From CSUN: Since 1984, **Jodi Johnson** has provided support for students with disabilities on the CSUN campus while serving in a variety of student assistant, staff and administrative positions. In her current role as director of DRES, she provides leadership and direction to the department while helping other campus entities understand their impact in providing an accessible and inviting campus for students with disabilities.



From UCLA: **Alex Mazzeo** (he/him) serves as a Disability Specialist at UCLA. His background includes a B.S. in Psychology and an M.Ed. in Student Personnel in Higher Education, both from the University of Florida. He is drawn to spaces where student development, educational equity, and social justice are centered. His work with students is driven by these values, and his hope is to bring disability justice into the political consciousness of college campuses.



From UCLA: **Addison Osuna-Wightman** is a Disability Specialist and a proud GCC alum, who earned her Addiction Studies certificate. She transferred to CSULA and earned her MS in Rehabilitation Counseling. She identifies as a person with a disability both physical and invisible. Her biggest interests today are disability justice, disability advocacy, animal rights and supporting people in recovery.

From USC: **Madison Shaw** serves as the Assistant Director of Policy, Programming & Evaluation. She provides direct support to a caseload of OSAS students, and assists with student service processes, outreach and educational events. She earned an M.Ed in Educational Counseling from the USC Rossier School of Education and an M.A. in Psychology from Touro University. Some of Madison's key interests include student mental health and well-being, and the retention and persistence of students with disabilities.
