### 9. Description of the Project:

Glendale Community College (GCC), in collaboration with the International Alliance of Theatrical Stage Employees (IATSE Local 33), proposes the establishment of an **Urban Live Entertainment Technology Training Hub**. This initiative aims to bolster local economic development and workforce readiness in the live entertainment sector. This robust curriculum of the program encompasses foundational and technical components integral to live production such as lighting, sound engineering, stagecraft, rigging, and multimedia production. By aligning with industry-standard training protocols, the program is crafted to transition community members from academic preparation to direct entry into the workforce. This project will transform GCC into the official training site for the industry, serving as a hub for vocational excellence and education in live entertainment.

This project strategically repurposes existing college facilities, The Mod Theater, which will include the clearance of outdated infrastructure, and the renovation and reconstruction of existing facilities. The Mod Theater functions as a multi-configurable space in which students will design, create, and erect stages, trusses, light, technical and sound systems, and all other components needed for live performances. Through the open format of the facilities,

students will receive hands-on learning experiences in which they can participate in all elements of planning, preparing, and running live entertainment events.

The renovation project is meticulously designed to align with the objectives of 42 U.S.C. 5305(a)(4), focusing on the rehabilitation of The Mod Theater into the new training hub. It will entail the following:

- **Upgrades and Modernization**: Implementing significant improvements to The Mod Theater's stagecraft, audiovisual systems, and rigging equipment to reflect the latest industry standards, thereby improving the utility and longevity of the facility.
- Energy-Efficient Systems: Introducing energy-efficient lighting and sound systems, reinforcing GCC's commitment to sustainability and reducing the environmental impact of our operations.
- Enhanced Accessibility: Revamping The Mod Theater to remove existing barriers and ensure full accessibility, enabling an inclusive environment that accommodates all students and community members, including the elderly and individuals with disabilities, in accordance with 5305(a)(5).

GCC's Urban Live Entertainment Technology Training Hub will foster economic growth, urban development, and community enrichment through the renovation of our existing infrastructure.

## 10. Project Justification (Need for the project):

The need for the project is predicated on several critical factors:

- Workforce Development: The entertainment industry is a significant economic driver that requires a skilled workforce adept in the latest technological advancements. The existing facilities at The Mod Theater are no longer aligned with the industry's rapidly evolving technical and production standards. The renovation will ensure that members of the community that are interested in obtaining a job in the field are highly skilled and job-ready, addressing a gap in the qualified technical workforce.
- Community Engagement: The Mod Theater's renovation will also enable a broader range of community-oriented programs and events, fostering greater community engagement and cultural enrichment.
- Sustainability and Efficiency: Existing systems within The Mod Theater fall short of modern sustainability standards. Renovations will significantly reduce the carbon footprint and operational costs of the facility, aligning with broader environmental objectives.

# 11. Justification for why the project is an appropriate use of taxpayer funds and is a public benefit:

The proposed renovations to The Mod Theater and the development of the Urban Live Entertainment Technology Training Hub initiative represent an appropriate use of taxpayer funds for several reasons:

- **Economic Impact**: Investment in this project will stimulate local economic growth by training the workforce for jobs in the high demand filed of entertainment technology, which provide living wage careers through short-term vocational training. This increases the employability of our community, reduces unemployment, and contributes to the economy.
- Long-Term Cost Savings: By incorporating energy-efficient technologies and designs, the project will lead to long-term cost savings in utility and maintenance expenses, ensuring taxpayer funds are leveraged for sustainable financial impact.
- Leveraging Existing Assets: Rather than constructing new facilities, renovating The Mod Theater maximizes the utility of existing public assets, reflecting a cost-effective approach for the project.

The investment in this project yields direct public benefits in education, workforce development, and the economy.

While the Glendale Community College District has a Capital Improvement Plan / Facilities Master Plan, the proposed project is not included in the current version of the Plan, which was last published in 2015 and updated in 2019. This project, however, is in the process of being added to the updated version of the Plan.

While the need for this project has long existed, the recent needs of a trained workforce in the entertainment technology sector, coupled with GCC's newly forged relationship with IATSE Local 33, this project has become a priority for the GCC District, the local workforce, and the community.

# 13. Explanation of how the federal funds will be spent (for example, on equipment, construction, labor, etc.):

If funded, the federal allocation will be spent only on allowable project expenses as outlined by the Department of Housing and Urban Development's Economic Development Initiative guidelines, for expenses that meet the criteria of the Community Development Block Grant outlined in 42 U.S.C. 5305(a)(4) & 5305(a)(5). This will include actual construction costs for the building renovation needed to implement the project, including HVAC (the largest expenditure for the project), interior upgrades/renovation, mechanical, electrical, and

plumbing upgrades/renovation, and upgrades/renovation related to both accessibility and fire & life safety. Costs not eligible under the account will be funded through other eligible sources.

### 2. General description of the project and why it is needed.

The Urban Live Entertainment Technology Training Hub project at Glendale Community College, in collaboration with IATSE Local 33, will upgrade and modernize The Mod Theater to meet the growing demands of the live entertainment industry in Los Angeles. This renovation includes construction costs to renovate an existing building/space, updating stagecraft and audiovisual systems, integrating energy-efficient technologies, and enhancing accessibility to accommodate all users. Positioned to support the expected regional need driven by major upcoming events like the 2026 FIFA World Cup and the 2028 Summer Olympics, the project will transform GCC into a pivotal training site for high-demand technical jobs. This initiative will decrease the local skills gap, offer employment opportunities to traditionally underserved populations, and align with the college's commitment to community development and environmental sustainability. The project is

ready to commence and can be completed within the projected timeline, providing immediate benefits to the community and the industry.

### 3. What are the benefits of this project and why is it a priority?

Despite broader economic fluctuations, there is a growing demand for technically skilled workers in the live entertainment industry. The Urban Live Entertainment Technology Training Hub will meet this demand by providing specialized training in areas like sound engineering and stage lighting, preparing students for immediate employment. The project will transform The Mod Theater at Glendale Community College into a vibrant educational and training center, capitalizing on this momentum to not only enhance local workforce capabilities but also to create a central hub for community engagement and professional development.

  Theater, which is an existing public facility within Glendale Community College. The
  upgrades will directly improve the function and efficiency of the facility, consistent
  with CDBG objectives for the construction and capital improvements of public
  facilities.
- **Economic Development**: By providing vocational training in live entertainment technology, the project supports economic development, which is a central goal of the CDBG program. It aims to create job opportunities and enhance workforce skills in a high-demand sector, thereby promoting community and economic vitality.
- 6. Who are the community partners participating in this project? Have local community development organizations with prior experience with HUD programs been consulted?

The community partners participating in the Urban Live Entertainment Technology Training Hub project include Glendale Community College and the International Alliance of Theatrical Stage Employees (IATSE Local 33).

Glendale Community College has extensive experience with prior Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) programs. This experience has provided the college with a robust understanding of HUD's regulations and requirements, ensuring that the project's design and implementation will be in compliance with federal guidelines and objectives.
