SUBJECT: GUILD OPENERS FOR 2021-2024 COLLECTIVE BARGAINING

**AGREEMENT** 

The Glendale College Guild, local 2276 of the American Federation of Teachers, hereby gives notice of its desire to open its collective bargaining agreement with the Glendale Community College District covering the period from July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2024. The Guild seeks to negotiate:

- 1. an addition to the contract ensuring that grades will not be due until one week after the last day of finals for all courses;
- an update in the contract ensuring that faculty who are on leave are not charged with finding their own replacement for courses, substitutes, or generalized duties;
- 3. an addition to the contract ensuring that when a faculty member serves as an administrator, their years of service are credited on the salary schedule when they return to work as a faculty member;
- 4. an addition to the contract that compensates instructors teaching Independent Study courses;
- 5. an update to the Intellectual Property section of the contract to clarify ownership of faculty creations;
- 6. an update in the contract that specifies that compensatory hours will be paid out upon resignation, retirement, or death;
- 7. an update in the contract allowing for an adjustment, augmentation, and renaming of the Visual and Performing Arts stipends;
- 8. an update in the contract ensuring release time or compensation equity for departments/disciplines with a small number of Contract faculty;
- an update in the load pool hour distribution list ensuring that department Chairs are included, listed, and have access to the load pool hours that are assigned to divisions;

- 10. an update in the contract to reflect the varied responsibilities of library faculty in fulfilling their roles as Instructional Services faculty;
- 11. an addition to the contract to include subsidized car charging for all faculty who commute using electric or hybrid cars;
- 12. an update in the contract allowing Contract faculty to teach 100% online so long as their other contractual obligations are being met;
- 13. an addition to the contract allowing faculty to participate in campus meetings and obligations remotely;
- 14. a contract clarification regarding adjunct compensation for holidays;
- 15. an addition to the contract that allows for equity between adjunct faculty and adjunct counselors by assigning an additional workday for each adjunct counselor if their hours are cancelled due to a holiday;
- 16. an addition the contract that clarifies that a faculty member is not considered to have an expectation of employment until they have been offered an actual contract;
- 17. an update in the contract that ensuring Intersession pay is equal or better to pay for fall and spring for all adjunct faculty;
- 18. an update to the contract that clarifies how adjunct office hours are paid when an adjunct faculty member is out sick;
- 19. an update to the contract that would allow the teaching load for Parent Ed as well as Film/Media Production to be reviewed and possibly reduced:
- 20. an update to the contract ensuring that faculty have ease of access to information regarding the status of their banked hours as well as faculty unit credits:
- 21. an update to the contract to increase the District's current contribution to retiree healthcare and long-term care allowances until the employee reaches Medicare eligibility age;
- 22. an update to the contract that replaces the language in the appendix from "season of sport" to "scheduled season of sport."

SUBJECT: ENROLLMENT UPDATE

## DESCRIPTION OF HISTORY / BACKGROUND

California community colleges' apportionment revenues from the state are based on the enrollments of resident students. Enrollments are converted into Full-Time Equivalent Students (FTES) numbers for apportionment reporting. The attached report includes updated enrollment numbers and projections.

One FTES, whether credit or noncredit, is defined by state regulations as 525 hours of student contact. Most credit courses use a weekly accounting method: They meet the same number of hours every week, and apportionment is based on a calculation of hours per week times number of weeks divided by 525. Credit courses shorter than a full semester (such as 8-week courses, or Summer and Winter courses) use an analogous daily accounting method. Both weekly and daily courses use a census date to determine enrollments and FTES.

All noncredit courses and a small number of credit courses use positive attendance accounting, which is not based on enrollment and class sessions per week but rather on the actual hours that students attend class. Each student's attendance is tracked for every class session. The total number of attendance hours is divided by 525 to calculate FTES based on positive attendance. FTES based on positive attendance is more difficult to project than FTES based on weekly or daily accounting because students' actual attendance must be tracked every day, rather than using a defined census date.

Due to the COVID-19 emergency, the Chancellor's Office has approved a method for positive attendance FTES incorporating the average of positive attendance hours over the past three offerings of each course. The table included her shows actual FTES rather than FTES calculated by this method.















# TRANSFER RATES






# SHORTER-TERM COMPLETION RATES





# SECTION 508 STANDARDS FOR ELECTRONIC AND INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY ACCESSIBILITY

Electronic and information technologies (EIT) are a significant means by which Glendale Community College District provides information to students, faculty, staff and other constituents. The need to ensure accessibility to all members of the campus community becomes critical as more administrative services and learning environments are based on EIT. It is also a part of the district's ongoing commitment to establishing a barrier free learning community, or universal access, to all students.

