

UC Application Workshop – Fall 2024 Admission

University of California (UC)



- 10 campuses (9 undergraduate)
- Emphasis is on developing research skills
- Prepare students to advance to graduate and professional education programs
- Course content is mostly theoretical and analytical

Berkeley and Merced are the only campuses on the semester





Eligibility Requirements for Fall 2024 Transfer

You must complete the following requirements by the end of the spring term (in other words, not summer) prior to fall enrollment at a UC:

- 60 UC-transferable units
- 7-course pattern
- 2.4 GPA in UC-transferable coursework (2.8 if you're a nonresident)
- Required/recommended major preparation

When to Apply



Fall 2024 Admission: October 1 – November 30, 2023

The application fee is \$80 per campus; \$95 per campus for international and non-immigrant applicants

If you qualify for the fee waiver, you can apply to up to 4 UC campuses for **free**!

Apply broadly to increase your chances for admission!

7-Course Pattern



- 1. English Composition (ENGL 101, 101+, or 101H)
- 2. English Composition Critical Thinking (ENGL 102, 102H, or 104)
- 3. Mathematical Concepts and Quantitative Reasoning (IGETC Area 2A)
- 4. 4 courses chosen from at least 2 of the following subject areas:
 - Arts and Humanities
 - Social and Behavioral Sciences
 - Physical and Biological Sciences

Business Economics, B.A.

- Method payment (credit card or you can mail a check)
 - Not needed if eligible for the fee waiver

Statement of Legal Residence



The University of California requires all applicants to complete a Statement of Legal Residence (SLR) to be evaluated for a Residency Classification for purposes of UC tuition. For further explanation, read the full UC Residence Policy and Guidelines [2] . As UC policy is subject to change during the year, if there are any discrepancies between any Statement of Legal Residence and the Residence Policy and Guidelines, the Residence Policy and Guidelines govern the rules around Residence for Tuition purposes at all times.

The University of California's Statement of Legal Residence is made up of three parts: Physical presence, Intent to remain in California, and Immigration status.

- 1) Physical Presence You and your parents must be physically present in California for more than 365 days immediately prior to the residence determination date. If you moved to California primarily to attend the University of California or another school, you are ineligible for a Resident classification for tuition purposes.
- 2) Intent to remain in California You and your parents must have established your intent to make California your permanent home for more than 365 days immediately prior to the residence determination date and must have relinquished ties to any prior place of residence outside of California. Please read the UC Residence Policy and Guidelines [2] to learn more about how to document your intent to remain in California.
- 3) Immigration status You and your parents must be citizens or permanent residents of the United States, or be present under a valid I-94 for an eligible visa, and have held that immigration status for more than 365 days prior to the residence determination date.

In some cases, applicants who do not satisfy all three parts above may qualify for a Special Circumstances, Exemption, or Waiver provision (such as an AB 540 nonresident supplemental tuition exemption) and will be asked to submit additional supplemental information at a future date. A full list of exemptions and waivers can be found in the UC Residence Policy and Guidelines [2]

Please note: Even if you were previously classified as a resident in another system, you will still need to meet the University of California's classification requirements.








On the next page, you'll be asked to rank the colleges in order of your preference.



Enrollment Gaps



If you indicated any gap in attendance, you will be prompted to explain why you were not enrolled

If you made an error and did enroll during an identified gap term, you must go back and adjust the dates of attendance and then enter the coursework attempted/completed






The Lowdown

- Transfers must answer one required question and select three others (4 questions total)
- Maximum of 350 words for each response
- All questions have equal value
- All responses are reviewed by an anti-plagiarism software program

The Required Question

- Avoid listing courses taken
- Focus on experiences in/out of class that show interest in the major/field
- Discuss how you have taken initiative to learn more about the major/field and have gained greater knowledge and depth

- Once you submit, you will see a Submission Confirmation screen that shows the complete list of campuses applied to, fees, fee waiver, application ID, date submitted, and payment method
- You will also receive a confirmation email
- Take note of your application ID, as this will be used throughout the admission process, including decision release occurring in the spring
- Do not send official transcripts—if admitted, you will submit the final transcripts at that time

 - Failure to submit these will result in denied admission
- Follow all deadlines for requested documents
