SUBJECT: ENROLLMENT UPDATE

DESCRIPTION OF HISTORY / BACKGROUND

California community colleges' apportionment revenues from the state are based on the enrollments of resident students. Enrollments are converted into Full-Time Equivalent Students (FTES) numbers for apportionment reporting. The attached report includes updated enrollment numbers and projections.

One FTES, whether credit or noncredit, is defined by state regulations as 525 hours of student contact. Most credit courses use a weekly accounting method: They meet the same number of hours every week, and apportionment is based on a calculation of hours per week times number of weeks divided by 525. Credit courses shorter than a full semester (such as 8-week courses, or Summer and Winter courses) use an analogous daily accounting method. Both weekly and daily courses use a census date to determine enrollments and FTES.

All noncredit courses and a small number of credit courses use positive attendance accounting, which is not based on enrollment and class sessions per week but rather on the actual hours that students attend class. Each student's attendance is tracked for every class session. The total number of attendance hours is divided by 525 to calculate FTES based on positive attendance. FTES based on positive attendance is more difficult to project than FTES based on weekly or daily accounting because students' actual attendance must be tracked every day, rather than using a defined census date.

Due to the COVID-19 emergency, the Chancellor's Office has approved alternative positive attendance methods for classes held through distance education. The table included her shows actual FTES rather than FTES calculated by this method. This report is being submitted for informational purposes.

Board Policy

RETIREE HEALTH BENEFITS: ACADEMIC EMPLOYEES

The District shall permit any former academic employee who has retired from the District to enroll in the health and welfare benefit plan and/or dental care benefit plan currently provided to its current academic employees. In addition, the District shall also permit the enrollment of the surviving spouse of a former academic employee who either retired from the District or was, at the time of his/her/their death, employed by the District as an academic employee and a member of the State Teacher's Retirement System.

Enrollment pursuant to this policy shall be at the retiree or surviving spouse's own expense.

A retired academic employee or surviving spouse may enroll in the District's health and welfare benefit plans only once pursuant to this policy. A retired academic employee or surviving spouse who voluntarily terminates coverage under this policy may be excluded from obtaining coverage again.

The Superintendent/President shall establish procedures as may be deemed necessary to administer this policy in accordance with Education Code Sections 7000 et seq.

COLLEGE POLICE DEPARTMENT

The Board has established a police department under the supervision of one Chief of Police, who shall report directly to the Superintendent/President. The purpose of the department is to enforce the law on or near the campus(es) and other grounds or properties owned, operated, controlled or administered by the District or by the State acting on behalf of the District.

<u>District police officers shall be employed as members of the classified service but shall, when duly sworn, be peace officers as defined by law. Prior to employment, they shall satisfy the training requirements set out in Penal Code Sections 830 et seq.</u>

The Superintendent/President shall establish minimum qualifications of employment for the Chief of Police including, but not limited to, prior employment as a peace officer or completion of a peace officer training course approved by the Commission on Peace Officers' Standards and Training.

The Superintendent/President shall ensure that every member of the police department first employed by the District before July 1, 1999, satisfies the requirements of state law regarding qualifications for continued employment.

Every member of the police department shall be issued a suitable identification card and badge bearing words "Glendale Community College Police Department.'

The Superintendent/President, in cooperation with the Chief of Police, shall issue such other regulations as may be necessary for the administration of the police department.

To assist the college raise funds for three of its major facilities priorities: Athletics, Science, and Performing and Media Arts. Ms. Semler announced the Foundation would engage in a three-year phased effort to raise at least \$1 million to provide equipment enhancements and provide an operations endowment for each of the three areas. She detailed the findings of the feasibility study conducted to identify what needed to be done for a successful campaign and actions now underway.

Culpepper presented a status report on the \$67.4 million received from the State and Federal government to address COVID-19 issues and detailed how the funds were being used for direct student-related support, mitigating lost revenue due to the pandemic, providing instruction and student services in a remote environment, assuring prevention and mitigation of the virus, and supporting needs of college personnel.

DESCRIPTION OF HISTORY / BACKGROUND:

Biotechnology AS Degree

The AS degree in Biotechnology provides a strong foundation for transfer to a college (two- or four year) to complete a BS in Biotechnology. It also prepares students with the foundation in microbiology, molecular and cell biology laboratory skills and soft skills that meet industry standards for employment in biotech industry (e.g. life science technician and biological science technician) and in academic research institutions. Students may petition to use IGETC for STEM majors in place of our local GE requirements. Students must complete all required core courses for a total of 25-30 units. To gain authentic, hands-on research experience, students are recommended to take the BIOL 298 path and conduct the internship (BIOL 50) at a four-year college prior to transfer. Required courses: BIOL 101, 112, 122 OR 140, plus BIOL 141 OR 298, and BIOL 142 and BIOL 50, and CHEM 110, and ENGL 101 and Math 100.