Individuals with disabilities are guaranteed access to educational institutions and systems of communication under the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 and the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990. Amendments to Section 508 of the Rehabilitation Act clarify accessibility requirements for EIT developed, procured, maintained, or used by federal agencies. SB105 and SB 302 adopt these same requirements. Furthermore, California Government Code Section 11135 (d.) states the following:

- (2) In order to improve accessibility of existing technology, and therefore increase the successful employment of individuals with disabilities, particularly blind and visually impaired and deaf and hard-of-hearing persons, state governmental entities, in developing, procuring, maintaining, or using electronic or information technology, either indirectly or through the use of state funds by other entities, shall comply with the accessibility requirements of Section 508 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended (29 U.S.C. Sec. 794d), and regulations implementing that act as set forth in Part 1194 of Title 36 of the Federal Code of Regulations.
- (3) Any entity that contracts with a state or local entity subject to this section for the provision of electronic or information technology or for the provision of related services shall agree to respond to, and resolve any complaint regarding accessibility of its products or services that is brought to the attention of the entity.

As mandated by federal and state laws and the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office, it is necessary that the Glendale Community College District comply with Section 508 Standards to ensure accessibility to EIT for individuals with disabilities.

- 5. **Article IV, Grievance Procedures -** The District has an interest in clarifying the language within the article and ensuring consistent terms are used throughout the agreement.
- 6. **Article VI, Hours** The District has in interest in clarifying the language within the article, ensuring consistent terms are used throughout the agreement, and ensuring the language addresses instructional and non-instructional faculty within the bargaining unit.

- 7. **Article VII, Leaves of Absence** The District has an interest in clarifying various provisions of the article to ensure compliance with federal and state statutes and regulations.
- 8. **Article VIII, Salaries and related Appendices** (also listed as a mutual reopener below) The District has an interest in productive discussions around compensation that honors stakeholders' perspectives, clarifying various provisions of article, and ensuring consistent terms are used throughout the agreement.
- 9. **Article IX, Evaluation Procedures and related Appendices** The District has an interest in clarifying the timelines delineated in the evaluation procedures, clarifying various provisions of article, and ensuring consistent terms are used throughout the agreement.
- 10. **Article X, Class Size** The District has an interest in clarifying the language within the article and ensuring consistent terms are used throughout the agreement.
- 11. **Article XI Health and Welfare –** The District has an interest in exploring entry into benefits joint powers authority or health benefit trust and related benefit plan offerings, clarifying various provisions of article, and ensuring consistent terms are used throughout the agreement.
- 12. **Article XII, Faculty Service Area** The District has an interest in clarifying the language within the article and ensuring consistent terms are used throughout the agreement.
- 13. **Article XIII, Miscellaneous Provisions -** The District has an interest in clarifying the language within the article, modifying outdated language, ensuring consistent terms are used throughout the agreement, and modifying language that is inconsistent with the American's with Disabilities Act and equal employment opportunity.
- 14. **Article XIV, Effect of Agreement –** The District has an interest in updating the contract with revised timelines for creation of an electronic version of the contract, clarifying various provisions of article, and ensuring consistent terms are used throughout the agreement.
- 15. **Article XV, Duration, Termination and Negotiation –** The District has an interest in modifying the dates within the article due to expire at the end of the contract term, clarifying the timelines delineated in article, ensuring consistent terms are used throughout the agreement, and clarifying the language within the article.

#### DESCRIPTION OF HISTORY / BACKGROUND

Glendale Community College has obtained a number of Federal Title III and Title V grants over the past few years. These grant programs are designed to improve academic quality, institutional management, and fiscal stability, with an emphasis on institutions that enroll large portions of minority and financially disadvantaged students. GCC grants have focused on those available to designated Hispanic-serving institutions.

Examples of these grants received are:

- Gateway Program: \$4,249,639 received over five years for opening the gateway to STEM degrees for Hispanic and other underprepared students (2011-2016)
- GAUSS Program: \$5,865,324 received over five years for building a more responsive STEM environment at GCC for underserved Hispanic and other low-income students (2011-2016)
- Abriendo Caminos Program: \$2,740,722 received over five years for building a completion pathway for Hispanic and other highneed students (2015-2020)
- Adelante GCC Program: \$3,000,000 to be received over five years for advancing GCC toward Hispanic-serving institution excellence (2020-2025)

To be eligible for grants in 2021, the Federal government has added a requirement that the governing body of the institution "duly authorize" applications for eligibility for FY 2021.

