Administrative Regulation

COMMUNICABLE DISEASE – APPLICANTS AND EMPLOYEES

Successful applicants for academic, classified staff or administrator positions shall be required to provide the following:

- A medical certificate showing that the applicant is free from any communicable disease, including, but not limited to, active tuberculosis, unfitting the applicant to instruct or associate with students.
- The medical certificate shall be submitted by a physician as authorized by the Education Code.
- The medical examination is conducted not more than six months before the submission of the certificate.
- An offer of employment maybe extended to an academic, classified staff or administrative applicant subject to the submission of the required medical certificate.
- The medical certificate becomes a part of the personnel record of the employee and is open to the employee or his/her/their designee.

The District may require academic, classified staff or administrators to undergo periodic medical examinations to determine if they are free from any communicable disease, including, but not limited to, active tuberculosis, unfitting the employee to instruct or associate with students.
