SUBJECT: APPROVING ADJUSTED TRUSTEE AREA BOUNDARIES

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DESCRIPTION OF HISTORY / BACKGROUND

Under Section 5019.5 of the Education Code, “following each decennial federal census, and using population figures as validated by the Demographic Research Unit of the Department of Finance as a basis, the governing board of each ... community college district in which trustee areas have been established, and in which each trustee is elected by the residents of the area the trustee represents, shall adjust the boundaries of any or all of the trustee areas of the district so that one or both of the following conditions is satisfied:

- (1) The population of each area is, as nearly as may be, the same proportion of the total population of the district as the ratio that number of governing board members elected from the area bears to the total number of members of the governing board.
- (2) The population of each area is, as nearly as may be, the same proportion of the total population of the district as each of the other areas.”

Glendale Community College (GCC) contracted with National Demographics Corporation (NDC) to ensure the timely and accurate completion of this process.

NDC analysis indicates that based on the 2020 Census data released at the end of September 2021, the total population of Glendale Community College District is 219,613, thus the ideal population for each of the five GCCD trustee areas should be 43,923. Without adjustment the variation for each of the five areas would be as follows:

- Area 1 – population 44,083 – 160 above the ideal
- Area 2 – population 43,358 – 565 below the ideal
- Area 3 – population 42,686 – 1,237 below the ideal
- Area 4 – population 42,246 – 1,677 below the ideal
- Area 5 – population 47,240 – 3,317 above the ideal

It is not necessary that each of the five trustee areas have the same population count. The expectation is that the areas be “population balanced, which is considered to be a population difference between the largest and the smallest trustee areas that is no more than 10%. Based on the population balanced criteria, there is a need to shift some of the population of Trustee Area 5, the largest population Area, to Trustee Area 4, the smallest population Area.

Two options for adjusting the boundaries of Trustee Areas 4 and 5 are presented in the attached as Option A Plan and Option B Plan. Both options are consistent with the Board legal and policy criteria governing redistricting adopted November 18, 2014 (including: equal in population as defined by law; boundaries not gerrymandered; not result in denial or abridgement of right to vote on account of race or color; observe communities of interest; compact, cohesive and contiguous; observe topography, geography, roads, etc. as natural divisions; avoid pairing of incumbents).

**Option A Plan** boundary changes would result in shifting 2,592 population from Trustee Area 5 to Trustee Area 4 by expanding Trustee Area 5 to include a clear rectangular area to include Chevy Chase Drive on the west and East Broadway on the north beyond the present E. Colorado Street boundary. This adjustment would result in the following:

- Area 1 – population 44,083 – 160 above the ideal
- Area 2 - population 43,358 – 565 below the ideal
- Area 3 – population 42,686 – 1,237 below the ideal
- Area 4 – population 44,838 – 915 above the ideal
- Area 5 – population 44,648 – 725 above the ideal

There is a 5% variation between the smallest population sized Area 3 and largest population sized Area 4.

**Option B Plan** boundary changes would result in shifting 2,434 population from Trustee Area 5 to Trustee Area 4 by expanding Trustee Area 5 to include new territory between E. Colorado Street and East Harvard Street to the north and South Glendale Avenue on the west and South Verdugo Road on the east. This adjustment would result in the following:

- Area 1 – population 44,083 – 160 above the ideal
- Area 2 – population 43,358 – 565 below the ideal
- Area 3 – population 42,686 – 1,237 below the ideal
- Area 4 – population 44,680 – 757 above the ideal
- Area 5 – population 44,806 – 853 above the ideal

There is a 5% variation between the smallest population sized Area 3 and largest population sized Area 5.

Board action on the adjustment in boundaries must be taken by December 15, 2021 in preparation for the next Board election scheduled for June 7, 2022.

Following approval, the new trustee map information will be submitted to the Los Angeles County Registrar's Office.