#### DESCRIPTION OF HISTORY/BACKGROUND

The Welding Shop Alterations project will convert approximately 6,500 sq. ft. of existing space vacated by the Fire Academy in the Aviation Arts Building into a new Welding Technologies Lab. When completed, the space will consist of 29 welding booths, space for new cutting machinery, including plasma and shear cutting equipment, space for metal shavings storage, as well as secure outside storage for welding gases. The current, existing welding facility is 1.728 sq. ft. and accommodates 20 welding booths. The project will also improve ventilation and allow for increased enrollment in the program. On December 5, 2019, bids were received for the Welding Shop Alterations project. The Bid Proposal from Monet Construction, Inc. was accepted on December 17, 2019. This change order adds as set forth below.

- Students were excited to return and work in the newly renovated Welding lab. Faculty reported that students were very impressed by the renovated facility.
- The English and Noncredit Business and Life Skills divisions have collaborated to create a week-long noncredit writing preparation course to help prepare students for college level English courses.
- Librarians are providing Remote Research Help (and help with other inquiries) via Chat, Text, Email, and Zoom. These services are available regular library hours each week: Monday-Thursday
- Appointed to the statewide Guided Pathways committee as a represent the Chief Instructional Officers.
- Met with the Garfield leadership team, including division chairs and deans, to discuss issues affecting our noncredit programs as well as long-term planning for the Garfield campus.
- Attended the Curriculum and Instruction committee's Equity Guide Workshop, an introduction to the Equity Guide produced by faculty under the leadership of Curriculum and Instruction committeeco-chair Francien Rohrbacher.

Paul Schlossman. Vice President of Student Services

- Karen Tu, Student Services Technician in the CalWORKs Parents Program, organized and hosted "CalWORKs Students Know Your Rights." In collaboration with Neighborhood Legal Services and their staff attorney, Lily Choi, the presentation provided valuable information regarding students' legal rights and entitlements as student-participants in the CalWORKs welfare-to-work program. Approximately 50 attendees participated in the virtual workshop, including GCC CalWORKs students, staff, faculty, and students and staff from other Los Angeles County community colleges.
- Meg Chil-Gevorkyan, Program Manager for Student Outreach Services (SOS), delivered a presentation to the California Community Colleges Student Affairs Association (CCCSAA) entitled "Student Outreach Services in the Virtual Environment: How to Virtually Reach, Recruit, and Retain."
- High school student participation in Dual Enrollment courses remains strong with 518 students enrolled in 33 sections for spring 2021. This represents a 20% increase in DE enrollment compared with spring 2020.
- The SOS/Welcome Center staff served 612 students virtually during the first week of the spring 2021 semester through the Welcome Center Zoom hours, Live Web Chat, and other virtual service modalities.
- The GCC CARES program launched a financial literacy program in collaboration with Babson University. 576 students have signed up for the program to date with a commitment to participate in a series of six financial literacy workshops.
- With the help of 100 volunteers, the GCC CARES program hosted another drive through food bank on March 3 that served more than 1,900 families. The program also crossed a milestone by having provided over 1,000,000 pounds of fresh and healthy food and groceries to the community since the start of the pandemic in spring 2020.
- The Scholarship Office has added four inaugural scholarships to the spring 2021 award offerings including the Leo M. Gabrielian Memorial Scholarship, Andy Young Memorial Scholarship, Bonnye LaPenotiere Memorial Scholarship, and Pride Scholarship.
- Associate Dean for Financial Aid, Dr. Christina Tangalakis, presented a
  workshop entitled "Implicit Bias for Financial Aid Leaders" at the Western
  Association of Student Financial Aid Administrators (WASFAA) Leadership
  Conference on 2/11/21. Dr. Tangalakis also participated in an invitationonly roundtable with new U.S. Department of Education appointees on the
  topic of CARES Act student support and ongoing student needs during the
  pandemic.
- The Financial Office maintained a 3.8% loan default rate for student borrowers during the latest reporting period. This rate compares favorably to the national average default rate of 9.7%.
- Thanks to academic support services provided by the Athletics Department staff, coaches, and counselors, 144 student athletes completed nine academic units or more with a 3.0 overall g.p.a. or higher during the fall 2020 semester.
