### **Course Content Standardization (Rohrbacher)**

Cortes-Make sure the content here is the full content and not just the C-ID descriptions. C-ID Descriptors are like a skeleton of the course. Often, course content needs to be added, especially for CSU/UC/USC transfer courses.

Rohrbacher- Course descriptions need to include main topics and sub-topics.

### **Supplemental Forms (Rohrbacher)**

Rohrbacher- When doing course proposals, these forms are needed for prerequisites, requisites, and recommended preps. When you are asked for a supplemental form in CMS, click “Supplementals” and fill in the forms as well as provide rationales. New courses need Box 1 and 3. Revised courses need Boxes 2 and 3, which now work, so you can put rationales in these boxes. Please read the form carefully and fill it out as completely as possible. Ask for help if you need it.

Repeatability form only needs to be filled out for the classes that have repeatability.

### **CIP and SAM Codes (Rohrbacher)**

Rohrbacher-Provide CIP codes for courses and programs.

Karpp- CIP codes for programs are important to keep consistent.

Saucedo- CIP codes are used for classification of courses nationally. Relate them to SOC codes because they line up with the labor market codes. Also use the CIP to TOP code crosswalk to ensure both codes link up. SAM code is for occupational status.

Traynor- TOP code-general, CIP code-specific, and SOC code- even more specific.

**II. New Business**

**2018-2019 C&I Schedule (Rohrbacher)**

Rohrbacher- New schedule has been created and checked multiple times. It follows the same pattern we have been following. Please let me know if corrections are needed.

**Articulation update (Cortes)**

Cortes-If courses count heavily for transfer, we do not have control over them. UC faculty approves them and then they go to the Chancellor's office for approval. These courses are not effective immediately. There is a cycle of transfer—set mechanisms for UC transfer and IGETC (IGETC doesn't get reviewed until after UC). So, please allow at least one year for new courses to go through the cycle of articulation.

Cortes-Title V and Ed Code say we can't use a +/- system, but C- counts in CSU/GE Breadth transfer. We are trying to get legal advice from the Chancellor's Office regarding the use of C-, especially since the UC Chancellor's office now accepts C- for UC Breadth. As a college, we can accept C- from other colleges, but we can't assign C-. The CSU accepts C-, so why can't community colleges? SMC and LACC want to allow students to use C- for Breadth.

Traynor- It is up to the division chairs to check with Richard about when courses are ready to be taught and to make the decision whether to offer them before they've completed the articulation cycle. If courses are offered before they're finished with the articulation cycle, it could affect students negatively, as those courses may not be able to transfer.
