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| <p><b>Universal PLO-</b> Prepare students for a career in the healthcare industry (<b>any discipline</b>) by completing the Health Care Administration (<b>any degree or certificate</b>) Certificate.</p> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• PLOs: Broadly written PLOs that can be used universal for pathways and SLOs. They could be used cross-disciplinary in preparation for something specific. The universal PLO could be tweaked to be discipline-specific. If we have PLOs that will be general and flexible they can help with program review, pathways, and department information. They are an accessible way to look at degree and certificate earnings. (Like 48, 49 and 50)</li> <li>• PLOs can be modified to department programs. A template, essentially</li> <li>• We will continue to discuss this in April.</li> </ul> |

## 1. Excel Spreadsheet Assessment Cycles (Document 4)

- Yvette will take the document to senate at May meeting with examples. She asks the committee to give feedback on the following:
- Layout with assessment of PLOS in the OFF years and then write reports at the end of the year.
- Flexible enough to have PLOS and SLOs at the same year, and divisions can do that how
- For courses not offered or run in 2 year cycle, there can be flexibility and notation code indicating the reason. However, our hope is that by creating a transparent plan for a 2 year cycle, we'll have less of instructors who "can't do it" since they were prepared. Some decisions about the planning can still be made at the department level: like planning course semester to semester and whether to run PLOs the same semester as SLOs.
- Rosemarie mentioned that when their faculty knew what was coming in advance there is more follow-through and the few reasons for not assessing are more valid.
