I. Approval of Minutes

- III. Accreditation Work Groups Update and Timeline
  - a. Accreditation is on track.
  - b. Meetings are being held with various groups to discuss where their drafts are.
  - c. The evidence we need is being gathered.
  - d. Student reviewers have been set up and will be looking at the text of the draft as well as Classified Staff, etc.
    - i. Standards 2, 3 are with the reading team
    - ii. Standard 4 might be brought to the next IPCC meeting.
  - e. QFE Topic is something we need to decide on, write, and put into the document.
    - i. Beth Kronbeck spoke on the QFE having an umbrella that is lead by Guided Pathways for how we can improve equitable pedagogy.
    - ii. This will be taken over by Tiffany Ingle.
- IV. Enrollment Update
  - a. Credit was down 5% for winter. Winter for Noncredit was up 50% from last winter.

- b. Credit enrollment is down almost 17% for spring 2022.
- c. The state is is discussing declining numbers and the funding formula.
- d. How is Noncredit bouncing back?
  - i. Ramona Barillo-Sotillo stated that a lot of outreach was done.
  - ii. Having some face to face available early starting in summer of 2021 helped.
  - iii. Orientation to help people learn how to use technology.
  - iv. Refugees are enrolling. Perhaps immigration trends are a factor.

## V. Vaccine Mandates Effects on Planning

- a. Masks are no longer required in surrounding High Schools so this is something we may have to consider for the summer and fall terms. This is something we might need to keep in mind with regard to our feeder schools.
  - Although they have dropped masks, the schools are seeing a spike in their infection rates.
- b. We are committed through spring for our mask and vaccine mandates as well as our check-in stations. The sense is that we might be able to relax the check-in requirement and maybe the mask requirements but we are taking our cues from LA County. There has been an increase of infection in the K-12 with the relaxation of the mask restrictions.
- c. The check-in stations are not sustainable after HERFF funds run out.
