CITY, its officers, agents, and employees.

## 14. TERMINATION

- 14.01 <u>Termination for Convenience.</u> The PARTIES may elect to terminate this Agreement for any reason, at any time upon 18 months prior written notice.
- 14.02 <u>Termination for Default.</u> Either PARTY may terminate this Agreement upon default by the other PARTY, which default remained uncured 60 calendar days after written notice thereof.

#### 15. RIGHT OF FIRST REFUSAL AGREEMENT

- 15.01 Right of First Refusal. CITY shall not sell any CITY Parking Facilities identified in Exhibit "A" except in accordance with the provisions of this Agreement. Any such sale of a CITY Parking Facility (Subject Property) shall be pursuant to a bona fide written offer (Offer) from an independent third party that is not directly or indirectly owned or controlled by or under common control by GCC and that intends to purchase one or more of CITY Parking Facilities for its own account ("Qualified Purchaser"), setting forth the terms and conditions for such proposed price.
  - (1) If at any time during this Agreement, CITY receives an Offer that CITY is willing to accept, CITY shall give GCC a copy of the Offer and certify to GCC that the proposed purchaser is a Qualified Purchaser (Offer Notice). The Offer Notice shall set shall clearly set forth the material terms for any proposed sale or other transfer by CITY, including the proposed sales price (the "Purchase Price"), whether such sale or other transfer shall be on an "all cash" or other basis, the proposed closing date for such sale or transfer (which shall not be earlier than ninety (90) days from the date of the Offer Notice), the condition of title for the conveyance of CITY's Fee Interest, the amount of any good faith deposit that shall be required (which shall not exceed, in any event, five percent (5%) of the Purchase Price) and any other material contingencies, conditions to, or requirements for closing.
  - (2) GCC shall have 30 days from the delivery of the Officer Notice (Acceptance Period) within which to notify CITY of its election to purchase the Subject Property by giving written notice to CITY (Acceptance Notice) of such election.
  - (3) On delivery of the Acceptance Notice, CITY and GCC shall forthwith proceed to consummate the sale and purchase of the Subject Property on the terms and conditions set forth in the Offer. Such right and option of GCC shall be exercisable only by the Acceptance Notice timely delivered to CITY signed by GCC.
  - (4) If the Acceptance Notice is not given in a timely manner or GCC does not elect to purchase the Subject Property, then CITY shall be free for the period of twenty four (24) months following the expiration of the Acceptance Period (the "ROFR Contract Period") to sell the Subject Property to the Qualified Purchaser at not

less than ninety-five percent (95%) of the Purchase Price and on terms and conditions that are generally not more favorable to the Qualified Purchaser than the terms set forth in the Offer Notice; provided, that at or before the closing on such sale CITY shall furnish GCC a copy (certified as true, correct and complete by CITY) of the executed purchase and sale agreement between CITY and the Qualified Purchaser for purchase of the Subject Property showing and confirming that such sale or other transfer to the Qualified Purchaser is on such terms. If the sale or other transfer by CITY to the Qualified Purchaser on such terms is not consummated within the ROFR Contract Period, the Subject Property may not be sold unless again first offered for sale to GCC pursuant to Section 15.01, subsection (1).

- (5) The Right of First Refusal set forth in this Section shall not be applicable to sales or transfers of any of CITY's Parking Facilities on account of transfers by operation of law and involuntary transfers.
- (6) The Right of First Refusal set forth in this section may not be assigned or transferred by GCC.
- (7) The Right of First Refusal shall terminate on June 30, 2024, however; if the term of the Agreement is extended then the termination date will be extended to match the termination date of the Agreement.
- 15.02 <u>Further Closing Conditions</u>. Any sale by CITY and purchase by GCC arising out of the provisions of Section 15.01 will be subject to the following provisions:
  - (1) The closing shall occur at the office of GCC's title insurance company and shall be conducted through a title company escrow at which neither CITY nor GCC need be present;
  - (2) All real property recordation and transfer taxes shall be borne by CITY and GCC in equal shares and all other recording fees and charges, if any, shall be paid by GCC;
  - (3) CITY shall deliver a grant deed, executed by CITY in form for recording so as to convey title, together with such evidence as GCC or GCC's title insurance company may reasonably require regarding the power and authority of CITY to convey the Subject Property, and of the individual executing the deed to execute and deliver such instrument and all other documents and agreements necessary to consummate the transfer;
  - (4) The Subject Property shall be sold in its "as is" condition without recourse, representation or warranty;
  - (5) The Subject Property shall be sold subject only to (A) Permitted Encumbrances and such other matters of record created by CITY at GCC's request or with GCC's approval, (B) any title matters caused by or through GCC or any party