Biotechnology Certificate of Achievement

The Biotechnology Certificate of Achievement Program is the first that introduces students to the field of biotechnology through building and strengthening the basic biotechnology laboratory skills and soft skills that meet industry standards in a series of courses. This program prepares studentswith the basic skills for entry level positions in biotechnology, such as manufacturing technician, inaddition to providing them with the basic foundation in microbiology, molecular and cell biology laboratory skills for undergraduate research at four-year colleges. To gain authentic, hands-on research experience, students are recommended to take the BIOL 298 path prior to transfer to a four-year college. Students must complete all required core courses for a total of 15-17 units. Required courses: BIOL 101 or 112 or 122 or 140; BIOL 141 or 298; ENGL 101; Math 100.

Biotechnology Research Lab Assistant

The Biotechnology Research Lab Assistant Certificate of Achievement Program is the second levelthat introduces students to the field of biotechnology through strengthening and building on the basic biotechnology laboratory skills and soft skills that meet industry standards in a series of courses. This program prepares students with the skills for entry level and laboratory research assistant positions in biotechnology, such as manufacturing and biomanufacturing technician, in addition to providing them with the foundation in microbiology, molecular and cell biology laboratoryskills for undergraduate research at four-year colleges. To gain authentic, hands-on research experience, students are recommended to take the BIOL 298 path prior to transfer to a four-year college. Students must complete all required core courses for a total of 19 - 21 units. Required courses: BIOL 101 or 112 or 122 or 140; BIOL 141 or 298; BIOL 142; ENGL 101; Math 100.

Biotechnology Research Lab Technician

The Biotechnology Research Lab Technician Certificate of Achievement Program is the third level that introduces students to the field of biotechnology through strengthening and building on the basic and advanced biotechnology laboratory skills and soft skills that meet industry standards in a series of courses. This program prepares students with the skills for laboratory technician positions in biotechnology and in academic research institutions, such as life science technician and biological technician (with a bachelor's degree). The program also provides students with the foundation in microbiology, molecular and cell biology laboratory skills for undergraduate research at four-year colleges. To gain authentic, hands-on research experience, students are recommended to take the BIOL 298 path and conduct internship (BIOL 50) at a four-year college prior to transfer toa four-year college. Students must complete all required core courses for a total of 25-30 units. Required courses: BIOL 101 or 112 or 122 or 140; BIOL 141 or 298; BIOL 142; BIOL 50; CHEM 110; ENGL 101; Math 100.

The goals of this Biotechnology Associate in Science degree are to prepare students for employment biotech industry and at the university in addition to preparing students for to a four-year college or Bachelor in Science degree in Biotechnology. Students in this program acquire and apply knowledge and hands-on techniques in fundamental molecular and cell biology, genetics and chemistry in living organisms, basic biotechnology laboratory skills. DESCRIPTION OF HISTORY/BACKGROUND

KIN 48 – Kinesiology International Field Study

KIN 48 provides college credit for travel and study in foreign countries at the student's own expense in programs provided by agencies approved in advance by the College and under the direction of a Glendale Community College instructor.

MATH 111 – College Algebra for Business and Liberal Arts

MATH 111 is a college (transfer) level course in algebra designed for majors in Business and the Liberal Arts. Students explore mathematical topics pertinent to business, finance, and the liberal arts. These topics include functions and their inverses, transformations of functions, solving equations and inequalities, logarithmic and exponential equations, applications in finance, complex numbers, systems of equations, and graphs of linear, quadratic, polynomial, exponential, and logarithmic functions.

MATH 134 – Decision Mathematics

MATH 134 is a one-semester course in quantitative reasoning about decisions. Students not only learn these techniques, but also interpret and communicate their results.

DESCRIPTION OF HISTORY/BACKGROUND

The Garfield Parking and Landscape Project provides for the demolition of the existing buildings on the acquired properties as well and the construction of additional parking, landscape and open space areas. The design-build project delivery approach integrates people, systems, business structures, and practices into a process that collaboratively harnesses the talents and insights of all participants to optimize project results, increase value to the owner, reduce waste, and maximize efficiency through all phases of design, fabrication, and construction.

Proposals were received for the Garfield Parking and Landscape Project. DESCRIPTION OF HISTORY/BACKGROUND

Central Plant #1 must be expanded from its current 500-tons capacity to a capacity of 1500-tons to support the needs of the New Science Building and the proposed Instructional Building and Conference Center. The college conducted an energy efficiency and modernization study to determine potential energy saving measures with the expansion of Central Plant #1.

The study found significant costs savings when comparing the energy consumption per BTU of the existing plant vs. the proposed modernized plant. California Code Section 4217 provides a public agency may enter into agreements for energy conservation measures without engaging in a bidding process. Code Section 4217 therefore allows Glendale Community College District (GCCD) to enter into a contract with DPR Construction (DPR) for the CP1 project. DPR is the firm that is managing the construction of the New science Building (NSB).

It is in the best interest of GCCD to contract with DPR for the CP1 project because the NSB and CP1 projects require close coordination. DPR has presented a guaranteed maximum price (GMP) proposal to construct the CP1 project.

Glendale Community College District Board Policy 2435: *Evaluation of Superintendent/President* calls for the Superintendent/President to be evaluated annually by the Board of Trustees with input from the faculty, staff and students.

