





TRAFFIC DIAGRAM


The traffic is pretty busy around the site. This information is based on typical traffic on Sundays.


PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION DIAGRAM

There are several renowned museums such as GRAMMY Museum LA Live and Grid Gallery.




Since South Park is a popular entertainment district, there are a lot of hotels and motels on the site.



Many events or festivals take place events in the Staple Studium or the Convention Center.


One of the concepts of this project is "community." Since there are multiple communities in Downtown Los Angeles, this building provides an alternative type of community for residences.



Three units make a shared garden at the center.








The units on the roofs

make shared gardens.







One of the concepts of this project is the "green area." This building has the green spaces which are coexisted with the community. The residents can enjoy working inside the building.








The residents enjoy water features inside the building.




The voids between each unit allow sunlight to penetrate the buildina.







CLIENT'S NEED

His favorite design taste is a modern house, on the other hand, her favorite taste is a traditional building. Therefore, this ho use has two different faces answering their needs.

To increase value as a residential building, it has two different time directions; one-way and circulation. The material of this building has an aging effect. This represents the "one-way" direction. Around the building, Trees which enriches each different season are planted. This represents the "circular" direction. These two different directions make each point of the time enrich.







On the second floor, people see the transition of skies. In the morning, the sunrise gives them a fresh air of the beginning of the day. The sun shines vividly. At night, beautiful stairs shine in the sky.



TRANSITON OF TREES


On the ground level, people experience the transition of trees, and there are specific trees which enrich each seasons. It tells them the clear difference for each four seasons.

A-A' SECTION VIEW











THEATER ROOM




VOLUME

The site is surrounded by three main streets of this area; 2nd Street, San Pedro St., and Los Angeles St.. Access to this site is easy and convenient.




OPEN SPACE


















FABLICATION

WOODEN FRAME


A 40 ft height wooden frame covers the whole entire open space in front of the entrance. This is a buffer zone of this mall.

On the ground level, visitors enjoy fabrication. They can interact with each other and do installation on the open space outside.







