Skill Awards (Rohrbacher)

Rohrbacher: As a committee we should define what skill awards are and what they should include.

Saucedo: Requirements for skill awards are changing and should now include LMI data and submission to LACORC. (ACCJC Standard II. A. 3 using established procedures to assess programs)

2019 Curriculum Institute Report (Rohrbacher/Traynor)

Some information that was gathered at the Institute was that we should review the vision or mission statement periodically, courses with prerequisites being added or changed need to have a second motion as well. C&I should hold a retreat, meeting, or training about Guided Pathways, AB 705, and other things besides curriculum items. It is important to advertise new courses and programs.

Kretzmann: Are we going to move away from print catalogs? We do not want to upload information about courses and programs on our webpages until it is in our catalog or at least online.

Articulation update (Cortes)

We are having a C-ID challenge because we have to constantly check if any changes have been made. The reviewers don't get notifications. AB 1786- All community colleges have expanded the credit by exam policy to credit by prior learning. The Chancellor's office said to accept subjects that military and veterans have been bringing. There will be a pure distinction with credit by exam and courses taken here. For the TMC site, Google TMC Chancellor's Office and it is the 1st link. **Traynor:** When completing TMCs, make sure they all look the same and also look at the outline to make sure it is current. (ACCJC Standard II. A. 5 ensuring proper academic rigor)

Thai: How they can relay their composure under stress. Patients are seen on the acuity and complexity of their condition.									
It was discussed that the catalog statement had some terms that students might not understand. However, it was determined that a nurse reading the description would know what the terms are and their meanings.									
Mack: For the course content, can we break them down a little with subtopics?									
Calderone: Add simulated care studies to out of class assignment #1.
