# **FAFSA**

Who should file a FAFSA?
U.S. Citizens or eligible noncitizens with a valid social security (not DACA). Males between ages of 18 and 25, must register for selective service.

## What will I need to apply

- Student's License # (if applicable)
- Student's SSN or Permanent Resident #
- Student Date of Birth
- Parent 1 Date of Birth
- Parent 1 Social Security (if applicable)
- Parent 2 Date of Birth
- Parent 2 Social Security (if applicable)
- Date of Parent Married, Remarried, Divorced, or Widowed (if applicable)
- Parent(s) total cash savings, checking account value
- State Disability received (if applicable)
- Child Support amount received or paid (if applicable)

#### Documents I need to bring with me:

- Student W-2 (if student worked)
- Parent(s) W-2 (if parent worked)
- Students most recent Tax Return
- Parent(s) most recent Tax Return
- If you or your parent(s) received any of the following please provide the necessary information:
  - Social Security (Disability/Supplemental), TANF (Welfare), Worker's Comp., WIC, Food Stamps

# CA Dream Act Application (CADAA)

### Who should file a CADAA?

Undocumented students or DACA students. Students must meet AB540 criteria. Males between the ages of 18-25, must register for selective service.

### **AB540 Eligibility Criteria**

- Attend a California school for 3 or more years
- 2. Graduate with a High School Diploma or GED equivalent
- 3. Enroll in an accredited higher education institution in California
- 4. Must file an affidavit, stating that the filer will apply for legal residency as soon as possible.
- 5. Must NOT hold a valid non-immigrant visa (F, J, H, L, A, E, etc.)
