**II. New Business**

DE addendum and CORs (**Rohrbacher**)

**Motion:** All course outlines of record (CORs), for new and/or revised courses, shall have a Distance Education (DE) addendum attached.

**Rohrbacher:** We have been getting some guidance and instruction from the Chancellor's Office telling all community colleges that every course that we offer has to have a DE addendum attached to it.

**Dr. Ritterbrown:** Federal and State regulations say that if you conduct instruction using any media other than face to face it is distance education or correspondence education. Distance Education requires that instructors be certified through IOTL and remote synchronous instruction does not have that requirement. We're working on a plan to update all courses and programs to certify them with the state. We will not, however, relax our local standards in terms of requiring that instructors have distance education certification. We do have an MOU with the guild, which says, under the current circumstances, if instructors are unable to provide synchronous instruction or if synchronous is preferable in terms of pedagogy that they may relax the standards for synchronous remote instruction.

**Rohrbacher:** Having a DE designation for a course does not mean that the course has to be taught as a distance education course. It just gives the option and makes it valid to be taught as DE. Faculty should have the choice of teaching DE or not. In addition, we have a lot of course outlines that are expired that need to come through C&I so they can be approved by CoDE for a DE addendum.

**Dr. Ritterbrown:** Yes, I think that the first priority has to be bringing the expired outlines up to date and it's not a recommendation. We have to do it. The second priority over the summer probably will be to attach DE addenda to every course, and we do have until the end of 2020. To get this project done, we will have a blanket addenda for summer and fall and we're already working on that so that were covered by the state, but we just want to be in a position where we can, if this continues, which is a very real possibility, that we will be able to have courses properly approved and so that's our goal. If this situation continues, people will be allowed to continue with synchronous remote instruction to the degree possible but it's advisable for as many people as possible to get their certification and it is required for us to bring our courses and programs up to date.

[There was a discussion about why so many courses are out of date. The main reason is that divisions are not updating their course outlines.]

**Dr. Ritterbrown:** I think this is an opportunity to say that we need to bring these forward, that there is no longer an excuse, and that we have a pressing need to bring them forward.

**Traynor:** I believe earlier Eric was saying in the division chairs meeting that the blanket will cover everything. You know, if we offer the course as a distance education course for fall, it's basically when we put that course down on the blanket DE addendum, we are telling the state, we are guaranteeing that we're going to put this through and get a DE certified by the time December 2020 hits.

**Dr. Ritterbrown:** That's my understanding. [ACCJC Standard IV: A. 4; Standard IV: A. 5—leadership and governance]

**MSC (Frontini/Margaryan)** to approve that all course outlines of record (CORs), for new and/or revised courses, shall have a Distance Education (DE) addendum attached.

	<b>Palermo/Kretzmann</b>							
	Palermo: We're trying to make our backup plan for if we can no longer place students into developmental math. Our backup plan is to have students							
	take 102, which is trigonometry before taking pre-calculus. We think that our students will have a better success. We changed the prerequisites, course content, SLOs, and matched the exit standards to the CID.							
	Palermo: Math 102S is with a support lab and Math 102+ combines both 102 and 102S with no corequisite. Math 102 is not UC transferable.							
	Rohrbacher: So none of these courses is considered developmental right?							
	Palermo: Technically 102S is because it's not transfer level. It's kind of like a developmental supplement covering the algebra.							
	It was discussed that it is sort of like the English division's ENGL 199 course.							
	Corequisite questions were discussed and Palermo mentioned they want the 102 and 102S to be like Math 136 and 336. It was mentioned to word it that if a student takes 102S, then they have to take 102. However, if a student takes 102, they are not required to take 102S.							
	Mack: On the exit standards all of them have the number 1 in front of them.							
	Palermo: I will fix that.							
	It was questioned what happened to Math 100 and discussed that it is still offered as a terminal course but no longer leads to calculus.							
	It was mentioned that there was a credit limitation for taking math 100, 102, and 110 but that is not going to be the case anymore. [ACCJC Standard II: A. 3—learning outcomes]

Palermo: We added a recommended prep of ENGL 101 and updated the prerequisites based on AB705. Data shows that the success rates jumped by about 8% when students took and passed ENGL 101. Math 136+ is replacing the Math 136 and 336 combo and we also changed the units.									
It was mentioned that the requisites for all three courses should match.									
Mack: Is there going to be a note that says students who take these courses won't get credit for ECON 127?									
Palermo: Math division is still discussing it.