#### RECOMMENDATION

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES  
OF THE GLENDALE COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT  
APPROVING ADJUSTED TRUSTEE AREA BOUNDARIES

WHEREAS, The Glendale Community College District (“District”) currently uses a by-trustee area election process to elect its governing board members; and

WHEREAS, Education Code section 5019.5 requires community college districts that elect by-trustee area to adjust the trustee area boundaries following each decennial federal census using population figures validated by the Population Research Unit of the Department of Finance; and

WHEREAS, the adjustments shall ensure that the population of each trustee area is proportional pursuant to Education Code section 5019.5(a)(1) or (2); and

WHEREAS, District staff and consultant have prepared two draft adjusted trustee area boundary option plans for the Board to consider; and

WHEREAS, the Board conducted a public hearing on December 13, 2021 to receive public input and comment on the two draft option plans; and

WHEREAS, the Board has considered all such public input and comment on the option plans; and

WHEREAS, the Board desires to adopt the Option A Plan for use effective for the June 7, 2022 general election and thereafter until further adjusted by the Board.

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Board of the Glendale Community College District as follows:

1. That the above recitals are true and correct.
2. That the Board hereby adopts the Option A Plan.
3. That the Superintendent and/or designee take all actions necessary to implement the Option A Plan in time for the next governing board member election in June of 2022.