claiming by, through or under GCC, (C) any liens for taxes and assessments that are not yet due and payable recognizing that GCC remains responsible for all such taxes and assessments under this Agreement for periods on or before the closing, (D) any other title encumbrances or matters that have been consented to in writing by GCC, and (E); provided, however, that any conveyance of the Subject Property shall be made free and clear of all mortgages and all other liens, encumbrances and other title matters created by CITY and/or arising from CITY's acts;

- (6) If CITY fails to perform its obligations hereunder to make full settlement in accordance with the terms hereof, GCC's sole and exclusive remedy shall be either (i) an action for specific performance or (ii) at its option, GCC shall be entitled to terminate its purchase and receive full refund of the Deposit.
- (7) All of GCC's obligations, duties and covenants under this Agreement shall remain in full force and effect through the date of closing, notwithstanding the exercise by GCC of any of its rights under this Agreement to acquire the Subject Property.
- (8) GCC shall pay any title insurance premiums or charges for GCC's owner's title insurance policy, if any;
- (9) Assignment of licenses, permits and warranties related to the the Subject Property, if any, shall be given by CITY at the closing, transferring CITY's interest, if any, in any licenses, permits and warranties that relate to the the Subject Property, and that are transferable, without recourse, representation or warranty;
- (10) At closing, GCC and CITY each shall provide the necessary information for, and execute and deliver, all required transfer tax forms in connection with the conveyance of the Subject Property, and the recordation of the deed contemplated hereunder;
- (11) CITY and GCC each represents and warrants to the other that it has not dealt with any broker in connection with the granting of the options set forth in Section 15, and CITY and GCC each shall indemnify the other Party for any claims by brokers claiming to have dealt with such Party in connection with the granting of such options and the closing of Option Transfer;
- (12) At the closing, at GCC's option (i) CITY shall assign to GCC or its designee all its rights, title and interest in and to this Agreement pursuant to an assignment and assumption agreement in recordable form and in form otherwise reasonably satisfactory to CITY and GCC or (ii) a termination of this Agreement (and any memorandum thereof) in recordable form and in form otherwise reasonably satisfactory to CITY and GCC;

- (13) CITY and GCC each shall execute and deliver such other documents as shall be necessary to give effect to the transfer or as may be required by any Laws.
- (14) Time is of the Essence of this Right of First Refusal Agreement and is a material term. If the option is not exercised before expiration of the term of the option that is set forth in this Article, the option and all rights of GCC shall automatically and immediately terminate without notice, and GCC shall have no interest whatever in the Subject Property.
- (15) On execution of this Agreement, CITY and GCC shall execute and record in the official records of the County of Los Angeles a memorandum of option in the form of the attached Exhibit "C". GCC covenants to execute and deliver to GCC immediately on the expiration or earlier termination of the term of this Agreement a quitclaim deed in recordable form releasing and reconveying to GCC all right, title and interest of GCC in the Subject Property.

## 16. RECORDS RETENTION; AUDITS

During this Agreement's term, and for a period of four (4) years after the expiration or termination of this Agreement, or any extension of it, each PARTY must:

- (1) Keep and maintain, in their original form, all records, books, papers, or documents related to this Agreement; and
- (2) Permit either PARTY, at all reasonable times, to have access to, examine, audit, excerpt, copy, photocopy, photograph, videotape, record, or transcribe all records, books, papers, or documents related to the performance of this Agreement.

