TRANSFER REQUIREMENTS

The Graziadio Business School accepts California IGETC and CSU courses for transfer into our Bachelor of Science in Management (BSM) degree completion program. Prospective students need at least 60 units to transfer into the BSM program and all courses must be completed at a regionally accredited college or university.

Depending on prior coursework, prerequisites and requirements vary. Please check with a recruitment advisor if you have questions.

Students who have completed an AA/AS degree may be exempt from the requirements as long as they have completed English Composition and the Mathematics requirement. No language units or science labs are required. Quarter units will be converted into semester unit equivalencies. Students should have current full-time employment or significant prior work experience.

ENGLISH

1 COURSE (3 SEMESTER UNITS) REQUIRED

English Reading & Composition; must have a grade of "C" or better

ACCEPTED COURSES: Freshman English Composition, College Composition, English Rhetoric, Composition and Literature, Expository Writing, English Expression

UNACCEPTED COURSES: Basic Grammar, English as a Second Language, Business English, English Fundamentals

ACCEPTED CLEP TEST: College Composition

MATHEMATICS

1 COURSE (3 SEMESTER UNITS) REQUIRED

Mathematics that must be the equivalent of College Algebra or higher; must have a grade of "C" or better

ACCEPTED COURSES: College Algebra, Trigonometry, Calculus, Geometry, and Statistics

ACCEPTABLE CLEP TESTS: Pre-Calculus, Calculus, College Algebra

ACCEPTED DSST TESTS: Fundamentals of College Algebra, Principles of Statistics

SOCIAL SCIENCES

2 COURSES EQUIVALENT TO 6 SEMESTER UNITS REQUIRED

ACCEPTED COURSES: Cultural Anthropology, Psychology, History, Political Science, Cultural Geography, Economics, American Institutions, and Sociology

ACCEPTABLE CLEP TESTS: American Government, Introductory Sociology, Western Civilization I, Western Civilization II, Introductory Psychology, Principles of Macro Economics, Principles of Micro Economics, Human Growth and Development, History of the U.S. I, History of the U.S. II

ACCEPTED DSST TESTS: An Introduction to the Modern Middle East, Human/Cultural Geography, Rise and Fall of the Soviet Union, A History of the Vietnam War, The Civil War and Reconstruction, Lifespan Developmental

ARTS / HUMANITIES

2 COURSES EQUIVALENT TO 6 SEMESTER UNITS REQUIRED

ACCEPTED COURSES: Art, Drama, English, History, Literature, Music, Philosophy, Religion, Speech, Stage Management, Communication, Photography, Journalism, Foreign Language, Theater Arts

ACCEPTABLE CLEP TESTS: Western Civilization I, Western Civilization II, American Literature, English Literature, Analyzing and Interpreting Literature, College Level French Language, College Level German Language, College Level Spanish Language, History of the U.S. I, History of the U.S. II

ACCEPTED DSST TESTS: Art of the Western World, Ethics in America or (SF 474 Ethics in American Essay), Introduction to World Religions, Principles of Public Speaking

NATURAL SCIENCES

3 SEMESTER UNITS REQUIRED; NO LAB IS REQUIRED

ACCEPTED COURSES: General Biology, General Chemistry, Physics, Physical Geography, Physical Anthropology, Marine Science, Oceanography, Ecology, Geology, Earth Science, Microbiology, Physiology, Botany, Zoology, Anatomy, Astronomy, and Meteorology

UNACCEPTABLE COURSES: Health

ACCEPTED CLEP TESTS: Biology, Chemistry

ACCEPTED DSST TESTS: Astronomy, Environment and Humanity (The Race to Save the Planet), Principles of Physical Science I, Physical Geography

GENERAL EDUCATION

MINIMUM 9 GENERAL EDUCATION SEMESTER UNITS REQUIRED

ACCEPTED COURSES: All regionally accredited courses that would satisfy the above categories, as well as Computer Science and up to 4 semester units of Physical Education