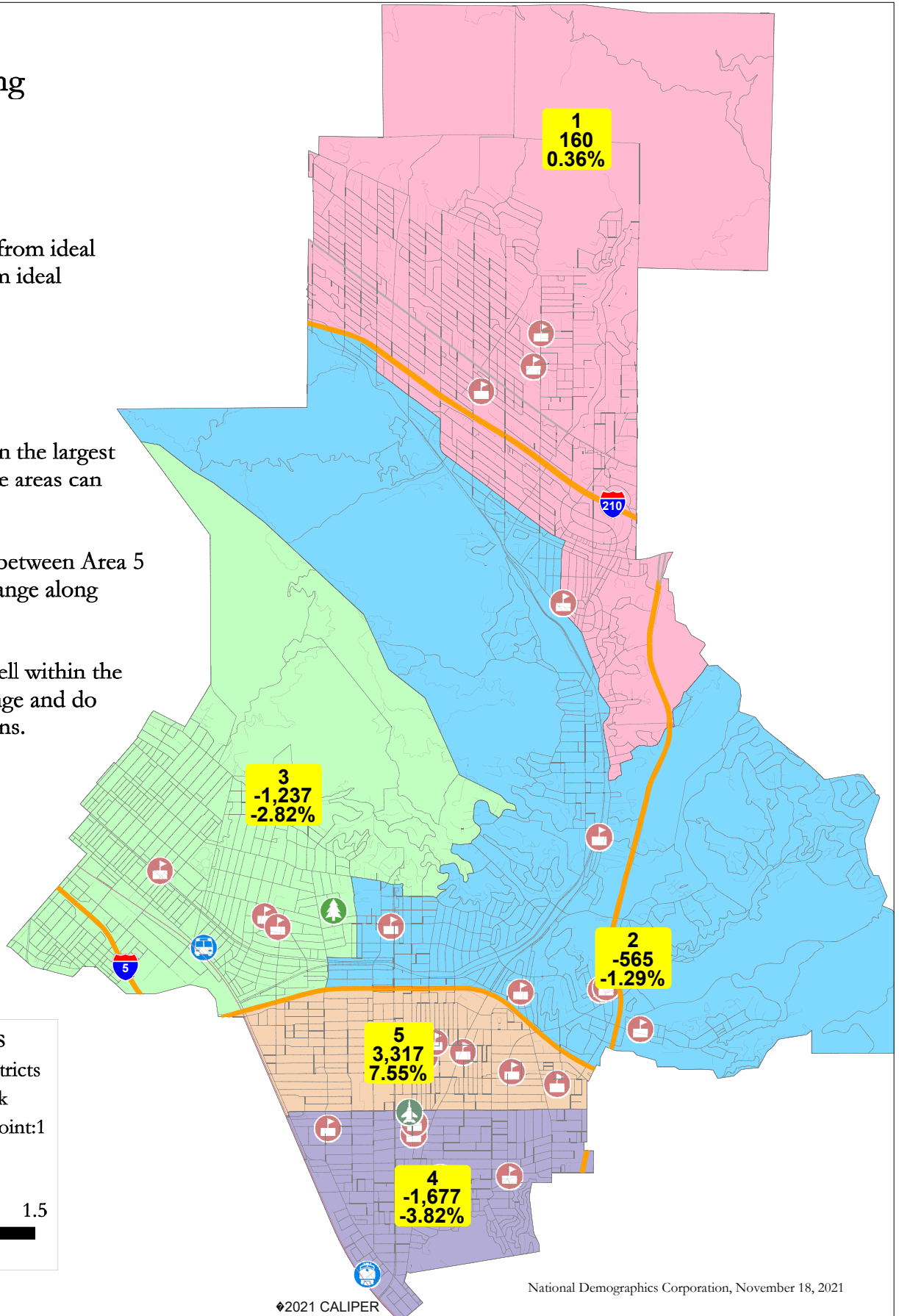

