SPAN 131 is a course of intensive practice for improving oral communicative skills in the Spanish language while exploring culturally significant topics in the Spanish-speaking world. By means of a variety of media such as short films, comic strips, and readings in different genres by important literary figures, students participate in conversational tertulias as they review and practice the use of grammatically correct constructions, expand their vocabulary to enable them to express their opinions, and develop their socio-cultural awareness. Class is conducted primarily in Spanish.