- H. The Superintendent/President shall act as the professional advisor to the Board in policy formation.

SUBJECT: FEDERAL GRANTS APPLICATIONS ELIGIBILITY

DESCRIPTION OF HISTORY / BACKGROUND

Glendale Community College has obtained a number of Federal Title III and Title V grants over the past few years. These grant programs are designed to improve academic quality, institutional management, and fiscal stability, with an emphasis on institutions that enroll large portions of minority and financially disadvantaged students. GCC grants have focused on those available to designated Hispanic-serving institutions.

Examples of these grants received are:

- Gateway Program: \$4,249,639 received over five years for opening the gateway to STEM degrees for Hispanic and other underprepared students (2011-2016)
- GAUSS Program: \$5,865,324 received over five years for building a more responsive STEM environment at GCC for underserved Hispanic and other low-income students (2011-2016)
- Abriendo Caminos Program: \$2,740,722 received over five years for building a completion pathway for Hispanic and other highneed students (2015-2020)
- Adelante GCC Program: \$3,000,000 to be received over five years for advancing GCC toward Hispanic-serving institution excellence (2020-2025)
- BIEN in STEM (Belonging Increased by Effective Networking in Service To Educational Meaning) Program: \$5,000,000 to be received over five years for improving overall completion rates and closing equity gaps that exist between GCC's Hispanic and non-Hispanic STEM students (2021-2026)

To establish eligibility for Title III and Title V grants in 2022, the Federal government has added a requirement that the governing body of the institution "duly authorize" applications for eligibility for FY 2022.

Governor's January 2022 Budget; Impact on Key GCC sources and uses of revenue

<u>Investments</u>; <u>Long-Term (on-going) vs. Short-Term (one-time)</u>

Long-Term

The Governor has proposed that \$842 million be invested in long-term appropriation increases and \$983 million in short-term increases in K-14 institutions. The long-term investments include a proposed cost of living adjustment (COLA) of 5.33%. A COLA adjustment of this percentage will increase GCC's base 2021-22 revenues by approximately \$5 million.

Short-Term

GCC will benefit from a \$387.6 million investment in deferred maintenance. The short-term investment will provide approximately \$4.7 million toward GCC's capital maintenance projects.

Investment Weakness

The Governor's January budget does not include provisions to mitigate the surge of the Omicron variant; however, the Governor will consider this matter in the May revise.

Student Centered Funding Formula (SCFF)

The Governor's budget removes the risk of the District revenue dropping below the 2024-25 apportionment amount. GCC's risk of losing the \$6 supplemental hold harmless amount is removed. The 2024-25 apportionment will become GCC's new base amount. The 2024-25 amount will be used as the base amount to calculate additional COLA increase going forward from 2024-25.

CalPers/CalStrs Employer Contribution Rate

The District's contribution rate will remain the same as 2021-22; 22.91% CalPers and 16.92% CalStrs.

Full-Time Faculty Obligation (FON)

Education Code Section 87482.6 recognizes the goal of the Board of Governors that 75% of the hours of credit instruction in the California Community Colleges should be taught by full-time faculty.

Fifty Percent Law

A requirement related to budget levels is a statutory requirement that each District spend at least half of its Current Expense of Education each fiscal year for salaries and benefits of classroom instructors. Under existing law, a district may apply for an exemption under limited circumstances.

- GCC CARES completed the Fall 2021 emergency grant program, by processing over 7,000 applications, awarding over 6,250 students, and distributing over \$9,000,000 in emergency grants to support student success. The program has approximately \$8.1 million in funds remaining which will go to support students in Winter and Spring of 2022.
- The GCC CARES Fresh Success CalFresh Employment & Training Program had enrolled over 250 participants by the end of December 2021.
- GCC CARES onboarded and trained 15 CalFresh Ambassadors, selected from over 180 applicants, to serve in volunteer roles for the spring 2021 semester.
- GCC CARES partnered with Assemblywoman Laura Friedman and DoorDash to host a food donation drive, and received a generous donation from DoorDash to provide 200 students with hot meals from local restaurants.
- After 17 months (535 days) without intercollegiate sports competition at GCC, the Vaqueros returned and completed a challenging Fall 2021 sports season that culminated on November 20th with a GCC football victory at the College of the Desert and Men's and Women's Cross Country competing in the CCCAA State Championships.
- Throughout the Fall 2021 season, Vaquero athletics training staff members, Jose Gomez, Claudia Orejuela, and Melissa Ramos administered 1,963 PCR tests to student athletes to ensure their safety. Of the 167 student athletes who competed for five teams in Fall 2021, only 1.6% tested positive for Covid-19 thanks to the efforts of the Athletics Department staff to comply with state, county and CCCAA regulations.
- Women's Cross-Country won its 16th straight Western State Conference title, finished third in the Southern California Championships, and sixth in the State Championships. The Men's Cross-Country team narrowly missed out on its fifth straight WSC title with a second-place conference finish, placed fourth in the Southern California championships, and sixth in the State Championships.