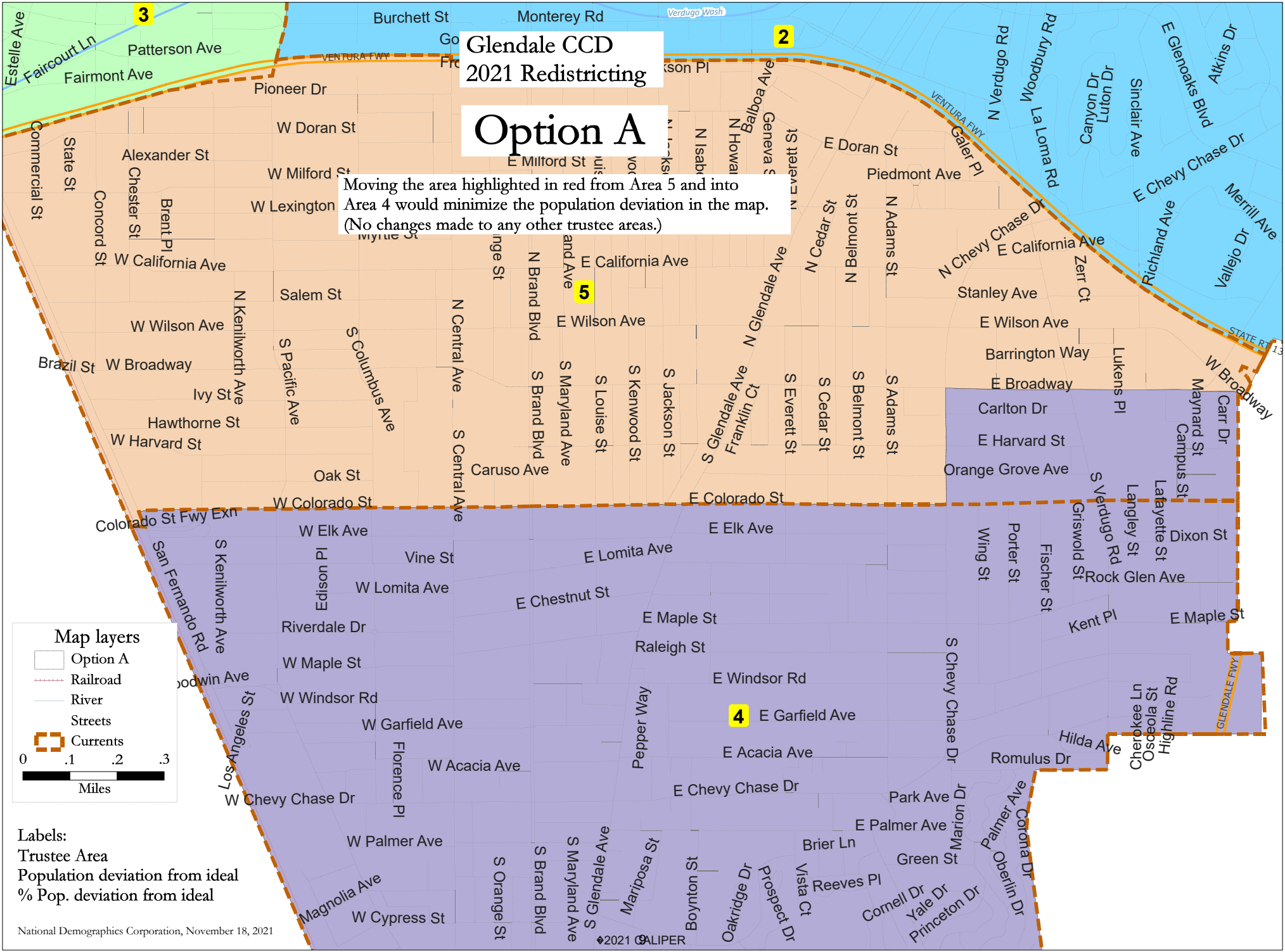

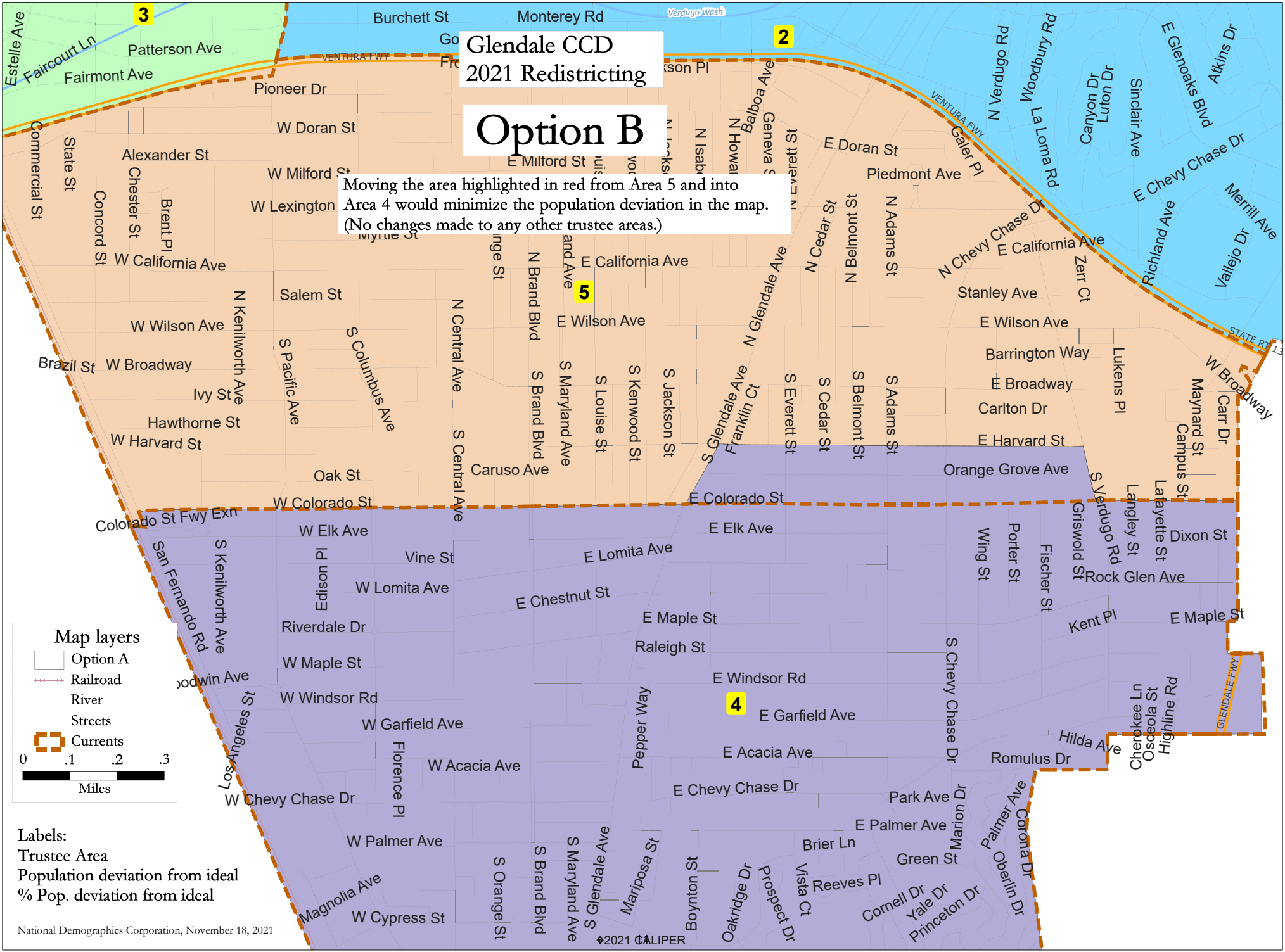
