XIII. Special Reports/Governance Committees

1. Guided Pathways

- Regarding AB 705 there was a growth mindset workshop and they would like to know more about its implementation at GCC to determine the funding that's needed for the future. The program is not set to collect data which makes gathering all the information difficult but they are on my path timing and streamlining.
- The onboarding informational group had its final meeting and gathered feedback about GCC student orientation, and the school is moving forward with the orientation updates.
- Outreach and counseling departments are setting up group conseling to discuss the GCC onboarding process and their experiences regarding the student's voice. They are discussing different ways on how to collaborate with professional development, as well and working on how to use the collected data to get meaningful information about student experiences in the online education environment.
- Navigate is divided into sectors, but are worried that there aren't enough representatives for each category. They are focused on getting the program maps developed because when the students go into the academic planning section, they get a plan of all the maps they need to take and a list of the maps they need to take as a requirement, and that's their priority as of right now.

2. Study Abroad

- We went over some of the programs in the developmental stages, like our winter 2022
 program because we need to finalize things such as getting tested, or vaccinated for you to be allied to attend or if it's still required to quarantine.
- A few programs have been delayed until further notice, such as the Armenia trip. We
 have also gone over the Safe Travel protocols as well as some new updates on the
 extension codes.

3. Scholars Program

- Almost all committees have put out the community service events and fundraisers they
 have planned. Went over and reviewed those events during the meeting, outreach
 fundraiser and social events have all been finished up.
- Arts & Culture is in the process of having their journal published and printed, they also
 have a scholars recipe book, where students submit a recipe from their culture along
 with the instructions.
- The community service committee has earned community service credit through the color me smile event which ends on June 4, 2021.
- The program's last general assembly was last Thursday where they announced the new 2021-2022 cabinet and lastly, the program director has started to review application submissions for the Fall 2021 admissions.

4. Library and Information Competency

During the Fall the library will remain closed but is still open for anyone to come in and pick up any resources or devices. They are also working on a website for the library, to make it easier to filter and search for what you need.

5. CoDE

- We talked about consent forms from professors to allow their classes to be recorded, this form has been legally approved and will be filled out by every student once a semester.

incorporate those arches and bridges into our logo. The bridges serve as a metaphor for

the students because when they start out they are unsure of what they want to major in,

what they want to achieve, and where they want to go. When they cross that bridge they

cross all those challenges that they have faced and get to the other side of that bridge

which is their goal. We also touched up the mascot and changed the font/lettering to give

it more flair. The goal is to fully transition to having all the new logos and signage by