#### 17. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS

This Agreement does not, and is not intended to, impair, divest, delegate or contravene any constitution, statutory and/or other legal right, privilege power, obligation, duty or immunity of the PARTIES.

#### 18. GOVERNING LAW

California's laws govern this Agreement's construction and interpretation. Unless this Agreement provides otherwise, any reference to laws, ordinances, rules, or regulations include their later amendments, modifications, and successor legislation.

#### 19. WAIVER OF BREACH

If either PARTY fails to require the other to perform any term in this Agreement, that failure does not prevent the PARTY from later enforcing that term, or any other term. If either PARTY waives the other's breach of a term, that waiver is not treated as waiving a later breach of the term. A waiver of a term is valid only if it is in writing and signed by the PARTY waiving it. This Agreement's duties and obligations:

- (1) Are cumulative (rather than alternative) and are in addition to (rather than a limitation on) any option, right, power, remedy, or privilege; and
- (2) Are not exhausted by a PARTY's exercise of any one of them.

#### 20. ATTORNEY'S FEES

If CITY or GCC brings an action at law or in equity to enforce or interpret one or more provisions of this Agreement, the "prevailing PARTY" is entitled to "reasonable attorney's fees" in addition to any other relief to which the prevailing PARTY may be entitled. A "prevailing PARTY" has the same meaning as that term is defined in California Code of Civil Procedure Section 1032(a)(4). "Reasonable attorney's fees" of the City Attorney's office means the fees regularly charged by private attorneys who:

- (1) Practice in a law firm located in Los Angeles County; and
- (2) Have an equivalent number of years of professional experience in the subject matter area of the law for which the City Attorney's services were rendered.

## 21. ASSURANCES

Upon either PARTY's reasonable request at any time, each PARTY shall promptly:

- (1) Take further necessary action;
- (2) Provide consent whenever a PARTY's consent is required and not unreasonably withhold or delay said consent; and
- (3) Sign, acknowledge, and deliver all additional documents as may be reasonable, necessary, or appropriate to carry out this Agreement's intent, purpose, and terms.

## 22. SEVERABILITY

Should any part, term or provision of this Agreement be decided by any court of competent jurisdiction to be illegal or in conflict with any applicable law, or otherwise be rendered unenforceable or ineffectual, the validity of the remaining portions or provisions shall not be affected thereby.

## 23. ASSIGNMENT

This Agreement does not give any rights or benefits to anyone, other than to CITY and GCC. All duties, obligations, and responsibilities under this Agreement are for the sole and exclusive benefit of CITY and GCC, and are not for the benefit of another person, entity, or organization. Without either PARTY's prior written authorization, a PARTY shall not do any one or more of the following:

- (1) Assign or transfer a right or interest— whether in whole, in part, temporarily, or otherwise— in this Agreement; or
- (2) Delegate a duty or obligation owed— whether in whole, in part, temporarily, or otherwise— under this Agreement.

#### 24. NOTICES

24.01 The PARTIES shall submit in writing all notices and correspondence that this Agreement requires or permits, and shall use the following delivery method:

- (1) Personal delivery;
- (2) U.S. mail, first class postage prepaid;
- (3) "Certified" U.S. mail, postage prepaid, return receipt requested; or
- (4) Email.

24.02 All written notices or correspondence done in the manner described in Section 24.01 above with the street address or place, or email address listed in Section 24.03 below will be presumed "given" to a PARTY on whichever date occurs earliest:

- (1) The date of personal delivery;
- (2) The third (3rd) business day following deposit in the U.S. mail, when sent by "first class" mail;
- (3) The date on which the PARTY or its agent either signed the return receipt or refused to accept delivery, as noted on the return receipt or other U.S. Postal Service form, when sent by "certified" mail; or
- (4) The date of transmission, when sent by email.

