





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Field-Based Experiential Learning

Experiential Learning is defined as “learning through active participation in an activity, then taking time to reflect on the outcome”. Research shows that students retain information and exhibit a more sophisticated understanding of core concepts from an experiential learning environment compared to retention from a typical classroom lecture environment. This presentation will focus on Prof. Leaver’s almost 40 years of observations in immersive learning environments through independent travel, geography field trips, and study abroad programs. He will share his insights, highlights and pitfalls of a lifetime of travel, both near and far.
