
To our graduates, we hope your educational experience at GCC will help you as you continue onto the next chapter of your life. To our transfer students, we wish you continued success at your chosen university.

As the academic year comes to an end, we'd like to highlight some of our EOPS students and share their inspirational experiences.

Armenuhi Snkhchayan

Armenuhi came to the United States 6 years ago with her husband and newborn baby. She and her family experienced many hardships as they tried to adjust to a new life. She remembers feeling alone, as she had no family or friends to lean on for support and was afraid of what her family's future would look like. Soon, she realized that she is in control of her life and took a courageous step and enrolled in GCC during the pandemic, in fall 2020.

As a parenting student, Armenuhi didn't know how far she would go in college. She recalls that when she first started GCC, she wanted to pursue a certificate, then one of her counselors, who believed in her potential of succeed, encouraged her to continue for an associate degree and transfer to a university.



Armenuhi is an Early Childhood Development major and holds a strong GPA of 3.9. She will be graduating GCC with an AS-T degree in Early Childhood Education and AA in Social Science in spring 2024 and has been accepted to CSUN for the fall 2024 semester. Her passion is to work with children and help them as they grow and develop.

Alongside being a full-time student, she works on campus as a peer mentor for the CalWORKs program. As a student worker she has gained many valuable experiences in which she trusts will open a lot of employment opportunities for the future. Armenuhi shared that her husband is also a parenting student at GCC . She believes that the most incredible part of this journey is that their son will witness both parents walking on stage together during the graduation ceremony. She is now certain, more than ever, that her family's future is going to be brighter due to investing in her education and transferring to a university.

Armenuhi's said, "it's never to late to get an education. A lot of students who are parents or who many think they are not young enough to begin college should know that it's never to late. Education is a lifelong process, and you can begin anytime." She shares that programs like CalWORKs and EOPS are here to support students to help them reach their goals.