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#### DESCRIPTION OF HISTORY / BACKGROUND

An election was held in the Glendale Community College District on November 8, 2016 for the issuance and sale of general obligation bonds of the Glendale Community College District (the "District"). Measure GC was approved under Proposition 39 which requires that the District establish, populate and empower an independent citizens' bond oversight committee. The District previously had a bond oversight committee established for Measure G in connection with the issuance of bonds under Measure G. In December 2016 the Board expanded the responsibilities of the Glendale Community College District Independent Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee to include the review of expenditures of the Measure GC bond proceeds and approved Amended and Restated Bylaws which set forth the expanded powers and responsibilities of the Committee. The GCC Executive Vice President of Administrative Services serves as the chief college staff member in support of the work of the Committee.

Members of the committee may serve no more than three consecutive terms of two years each. Terms commence as of the date of the appointment by the Board of Trustees, with an effort to have terms run from July 1 – June 30.

With the sale of \$122 million of the first phase of the Measure GC facilities bonds and significant increase in responsibilities for the oversight committee, the Independent Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee discussed the value to increase the membership of the committee to at least 12 members, including a GCC student.

Proposition 39 and the By-Laws require that the oversight committee consist of at least seven members representing the following areas:

- Local business organization
- Senior citizens' organization
- Taxpayer organization
- Currently enrolled student active in student government
- District support organization such as the College Foundation
- Community at-large (at least two)

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#### DESCRIPTION OF HISTORY/BACKGROUND

At the Verdugo Campus of Glendale Community College, food services have been provided by the District for students, staff, and community at four locations - the cafeteria on the second floor of the Sierra Madre Building, CJs Café and Convenience Store on the ground floor of the Sierra Madre Building, Milky Way Café on the ground floor of the Cimmarusti Science Center, and The Café kiosk adjacent to the San Rafael Building.

Since the 2008 – 2009 fiscal year, Glendale Community College has operated its food services program at an average annual loss of \$178,864. During that period the losses have ranged from \$305,713 - \$74,744. Those annual losses are covered by transfers from the college general fund.

For the past two years, college officials have been exploring options to reduce the annual loss and determined the best option was to contract with a service provider. Proposals were received and interviews conducted with potential companies with experience in providing food services support for colleges and universities. The company selected is Pacific Dining.

Pacific Dining was founded in 1989 serving the food service needs of business and industry but during the last 15 years has focused primarily on college food services. Currently Pacific Dining contracts with 16 community colleges throughout California and operates entirely in California. Pacific Dining reports it has never lost an account having never been canceled or not renewed.

Highlights of the proposed agreement call for Pacific Dining to:

- manage and operate food and dining services offered at the Verdugo Campus,
- procure, prepare and sell food and beverages,
- provide service that includes breakfast, lunch, dinner, banquet, picnic, and catered affairs for district events.
- establish hours of operations and pricing of goods subject to approval by the District,
- employ, train and maintain a regular staff of employees,
- utilize the services of college students as employees and interns to the fullest extent possible,
- pay the college monthly commissions based on gross sales at the level of:
   7% for cafeteria and catering, 9% for coffee stands, and 10% for catering for outside groups using campus facilities,
- annually provide two \$500 scholarships, \$500 of in-kind catering for a college event, and \$500 in-kind catering of an ASGCC event.

#### and for the District to:

- furnish all existing space, furniture and fixtures necessary,
- maintain and repair all plumbing, heating, air conditioning, and electrical systems,
- daily clean and maintain the floor surfaces in the dining areas.

Six GCCD employees who have been working in the Food Services area are affected by the move to contracting with an outside vendor. After extensive collaboration between the CSEA and Administration, an understanding has been reached to establish an early retirement plan for eligible employees in the food services department. Three food services employees have accepted an early retirement offer through Public Agency Retirement Services (PARS) and three of the employees (two "lead foodservice workers" and one "cook") will remain as GCCD employees assigned to work with Pacific Dining. The salary, benefits, and PERS costs of these employees will be reimbursed the District by Pacific Dining.

To assist in the implementation of the upgrade of Oracle PeopleSoft Campus Solutions from version 9.0 to 9.2 GCC extended an RFQ reaching a broad range of vendors resulting in seven viable responses.

