THE PURPOSE OF DUAL ENROLLMENT

The Dual Enrollment Program at Glendale Community College provides an opportunity for qualified high school students to enhance their education by enrolling early in college courses. You will be able to experience college-level courses, explore career options, and shorten the time required to complete a college degree. You have the opportunity to earn high school and college credit simultaneously. The courses may be reflected on both your high school and college transcripts

ACADEMIC ADVISING FROM YOUR HIGH SCHOOL COUNSELOR

Students who wish to be enrolled in the Dual Enrollment Program must meet with their high school counselor first. The high school counselor will advise the student on eligibility to enroll in and successfully complete college classes. High School counselor can sign Dual Enrollment form and give a copy of unofficial transcript.

APPLICATION

High school students in the 9th, 10th, 11th or 12th grade who are making satisfactory progress towards high school graduation are eligible to apply and enroll in classes at GCC. The student must complete the online application and the Selected Student Form with appropriate signatures, and provide a current high school transcript (unofficial). The Selected Student Form and high school transcript must be submitted for each subsequent semester of attendance. If the student is accepted, the student may enroll in six (6) units during a semester or three (3) units during an inter-session. In order to continue taking classes at the college after the initial semester, the student must have completed the college class with a grade of "C" or better, and remain in good standing at their high school. Once the student has graduated from their high school, the student must reapply to GCC as a high school graduate and submit proof of graduation to the Admissions and Records Office.

SUBMIT HIGH SCHOOL DIGITAL FORM

GCC's summer schedule of classes are now available to view here. Enrollment for high school students for the summer session starts May 2nd 2022. If you are planning on enrolling in summer classes as a current high school student, you need to have a GCC ID number and a new annual form (Step 1 & 2) completed before that date to be able to register for classes.

ARTICULATION (STUDENTS/PARENTS)

Articulation is an agreement between two campuses. When a high school course is articulated with a college course, it means that the students who pass the high school class will be able to earn college credits for that course.

To earn college credit, a student must complete a full year of the high school course and earn a "B" or better in both semesters.
