# Continuing Education and Noncredit ESL Registration

The GCC Garfield Campus is offering free continuing education classes for the summer. This includes our noncredit English as a Second Language (ESL) program which is offering free, open-entry classes at all levels this summer. Students can choose from integrated-skills classes, which teach listening, speaking, reading, and writing, and they can also take classes in conversation and citizenship.