Highstreet IT Solutions is an Oracle Platinum Partner with full service technology offerings and was selected based on a range of service criteria. This includes experienced project managers, skilled software system engineers, successful completion of numerous ERP implementations, structured implementation methodologies, California Community College expertise, along with reliable higher education references.

In addition, Highstreet IT Solutions offers a Campus Solutions Health Check with recommendations for improving business processes, improving student outcome efficiency, and leveraging unused functionality. This includes a fit/gap analysis comparing delivered PeopleSoft functionality to the college's current business processes and requirements.

#### DESCRIPTION OF HISTORY/BACKGROUND

Board Policy 5035: Withholding Student Records authorizes present and former student records to be "withheld and/or registration blocked upon written notification for failure to resolve financial obligations with the College..."

Under Administrative Regulation 5035, the Director of Admissions and Records "may withhold grades, transcripts, diplomas, and registration privileges from any student or former student who fails to pay a proper financial obligation to the College. The student shall be given written notification from the Student Fees Office and the opportunity to appeal if the financial obligation is in error. The definition of a proper financial obligation shall include, but is not limited to: student fees; loans; obligations incurred through the use of facilities, equipment or materials; library fines; unreturned library books; materials remaining improperly in the possession of the student; or lost or destroyed and/or any other unpaid obligation a student or former student owes to the College."

For the past several years, the college has sought to support and encourage potential students and present students to attend college and, therefore, did not require all fees to be paid in advance of registration and did not withhold registration privileges from students who owed the college money. Instead, the college enforced the provision of the policy to withhold the issuance of transcripts in order to resolve any financial obligations owed the college by the students.

This practice has resulted in the college having over ten million dollars in delinquent and uncollected accounts, including approximately eight million dollars for resident students and almost two million dollars for international students. The number of past and present students owing money to the college is 14,049.

As an effort to collect some of these receivables, the college explored several options and determined it should attempt to collect the money owed through the use of a collection service. A Request for Proposals was issued July 1, 2019, seeking proposals from contractors to provide collection services for:

- Account receivables as a result of financial aid over payment (i.e.Pell Grants)
- Tuition receivable accounts including past due fees i.e. non-resident tuition and resident fees)
- Miscellaneous accounts receivable (fees, short-term loans, payroll)

The RFP further listed the collection services that may be included in the contract:

- Skip tracing
- Researching debtor assets
- Contacting debtors by phone and mail
- Negotiating payments
- Litigation
- Credit bureau reporting
- Related activities required for verifying and collecting accounts

ConServe is being recommended to the Board for selection. It has provided a wide-range of collection services to over 800 colleges and universities for over 33 year, including 26 community college clients in California. Two recent California community colleges report ConServe recovery rates at 28% and 22%.

The term of the contract is for one year with an option to renew for an additional three years. Collection fees shall be the sole consideration paid to ConServe for its services under the contract and are as follows:

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#### DESCRIPTION OF HISTORY / BACKGROUND

The contract of employment with the Superintendent/President calls for an annual evaluation of "performance in carrying out the duties and responsibilities (of the position), the goals and priority duties established by the Board, and performance of other duties..." The contract further calls upon the Board and Superintendent/President at the conclusion of the annual evaluation to "compile an updated set of goals and priority duties" for the next year.

#### DESCRIPTION OF HISTORY / BACKGROUND

At the Special Board Meeting of June 28, 2019, in fulfillment of Board Policy 2745, the Board evaluated its work in relation to expectations established in "Standard IV: Leadership and Governance" of the Accreditation Standards of the Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges; studied the results of the College Views 2018 Faculty/Staff Survey regarding the functioning of the Board; discussed members' view of the Board's performance on questions related to their roles and responsibilities; and assessed progress made on the outcome measures established for Board Focus Areas for 2018-19. Based on these considerations the Board agreed on five areas on which as a whole, and individually, members will focus special attention during July 2019 - June 2020, in addition to ongoing responsibilities in their policy leadership role.

