Other ways to identify rooms for rent:

- Check the student bulletin board outside of the Garfield Campus NCESL Office on the 2nd Floor of Tropico Bldg. (check for advertisements for rooms for rent AND post your own advertisement stating that you are looking for a room for rent)
- Contact local community colleges and universities and ask if they have bulletin boards where such things are posted.
- Check local grocery store bulletin boards or other community-based bulletin boards
- Check local newspapers and other local magazines like Penny Saver
- Contact churches or other religious institutions in the community to see if the people who attend services there may have rooms for rent
- Ask family, friends, co-workers and fellow students if they know of people who may have a room for rent or ask them if they would be willing to send out emails to the people they know
