

INCOME TAXES: STUDENT SERVICE LEARNING, TAXES TIPS, AND THE IRS

VITA (Volunteer Income Tax Assistance) is a service learning program sponsored by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS). Students provide free tax preparation for the low income and the elderly after passing a course in income tax basics. Lessons learned from setting up, running and continuing the program will be presented. Also included will be a tax discussion concerning real estate investments versus tax free contributions to an IRAs or STRS plus other tax tips. The lecture will use the speaker's 17-year experience working with the IRS to discuss best ways to deal with this taxing authority.
