DEANNA NOE is Los Angeles-based actor who embodies a subtle form of emotional realism rarely glimpsed on the stage or screen. With a breadth of experience including everything from independent film to immersive theater, the Utah native has a profound gift for inhabiting characters who transcend societal norms of femininity, as well as for bringing depth and humanity to the most insidious antagonists. Their credits include many short films and the feature film, *A Good Girl*, but also immersive theatrical work including, HBO *Big Little Lies* Live Event, *Ingress Prime*, *Stars in the Night*, and *Soho House & Stranger Things* live event, "Stranger House." Self-identifying as gender fluid, Noe imbues each performance with a daring yet nuanced complexity, ultimately defying audience expectation to endlessly riveting effect.

GERI ULREY is a writer and director. Her narrative short films, "The Break" and "Pink no.22," have screened at numerous film festivals worldwide, each winning awards along the way. She recently completed the short film "to the flame" starring Deanna Noe. Geri holds an MFA in film directing and production from the UCLA School of Theater, Film and Television and a BA in drama from Vassar College.
