XIII. Special Reports/Governance Committee

1. Environment & Sustainability

Kelin Minasian

- We started off today's meeting by talking about the Bueno Vista building's successful opening and how it will overall benefit stem major students.
- Phase two of the Bueno Vista project is also taking place with the destruction of the Santa Barbara and Arroyo Seco buildings set to begin on Monday, the 11th.
- On the first day of classes, there was a problem with the boiler leaking in the attic of the Bueno Vista building, which caused some damage. Nonetheless, the contractors have already begun to fix it and dry up the affected regions.

- By the end of the spring semester, a class with a capacity of 100 students can use the BV 101 lecture hall.
- One committee member, who also happened to be a chemistry professor, brought up the issue of drainage not existing in the chemistry departments beneath the safety showers. This is because any acidic solutions should be dried in a container and disposed of to hazardous waste rather than entering the drainage system.
- The subject of Earth Day, which falls on April 27, 2024, was the subject of discussion after that.
- Food donations or the assistance in finding a business willing to provide food—that company will, of course, be sponsored—would be greatly appreciated.
- The event also wants to feature a guest speaker; however, the board has determined that they would prefer a student from GCC to speak instead of an outside speaker. This is because students will be able to discuss subjects that are personal to them and will have a higher probability of getting others to interact.
- Due to the close relationship between science and the environment, they also urge science departments to be actively involved in the event, including by having a table and giving a speech.
- A spreadsheet was shared that contained various vendors of either person who will be involved, who will not be, and which are still pending.
- Each board member will be contacting vendors to ask about their participation in the event; additionally, the ASGCC representatives were asked to speak with Andre Manukyan to ask about the possibility of getting sponsors from Metro, as he was the one who was able to secure the bus metro passes for students.
- The subject of the recently installed "composers" trash cans on campus was also brought up. This trash container is only for used food waste.
- Since the Great White Hut is a popular hangout for students after school, the trashcans are now located there; however, more will be added soon.
- The committee was made aware of the trashcans because students were not only throwing food waste into them but also regular trash, which is not how they were intended to be used.
- We were additionally informed that the City of Glendale will no longer permit gas blowers after September 2023, thus they are already testing electrical blowers.
- The final topic of discussion at the meeting was more of a call for action at the training facility since water fountains that produce water from air were built, although they are only currently accessible for two months.