Board members concurred that rather than identify the areas of special attention as "Board Goals" they would be termed "Focus Areas." This is to avoid confusion and make clear the Board Goals are in fact the College's Goals as identified in the Institutional Master Plan 2018-2025 developed through the College's governance processes and approved by the Board on May 15, 2018. The Board Focus Areas reflect those areas of direct Board attention, involvement, and action during the year and also identify outcome measures to show the way in which the focus will be maintained (see attached).

# **Board Focus Areas and Outcome Measures For the 2019 – 2020 Academic Year**

- Board members focus on policy issues related to achievement of the Institutional Master Plan Strategic Goals (clarify student pathways, facilitate student entry into pathways, help students stay on pathway, ensure student learning, and improve operational effectiveness) and monitor progress on the key performance indicators.
  - Assure the fiscal stability of the college.
  - Maintain oversight of the college budget including an expectation of timely informative meetings, the setting of budget benchmarks, and five-year budget projections.
  - Provide oversight and support to increase student success and degree and certificate completion and to close the equity gaps.
  - Provide leadership support as GCC faculty, staff and administrators implement the Guided Pathways model.
  - Devote a portion of each public meeting to at least one of the areas of oversight.
  - Receive and review status reports on achievements of the master plan strategic initiatives.
  - Annually receive the Student Success Score Card results and Campus Profile data and identify areas for college attention.
  - Learn the process the college uses to identify the Greater Los Angeles Region's job market needs and to align the college CE programs with those needs.
  - Ensure online education implementation and expansion are occurring across all departments to assure its effective use in fulfilling the college mission.
  - Support GCC efforts to expand the use of open education resources (OER), zero-textbookcost degree programs, and other approaches to the reduction of textbook costs for students.
  - Expand partnerships with the city and other entities to implement and improve energy conservation and sustainability efforts.
  - Monitor progress on achieving diversity among faculty, classified staff, managers, and administrators.
  - Receive and review quarterly reports on accreditation.

• This Day in Labor History - August 20, 1886 Sentences were handed down on this date against the Haymarket defendants. All were found guilty despite the obvious innocence of most of them. None were even present at the scene of the bombing at Haymarket Square, Chicago, where activists had been organizing for the 8-hour day. Seven of the eight defendants (George Engel, Samuel Fielden, Adolph Fischer, Louis Lingg, Albert Parsons, Michael Schwab and August Spies) were condemned to death. Oscar Neebe was sent to prison for 15 years. The hangings occurred on November 11, 1887.

## Dr. Paul Schlossman, Vice President, Student Services

- EOPS (Extended Opportunity Programs & Services) closed out the 2018-2019 academic year as the third largest program in the state. EOPS faculty and staff served 2,059 eligible students with comprehensive support services, more than 12,000 counseling contacts, and \$1,149,623 in direct financial support through EOPS grants, book vouchers, CARE grants, and meal cards.
- The MCEC (Multicultural & Community Engagement Center) staff trained 10 reentry students to serve as peer mentors/advocates for the Center for Reentry Pathways during the 2019-2020 academic year.
- The Financial Aid Office has launched the GCC Last Mile Grant to assist students when traditional sources of aid do not cover their financial needs. Made possible through AB 19 funds, the Last Mile Grant is intended to help students who are in the final stages of their academic programs overcome financial barriers to completion and "cross the finish line."
- Fifty-two (52) student athletes were accepted for transfer for the 2019-2020 academic year. Thirteen are transferring to CSU schools, ten to UC schools, and four to USC. Other notable transfer destinations for the Vaqueros include the University of Oklahoma and the University of New Orleans.
- The Student Outreach Services (SOS) staff conducted a successful text message campaign to Welcome Center contacts and graduating seniors who submitted 2019-2020 admissions applications, but had not yet enrolled in classes as of August 1. Of the 2,481 students contacted through the campaign, 1,410 have enrolled in summer or fall 2019 classes to date – a success rate of 56.8%.
- Sponsored by the Student Equity Program, 152 students have completed the 2019 Summer Bridge program to date with three more sessions remaining. Trained by the MCEC staff, 17 SPARK mentors are providing peer-mentoring services to Summer Bridge students and will assist them throughout the 2019-2020 school year.
