Preventive care at no additional cost keeps you healthy at every stage

Your first step in a healthier direction starts with prevention. Good prevention starts early and continues throughout your entire life. Even if you feel fine, going to the doctor for **health tests and checkups** is part of living a healthy life. These screenings check for problems early, before you feel signs of sickness. Finding problems early often gives you more care choices with better results.

With your Blue Shield health plan, **preventive care services are covered at no cost, even before you meet the plan's deductible.** This healthcare flier provides a summary of these preventive care services. Women's preventive care

Preventive care services for women, along with contraceptive drugs and devices, are covered through your Blue Shield health plan at no cost⁴:

- Contraceptive drugs and devices
 - All generic oral contraceptives
 - Select brand oral contraceptives, including Natazia
 - Methods such as patches, implantable rods, diaphragms, intrauterine devices (IUD), vaginal rings, and injectables
- Sterilization procedures, including tubal ligation
- Family planning counseling and consulting
- Gestational diabetes screening
- Comprehensive breastfeeding support including breast pump rental and purchase of selected breast pumps
- Domestic and interpersonal violence screening and counseling

Contraceptive drugs and devices

Understanding preventive vs. diagnostic care

Preventive services have some coverage limitations or exclusions, and you should be aware of these before seeking care. For example, when you seek preventive care more times per year than is covered under your benefit plan, or that is outside of nationally approved guidelines or recommendations, or you use an out-of-network provider, you may be billed for diagnostic treatment instead of preventive care.

The primary reason for the office visit usually determines if the visit is preventive. When the visit is not considered preventive, the appropriate plan deductible and coinsurance or copayment will apply. Here are examples of how preventive care might include a diagnostic visit:

The primary purpose of the office visit was not to receive a preventive service

If a woman visits the doctor about pelvic pain and receives a pelvic exam to rule out a medical condition, this visit will be considered diagnostic.

Two unrelated treatments are provided on a single visit

If a patient visits the doctor to get a booster shot, and during the visit also receives treatment for another health concern (such as removing a mole), this visit may be considered diagnostic.

Unsure about whether a procedure you're seeking qualifies as preventive or diagnostic?
