February 15

Final transfer application deadline.



Application Requirements

- Common Application, accessible at admission.usc.edu/commonapp. We do not require the Common Application's College Report.
- Official transcripts from any and all colleges attended, showing coursework completed through fall and winter terms.
- · Final, official high school transcript with graduation date.
- Portfolio, resumé and/or additional writing samples if required by major.
 Performance majors may also require auditions.
- Recommendation letters for some majors. Please refer to your program of interest for more information.
- International students only: Financial statement and TOEFL (in-person or home edition; however, we are not accepting the TOEFL Plus for China), IELTS (in-person or home edition), PTE Academic or Duolingo English Test scores.
