

## FREE POST-CONVICTION RELIEF LEGAL SERVICES

**EXPUNGEMENT ELIGIBILITY**: No current supervision (summary or formal probation, parole, AB109 probation); No pending cases; no outstanding bench warrants, some sex offences excluded

**ADVISEMENT**: Must admit the conviction if running for public office, contracting with CA Lottery, apply for state or local license; and expungement does not remove the conviction from one's rap sheet.

REQUIRED: Court Docket, not certified; or California "Rap Sheet" from the Department of Justice

Please obtain the **COURT DOCKET** for every case/conviction in Los Angeles county from the Clerk's Office at nearest courthouse. Call for appointment once dockets are obtained.

Orange County, Riverside County, and San Bernardino County **COURT DOCKETS** are available online.

RECORDS FOR FELONY CASES OLDER THAN 1996 IN LOS ANGELES: Archives, basement of Hall of Records at 320 W. Temple St.; Los Angeles 90012

Probation & Sentencing Minute Orders only: Subsequent minute orders needed to see if probation violated Lacourt.org has criminal defendant index available for a fee; other counties many have online access.

**WHAT CAN BE EXPUNGED?** Misdemeanor convictions with or without probation if still on probation; felony cases with state prison sentences if the convictions are PROP 47 or PROP 64 eligible; certain sex offences cannot be expunged

## **GENERAL REQUIREMENTS FOR PROP 47 AND PROP 64:**

PROP 47 Certain prior convictions excluded one from relief; ok to submit petition if still on probation CONVICTIONS: Simple possession convictions & theft-related convictions if loss is less than \$950

**PROP 64** Possession of marijuana, possession for sale of marijuana, sales of transportation of marijuana
